Footpath Inquiry

The Countryside Commission want to create a Public Right of Way around the cliffs between Pinehaven and Port Quin. This 2 or 3 mile stretch is virtually the last non-coastal section of the 200 mile path around the Cornish peninsular.

The owners of the land say that there already is a well-maintained link across Roscarrock Farm which means that the long-distance path is not actually broken. A path on the cliff edge would seriously disrupt stock farming as dogs could pose a danger. The County Council feel that there is no clear need for the path and would not

warrant the expenditure of public money in construction of the path, providing fencing, and compensation for loss of farmland.

These points were all made at the Public Inquiry in Port Isaac and are contained in a report to be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment who will now make the final decision on whether the path will be created or not.

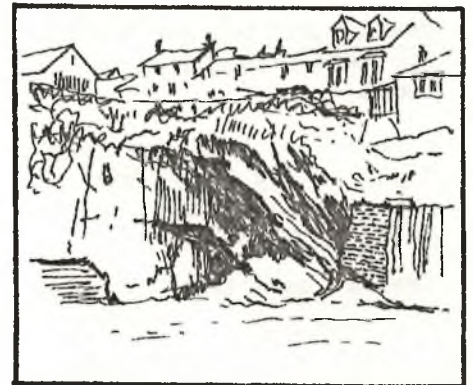

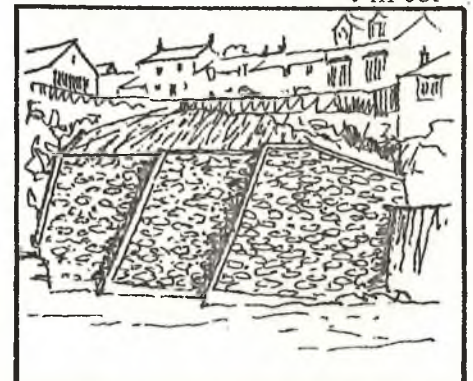
Coast Wall

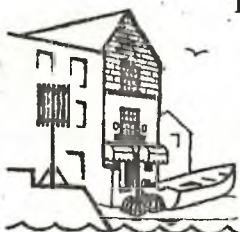
