What is the meaning of the 'Festive Season' for the various different members of the community?

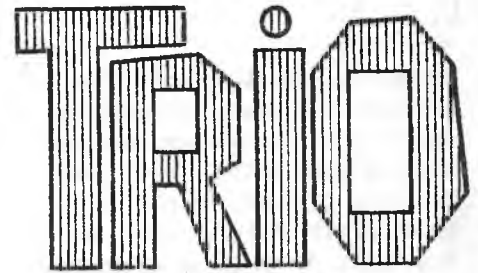

At the well attended Public Meeting on the 9th. November, an interim committee was elected to serve until the next A.G.M. - Mr.V.Hingley, Mr.F.Thompson, Mrs.B.Coates, Mr.L.Bennett, Mr.R.Berman, Mrs.S.Brown, Mr.J.Coshall, Mr.D.Coy, Mr.B.Grimsey, and Cllr.W.Dawe representing the Parish Council.

In his address, Cllr. Dawe pointed out that the Hall is registered charity for the benefit of the village.

The decorations are not yet finished and another £500 is needed for this.

No village hall can be funded by lettings alone, and money raising activities are necessary to find at least

£600 p.a. to cover costs.

The new committee would like to thank Mr.John Sweet for allowing the use of scaffolding and extension ladder for 8-10 weeks at no charge, and to the local C.B. radio club for their generous gift of £100 to Village Hall funds. Thanks also to Mrs.S.Brown for standing in as secretary for the past few months.

PARISH COUNCIL

A report of the meeting held Monday 14th. November.

Tennis Club

Grants for a tennis court are not available unless a club is in existence. Ann Philp and Ray Berman are interested in forming one and anyone who would like to help with the organisation should contact them. When a properly constituted club has been formed application for money will be made to the South West Sports Association. Members of the Parish Council Playing Field Committee will represent the Council.

Street Lights

SWEB to be asked to put a light on existing pole at the end of Hartland Road.

A site meeting to be held at Trelights to try and discover best solution to problem near The Old Post Office.

SWEB and/or County Council to be asked again why light on steps between Mayfield Road and Silvershell View is not yet operating.

Pumps

The reason for the lack of water at the refurbished pumps in Port Isaac is disturbance of water levels by the new sewage system. The Council agreed to pay a discounted bill from MGC, the contractors.

Trelights pump has still to be boxed in.

Parking Opposite Back Hill

Following complaints from Western Food Distributors Ltd. (Spar), police cones have been placed in the road to prevent parking where the large lorries need to reverse and turn. These are

only effective for six days at a time, said Constable Le Bailly who was present, but he would ask the 'friendly milkman' [Special Constable, Eddy Flanagan] to supervise.

It was reported that a fire appliance had had difficulty in reaching a fire in a house on Roscarrock Hill that morning due to the road works in Fore Street.

Public Transport Plan

Mr. Cunningham will discuss the County Plan with Mark Prout, Trelawney Garage.

Mr. Symons asked about the bus for St. Austell College and was informed that this scheme had not been put into operation as there were only two pupils going there.

Ban on Coaches

In reply to a suggestion that coaches should be banned from using the road through Port Gaverne to China Downs, it was pointed out that such a ban would mean they would not come to Port Isaac at all.

Plans

The Council were in favour of plans for change of use of existing chalet at The Bay Hotel, Port Isaac, to a hair-dressing salon. 'This would be an amenity to the village.'

Mr. Bolton asked why a door had been added to an exterior wall of The Old School, Port Isaac, where no changes to the appearance of the building were supposed to happen. This was to be checked with Mr. Philp, N.C.D.C.

Mr. Provis asked for something to be done about the unsightly concrete blocks flanking a manhole site in Trewetha Lane.

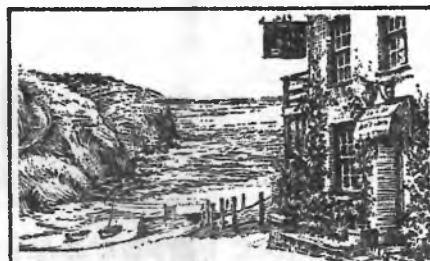
