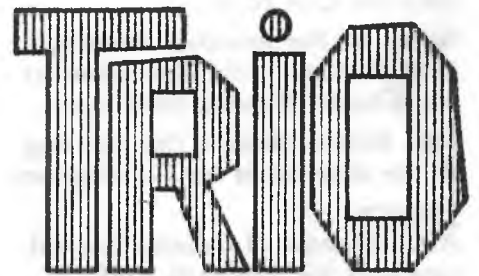

PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the monthly meeting held Monday 11th. November at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

Mrs. Barron chaired the meeting in the absence of Mr. Cunningham.

Finance

After receipt of County Council payment for footpath work, a balance of £206.73 left in the current account which, with about £600 on deposit and £500 still available for precept, leaves a balance of over £1000.

An account for removing paint from the council house steps in Trewetha Lane was approved. Mr. Symons proposed that the contractor, Mr. Sweet, be thanked for not including the cost of his labour.

Trelights Pump

Mr. Hall is no longer to do the work which will be done now by Mr. Strout of St. Endellion. It was pointed out that the parish council will be responsible for maintenance. Mr. Norris reported that the pump is seized up and loose on its mounting. Dr. Barron said that it is a feature of the village. It was hoped that it would be repaired before the wooden housing was installed.

Church Hill

After inspecting the 'ditch' it was felt that no action would be necessary.

Tennis Court

The committee are disappointed in the response to their recent draw. Mrs. Cann pointed out that the court was originally asked for by the youth club, and some youngsters had already bought themselves rackets. She

pointed out that it was for use by the young as well as older people, and joint use by the school as well. It is certainly not just for the 'Gin and tonic set' as some people say.

C.A.Lee Memorial Seat

The council are pleased by an offer to buy a seat in memory of the applicant's father. It is expected to cost £85 - £100. In a letter of thanks, a suitable site will be asked for.

Rural Trust - Housing

Patricia Richmond, National Agricultural Centre Rural Trust, to be asked to address the Parish Meeting about a scheme for investing charity funds in areas of housing shortage.

Heritage Coast

Mr. David will come to the next monthly meeting to talk about the project and also show slides.

Community Bus

It is hoped that Mr. Oliver Baines of Cornwall Rural Community Council will be able to hold a public meeting on Thursday 5th. December in Port Isaac.

Rose Hill

Letters expressing concern over the possible resiting of the bollard further up the hill. Mr. Dodgeon, Divisional Superintendent, Cornwall Highways, has no proposals to do this, however, but the situation is still under review and an improvement of the conditions is hoped for.

Planning Powers

A letter from Mr. W. Godfrey was read out. He is concerned about a resolution to only send parish councils a list of planning applications with location maps and no other details. 'Local opinion being no longer considered of importance.' It was proposed to send a letter of protest to the chairman of N.C.D.C.

Seat - Church Hill

A petition with many signatures was received from Mr. Pooley. This will be sent to the County Highways Department who have the responsibility in this matter.

Village Hall

The work for which the parish council granted £250 has cost £454.25 + £59.25 VAT. The hall will therefore probably have to ask for more. The ramp for disabled people will not be built as this would be too costly, said Mr. Welton.

Conservation Area

Mrs. Willmott, Clerk to the Council, said that a report had been drawn up pointing out the lack of car parks and trees in the village. A number of windows had also been replaced by plate glass against recommendations.

Public Discussion

Mrs. Coates said Cllrs. Dawe and Scawin both requested that the Rose Hill bollard should be moved further up, at a recent N.C.D.C. planning meeting. It was felt that this would make things very difficult for people with cars, coal lorries, etc. The parish council replied that it would prefer the bollard to stay where it is and a letter to this effect to be sent to Highways and N.C.D.C. It was felt that the views of the parish were often not represented by the district councillors.

Mrs. Wherry said that somebody had been out to see if anything could be done about the coal bunkers at Trewetha Lane.
