## Editorial

Undoubtedly, we are lucky to have a Village Hall, under valued and under used though it may be. In other days, before people took to sitting in isolation in front of the television, it played a greater part in village life and was the scene of much revelry and jollification. There were dances for people of all ages - not just discos for the very young - and regular productions by a thriving and energetic theatre group. Interest in the hall, and enthusiasm to run and caretake it has diminished until now the responsibility is shouldered by one or two volunteers. If we didn't have a hall it would be missed and no doubt someone would expend much energy campaigning to get a new hall built. Why not turn our attention to the hall we have and use it to improve the quality of our leisure time? Why don't visiting choirs sing in the hall with its good acoustics but invariably sing in the chapel where religious inclinations probably mean that they sing to smaller audiences than they might otherwise attract? This year necessary repairs and renovations are to be carried out under the auspices of the Youth Opportunities Programme, so the activities of our own Players will be curtailed, but the hall is to be redecorated inside and out and the floor is to be sanded and polished. When it is brightly refurbished, though, will Port Isaacans remember that the hall belongs to us all and is there to be used. It is hoped to have a boxing club for the boys, and a new badminton club is being formed. We also have to be careful that we are not entangled by bureaucratic red tape in connection with the stringent new legislation that means that more careful attention has to be paid to safety regulations at halls.

So come along with your ideas on how your village hall should be run.

## Parish Elections

Anyone over 21 who is a British subject or citizen of Ireland and who is on the electoral roll for the parish, or has owned or tenanted land here, or worked here, or lived here or within three miles, for the whole of the preceding twelve months is qualified to stand for election to the Parish Council. The date of the poll is Thursday May 5th.

This is the chance for any one in the parish to take a place in the organisation of their own locality.

Don't leave it to others, play a part yourself in the day to day running of your parish. One meeting a month is all it involves.

### NOMINATION PAPERS

Nomination papers are available from the Clerk to St. Endellion Parish Council, Mrs. C.M. Powell, West Winds, Port Gaverne, Port Isaac. PL29 3SH.

These have to be filled in, then have to be signed by a Proposer and a Seconder, and a third person has to witness your signature.

The papers have to be sent to the Returning Officer, Mr. I. Whiting, Priory House, Bodmin. PL31 2AD. They must arrive before noon on Saturday April 9th.

If you are interested in standing for election it is as well to find yourself a Proposer and Seconder as soon as you can, no nomination which is received too late can be accepted.

A certain amount of expenditure by Candidates can be claimed for reimbursement.

Councillors come into office four days after polling day.

The list of Candidates will be published not later than noon on Tuesday April 12th.



## Parish Council

The following items were discussed at the monthly meeting on 14th. March.

### Reduction of Parish Rate.

Because of a surplus of £2178 in the District Council's books for St. Endellion, the Parish Council have been told to reduce the 2p. Parish Rate to 1.7p. This will result in £4000 being available for spending in the year 1983-84. Much of this will be used up by materials for the wall around the cliff apparently.

### Annual Public Meeting.

Representatives of the Planning Department and of the District Council will attend the meeting on 12th. April. Cllr. Harvey Lander will also address the meeting. Inspector Hawkey and Constable LeBailly will speak on behalf of the police.

### School Bus to St. Austell.

The Council are to contact County Hall to explain that the number of scholars from Port Isaac is increasing and that they have to pick up the bus at St. Minver at 7.30am. It is hoped that it may be possible for the bus to include Port Isaac by changing its route slightly.

### Golden Lion Wall.

Work will be done by the brewery to support the wall which has been undermined by the sea. It was asked if pressure could be put on them to re-roof the linney by the pub at the same time as this was an eyesore at present.

### Sea Protection Wall.

This is nearly completed but a suggestion for an area with seats, etc., on top would be impracticable on grounds of cost. The wall is to be topped with rubble and top-soil forming a 45° slope and will be grassed over.

### Appalling State of Village.

There is rubbish and discarded building material all over the place. A letter is to be circulated asking people to try and keep the place a bit tidier.

### Wadebridge School Sports Complex

Mr. Bolton is to attend a preliminary meeting on Thursday 24th. March to discuss this. The Council is in favour of the scheme which would provide things like squash courts and a big sports hall possibly, for use by the local people when not in use by the school.

### Port Caverne.

The National Trust will not allow another seat in their enclosure, but are sending a representative to look at the erosion to the wall below the car park.

### Repairs to Pumps.

The pump at Trelights will be boxed in and a slate memorial tablet will be placed there later. Meanwhile the two renovated pumps in Port Isaac are failing to provide any water! This is being investigated.

## Secondhand Books

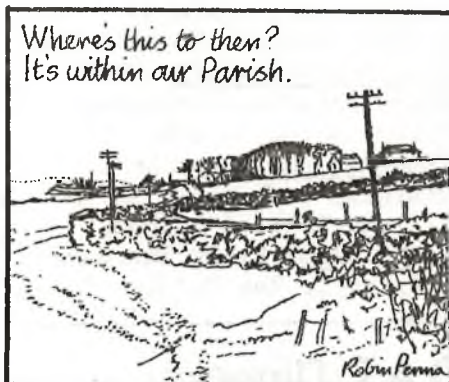

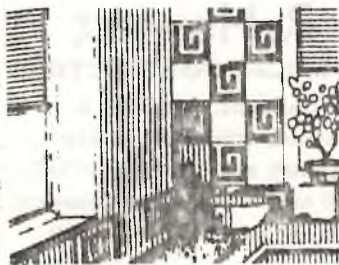
