Notes of the monthly meeting at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 13th. January 1986.

The Pump, Trelights

Since the total cost for work on the base and the wooden casing would be likely to cost more than £200, the Council are to offer help with the payment.

Cornwall Youth Association

A £10 donation to be made as in previous years.

Seat at Church Hill

After the meeting between Mr. Pooley and Mr. Wherry of Cornwall Highways, a bench seat is to be mounted on the wall. Mr. Sweet is to be asked to quote for the work which will be paid for by the Parish.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

It is proposed to hold an open meeting in the Church Rooms at 7.30pm. on Thursday 6th. February. Posters will be put up giving details.

Notice Board, Trelights

The Council agreed to a new board being erected next to the Post Office Store and to the slight re-siting of the Council notice board. A key for the latter in Mr. Barriball's keeping will allow the glass to be cleared when it mists up.

Litter Bins, Port Gaverne

The National Trust to be asked to provide more suitable bins to replace large District Council ones removed last year.

Mr. Provis asked for bins at the Platt to be discussed at the next meeting.

Emergency Committee

Posters will be put up asking for volunteers.

Article IV Direction Order

This has been declined by the Department of the Environment (Bristol), and is no longer in

effect. The District Council meeting was being held at the same time as the Parish one and Cllr. Dawe explained in writing that he, together with Cllrs. Scawin and Lander, were putting the case at the meeting. The Parish Council is to write to the Dept. of the Environment, appealing against the decision. They now want to hear from the general public to find out what support there is.

Community Bus

A meeting of interested parties has been held and a committee is to be formed to make the necessary applications, etc.

Plans

The following plans were looked at but 'no observations' were made in each case.

Mr. Knight - 2 Cottages at Port Gaverne.

Mr. Andrews. Bay Hotel - to improve the access.

Mr. Rowe, Middle Street - extension at rear. Mr. Provis pointed out that the application had already been passed and the Council are to write to the Planning Department for an explanation of why plans had been passed before they had even seen them.

Stonework is to be added to the bungalows at Trelights as asked for by the Parish Council.

Public Discussion

A question was asked about the condition of the cliff footpath and fence adjacent to the car park. The Parish Council is to find out whether anything is going to be done about it by the District Council.

LETTER

Dear Sir, in Trio no. 40, October 1985, you invited comments explaining the meaning of the ecclesiastical term 'prebendary'. Trio comes to me (my mother's copy) with a slight delay, and is always welcome. I congratulate you on the service you do the community. The lateness probably means that you have the 'prebendary' question sewn up. However I was induced to look it up by your question, and am grateful to have learned something, if nothing else! The title 'prebendary' is now only an honorary one in the church. It has its roots in the latin 'prebendor' which means a 'portion' or a 'pittance'. From this the noun 'prebend' was derived to define a share of the revenue generated by a cathedral, which was paid out as a stipend or salary to the individual members of its chapter. The recipient of the share of revenue was then the 'prebendary'.

I would assume that the early rectors of St. Endellion were perhaps chapter members of Truro [Exeter? Ed.] cathedral, and entitled to share in its general largesse. There is no doubt a lively history back there somewhere. If you haven't had any responses yet, I hope this goes some way towards answering your question. In the meantime, best wishes for 1986.
