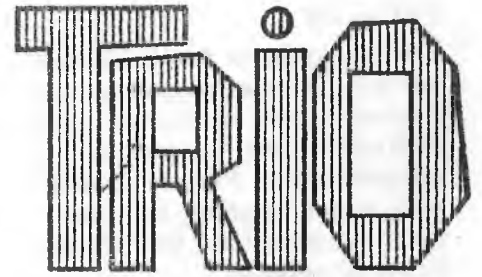

PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the monthly meeting at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 10th. February 1986.

Seat Church Hill

An estimate for £45 including fixing was accepted.

Trelights Pump

Mrs. Holden will be grateful for help from the Parish Council to pay for the repair work. It was proposed that this should be done. £9.70 from a 1972 Trelights Chapel Coffee Morning was handed to the Council towards the pump expenditure.

Annual Parish Meeting

This will be held on Thursday 17th. April, at 7.30pm. in the Church Hall. Guest speakers are to be invited. There will be tea, coffee, and biscuits afterwards to allow for general discussion.

Port Isaac - Conservation

A suggestion for a special body to watch conservation matters, if the Article IV appeal is not successful, was met with mixed feelings, but will be held in abeyance for the time being.

The Green - Trelights

In response to concern at erosion of the green (by 'Laburnums') due to car parking, etc., the Council will have a look at the site before the next meeting.

Footpath - Port Gaverne Valley

Councillors expressed the view that they would like the Port Gaverne Valley footpath to be in use and a letter saying that they are 'disturbed' by the recent closure of the path via Pendoggett Farm yard will be sent to St. Kew Parish Council.

St. Endellion Churchyard

The cemetery will be full in 20 years and St. Endellion P.C.C. have notified the Parish Council that they will be responsible for finding a new site. It was felt that this would be handled by the District Council but some Councillors were prepared to have a meeting with St. Endellion after they had taken advice.

Community Bus

The Cornwall Rural Community Council report that 50% of the money will come from Education and 50% from London. There is quite a good case for the bus.

Alternative Rates Systems

The Parish Council will discuss this at the 'planning' meeting to be held two weeks later.

Pot Holes - Cliff Path

An application is being made to the Countryside Commission for £1500 to tarmac the path past the car park. A donation will be sought from the Parish Council as well in a few months time.

Rubbish - Cartway Cove

Mr. David, our Heritage Coast Officer, is very concerned about the mass of rubbish that has been tipped down the cliffs at Cartway. He is going to try and get this cleared up and invite the press to attend afterwards. This was thought to be an excellent idea and suggestions were put forward to use the Fire Brigade or Coastguard cooperation to help with the work.

Toilets - Port Gaverne

The District Council is formulating its budget and the Parish Council are still very keen to go ahead with the scheme.

Planning

No applications were received.

Public Discussion

Mrs. Brown spoke of the danger to people sitting on the seat opposite Villa Park Lodge at Trelights from very big lorries turning the corner. This will be discussed at the next meeting after Councillors have had look at the situation.

RECIPE

Casserole Steaks for 4 persons.

4 x 6oz slices of top rump or
topside.
1 cup of chicken broth.
1 small shallot or onion, finely
chopped.
2 teaspoons tomato puree.
2 teaspoons paprika.
1/4 lb finely chopped mushrooms.

Pound the steaks, season them with salt and pepper, and sprinkle flour on both sides. Fry very lightly in hot butter so they remain red inside. Transfer to a flameproof casserole. In the butter left in the frying pan, brown the chopped shallots then add the rest of the ingredients and cook for a few minutes. Pour the mixture onto the steaks in the casserole and cover. Simmer over a low heat, shaking occasionally, until the meat is quite tender. Don't raise the lid too often. When done, add hot quartered boiled potatoes.

Shred green cabbage finely, place in a saucepan which holds about 1/2 cup boiling, slightly salted, water. Cook no longer than 4 minutes, stirring constantly with a fork, drain, add a knob of butter and some grated nutmeg (also caraway seeds if you like). Return to the heat and cook, stirring again, for another minute or two.

DO YOU ENJOY SINGING?

It suddenly struck me recently that many people now living in the area may not be aware of the existence of the Port Isaac Singers.

We are a ladies choir, 30 in number, and formed 16 years ago ('Nothing ever lasts in Port Isaac' they told me at the time!). In that time we have won prizes at every competitive music festival in Cornwall and travelled and won at Cheltenham, Blackpool, Paignton, and Plymouth. Often this has been against formidable opposition. Two years ago we took part in the first round of the 'Choir of the Year' competition - only 32 choirs of all types from all over the British Isles got that

far. We have given many concerts in chapels and churches as well as in Truro Cathedral (two weeks ago). We have sung at the Theatre Royal in Plymouth and helped to raise a great deal of money for charities over the year. We have sung on radio (a half-hour programme), television ('Opportunity Knocks') and made an excellent cassette of our songs - still selling well. Last summer we went to Brittany for ten days and hope for some more opportunities to sing abroad in the future. We rehearse Thursday evenings at 8pm. at Port Isaac School. We could do with 2 or 3 more sopranos - 1st. and 2nd. - so if you are keen, you are most

welcome to join us. Ability to sing in tune and enthusiasm are the chief requirements.

At Wadebridge School, there are the newly-formed Choral Society at 7.15 on Tuesdays, regularly attracting over 50 singers from 17 - 70, and the Male Voice Choir, conductor John Beck, at 7.15 on Wednesdays.

So if you enjoy singing there are many opportunities to follow a stimulating, satisfying, and sociable pastime. Come along and try it out!
