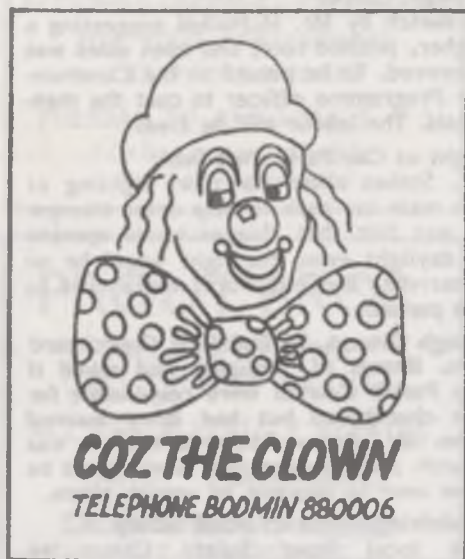

PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken during the monthly meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 14th. September.

An apology was received from Mr. Dawe.

Tree Grants

A helpful letter from Probus advising about sources of money and even how to get free trees. To be followed up.

Coastal Footpath

A recommendation has been made by Cllr. Symons for a tarmac surface on the steep, rough slope at 'Overcliff'.

Rubbish on Beaches

A draft letter was read and approved. It is to be sent to County Council, District Council, and Prince Charles.

Street Light, Mayfield Close

The Chairman and Vice-chairman had been to the site and decided that no extra light is necessary providing all the other lights are working.

Free Parking for Coaches

This will be considered by the District Council when parking fees are reviewed.

Seat - Trewetha Lane / Rose Hill

Photocopy of deeds of property shown to Council. Possible decision to remove seat to be discussed next month.

Footpath Port Gaverne to Pendoggett

Information has come from Mr. Pooley of Church Hill that a corpse was once carried along the path which means that it was a right of way. This should be in St. Kew Parish Council minutes.

Finance

There is £1,323.44 on deposit but, after paying clerk's salary and expenses, expenses of Port Gaverne toilets, and last footpath payment, there is insufficient in current account so £500 precepted.

Cllr. Symons asked for path from Port Gaverne valley to Coldstanton to be cut next year.

Toilets at Port Gaverne

The lease was approved and duly signed. Insurance cover is provided by the National Trust so Parish Council policy to be cancelled. A complaint that the loose chipping path is difficult for wheel chairs to be passed on to the National Trust who are responsible.

Minepit Corner

A sketch by Mr. McNichol suggesting a higher, pitched roof, and open sides was approved. To be passed to the Community Programme officer to cost the materials. The labour will be free.

Light at Car Park, Port Isaac

Mr. Stokes asked for more lighting at the main car park to help deter thieves. It was felt that thieves would operate in daylight even, the light would be no deterrent, and not worth extra cost to the parish.

Rough Ground, St. Endellion Churchyard
Mrs. Brown of Trelights had asked if the Parish Council were responsible for the churchyard but had since learned from Mr. Roger Richards that it was church property and that work would be done soon to improve an uneven place.

Wadebridge District Road Safety

The local Road Safety Committee wants to liaise with the Council and a

representative will go to the December meeting. It was mentioned that Port Isaac School had come top in the competition two years running.

Telephone Kiosk, Fore Street

British Telecom to be asked to provide an additional kiosk by the post office, there are only three in the village and the Church Hill one gets over-used in the summer. The old type of kiosk is to be preferred as it is in a Conservation Area and this is to be mentioned.

Path to Track from Port Isaac Millpool

Mr. Welton reported that the path had not been cut back and there were stones from the hedge lying on it but that it is walkable. Extra notice to be taken when paths trimmed next year.

N.C.D.C. Award Scheme

Three schemes were recommended: the Port Gaverne toilets, Trelights Village Green, and the garden at the old chapel site in Port Isaac, although it was felt that this will stand a better chance of an award when it is finished.

Fence, Port Quin Coastal Path

A letter to be sent to County Council about the potential danger to walkers of barbed wire on the top rail.

Civil Defence Committee

Mr. Bolton was handed forms to be filled in giving details of local people able to serve in case of emergency.

P.I.D.T.A. Representative

Cllr. Symons said that the Tourism Association was necessary as Port Isaac has suffered over the last few years from a lack of visitors and an effort has to be made to try and raise standards and to promote our area. He was asked to serve as the Parish Council representative on the Tourism Association committee to replace Mr. Stokes who had resigned.

Coastal Footpath, Port Isaac

A letter from Mrs. Ferguson was read out, asking for assurances that the cliff path would not suffer from heavy traffic during the building of the three new houses. Cllr. Symons said that a contractor was responsible for reinstating a path that they had damaged. Mr. Hoskins was invited to speak and he said that he had envisaged exactly the situation that had now arisen and asked the Parish Council to once again write to the County Council to ascertain the exact legal position. The path would have to be made up before heavy vehicles were allowed to use it otherwise subsidence could occur. This cost should be borne by the developers not by the ratepayers who might easily find

themselves paying for the maintenance later on anyway. The council decided to ask the Association of Town and Parish Councils for advice.

Heritage Coast Newspaper

Details were received of a newspaper to be produced by the Heritage Coast Service next year, giving information about the area and its attractions.

Planning Applications

Mr. and Mrs. T. Harris, revision of access, Watergates, Trelights. The Council made no observations.

8 Silvershell View, Summer House. The Council made no observations.

Erection of Bungalow and Garage, Plot 11, Marshall's Way, Trelights. Objections were raised to the appearance of the house, in particular the roof windows. It would adjoin Trelights old farmhouse and was out of keeping.

Open Discussion

Mr. Bolton asked for the possibility of a weekly street sweeper during the winter to be discussed at the next meeting.

Mrs. Hambly asked if a handrail could be put alongside the steep part of the cliff path. Mr. Hoskins said he thought that on this 1 in 4 slope steps would be better than tarmac which could become dangerous if it got slippery.

Cllr. Symons reported that a lady had fallen and broken her leg on that part of the path which was Parish Council property. Mr. Norris pointed out that the entrance to the new building site would also be on this path, and that the old Cornish hedge would partly have to be knocked down. Mrs. Cann asked all councillors to walk the path which would be discussed fully next month.

The public were then asked to leave as tenders were to be considered.

Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held in Trelights Chapel Hall, Monday 12th. October, 7.30pm.

The person was recovered and brought to Port Isaac, where Dr. James Lunny, Station Medical Officer, examined him and found him to be dead. The crew members, who faced W.N.Westerly winds Force 6 to 7 in heavy swell and with squalls, were Neville Andrews, Andrew Walton, and David Sumner.
