Training with Sea King Helicopters

On Sunday 13th. March, crew members from Port Isaac lifeboat visited R.N.A.S. Cudrose where they received training on Sea King helicopter rescue procedures. The day included talks by R.N.A.S. and H.M. Coastguard specialists, and ended with a practical exercise in a helicopter in which each course member was winched to the ground.

From April 1st., Sea Kings will be used on Search and Rescue operations by R.N.A.S. Cudrose, replacing the Wessex helicopters presently in use.

Port Isaac lifeboat crew train frequently with the services concerned in joint rescue operations, and helicopters are often involved. Typical of such incidents is where the casualty is at the foot of a cliff and cannot be reached from above. In such a case the crew of the small, manoeuvrable 'D' Class lifeboat can go in and bring the casualty sufficiently seaward of the cliffs for safe transfer direct to the helicopter.

A visit was also made to the Air Ambulance at Treliske for detailed information on equipment and the method of transfer of casualties which in this case must be made ashore.

PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken during the monthly meeting held at the Chapel Rooms, Trelights, on Monday 14th. February.

Finance

It was decided to transfer £500 from deposit to cover expenses. The annual donation towards the upkeep of St. Endellion churchyard was increased from £350 to £375. The financial position of the Village Hall was also announced.

Parking in Fore Street

After receiving further complaints about parked cars obstructing the street, the Parish Council is to seek a meeting with County Highways and the Police to gain advice on the problem. The 'keep clear' box at the bottom of Back Hill is working with the exception of one white car which parks on it. There are also problems at the Platt and the bottom of Church Hill. Firms trying to make deliveries have been trying to use Church Hill as an alternative to Fore Street unaware that they can neither get through at the bottom nor are they able to reverse!

Parking in Mayfield Road

Complaints were received about cars blocking the 'spur' of Mayfield Road so that residents are unable to get in or out. The North Cornwall District Council will be asked if the grass areas can be tarmaced to provide off-the-road parking spaces.

Street Lighting

An extra light is to be provided near Long Cross at no cost to the parish. Three 'pink' lights are to be provided in Roscarrock Hill but the top one, which is on private land, will cost the parish £20. Many of the existing lights are not working properly (the light at the junction of New Road and Trewetha Lane has been out for over three months). Cllr. Symons hoped that the County Council would make sure the system was in order before taking over the responsibility from S.W.E.B. A complaint was received from the owner of Wesley House (Middle Street) about the large and inappropriate light there.

Annual Parish Meeting

As all local government officers who were invited to speak at the meeting have declined the invitation, Cllr. Symons will attempt to arrange for a representative of the District Council to be present to answer questions.

Rubbish on Beaches

Mr. Bolton asked if the state of the beaches could be discussed. Cllr. Symons replied that he had visited the beaches at the time when a great number of margarine tubs had been

washed ashore and that they had now been cleared away by council workmen.

Road at Port Gaverne

The section between Treore turning and China Downs was not high on the list for re-surfacing but precautions would be taken if it became unsafe.

Trees

Rowan and pine trees are now available and they are to be planted around the playing fields. It is hoped the work can be done by the Community Youth Service perhaps through the Heritage Coast Service.

Council for Protection of Rural England

It was decided to apply for affiliation to the C.P.R.E. at a fee of £7.00 p.a.

Planning Application

Mr. Carwithen of the Old Post Office, Trelights, permission to lop chestnut tree opposite. Mr. Barriball said that it would be a job well done. There were no other observations.

Public Discussion

Mr. Stokes said it was sometimes necessary for councillors to raise matters which arrived too late to include on the agenda, at this part of the meeting. The Chairman replied that these items should be handed to the Clerk for presentation during 'Clerk's Correspondence'. However, no action could be taken on any item not already on the agenda. Sometimes, where it helped to clarify a situation, a member of the public might be asked to speak, and any request to speak by a member of the public should be made by means of a note. The 'Public Discussion' was not a legal requirement but held at the end of the meetings to hear what views the public might have.

Mrs. Haygreen reported that the misleading 'Furze Park' sign in front of her house and which she had reported in October 1986, was still there and that nothing had been done about it.

Miss Hambly asked about 'slow' signs for the corner at Trewetha but was told that now the road had been improved, it would not be possible to put up such signs as before. A reflector post was to be authorised by County Highways.

Mr. Penna reported that a new metal footpath sign 'Pendoggett 2½ miles' had been put up at Port Gaverne. He asked whether this should be removed because there is at present no path to Pendoggett and it could create difficulties for visitors who might try to get through.

Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 11th. April, at 7.30pm. in the Church Rooms at Port Isaac.

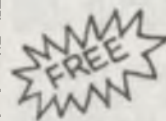

PORT ISAAC AND DISTRICT TOURISM ASSOCIATION

Annual General Meeting

The Church Rooms were filled for the meeting by a lively audience showing that there is a lot of interest.

The Chairman's Report detailed the work done by the Association in the past year - attending meetings of the various publicity committees and councils - the colour brochure, which is being widely distributed - Port Isaac featured in three issues of the North Cornwall Advertiser - the Heritage Coast Interpretation Centre at the Old School - a list of all Bed & Breakfast, Guest House, and Hotel accommodation known to the Association - promotion of accommodation in Port Isaac during the Royal Cornwall Show - group membership of the West Country Tourist Board - liaison with Parish and North Cornwall District Councils on car parking, notice boards, etc. and the 1989 N.C.D.C. 'Betjeman Country' promotion was introduced. It was suggested that the annual subscription might be raised to £12 to have funds available for use as needed in promoting the district, which the Association will look for every opportunity to do. We were told that eight travel agents from France will be in Port Isaac in April, and that it is understood that BBC TV will film a documentary here later in the year. The Hon. Treasurer presented a clear

and encouraging financial report which shows that the Association is in good standing, financially, and has made good use of the funds available.

The subject of the annual subscription was then raised for general discussion. The first proposal was for the level to be raised to £25 per annum, but the final resolution, after much debate, was for a £20 annual subscription with a lower rate of £10 for bed and breakfasts with less than six beds (i.e. no fire licence). This proposal was seconded and carried unopposed.

The new committee was then elected: Chris Harris (Headlands Hotel), Sheila Jarvis (private), Robin Penna (Blackthorn Press), Fred Ross (Port Gaverne Hotel), Cllr. Henry Symons (Trevathan), Fred Thompson (private), Roger Warrilow (Long Cross Hotel), and Mike Wenden (Hattie's Coffee Shop).

Tim Dingle, Assistant Heritage Coast Officer, told us about the newspaper 'Coast Lines' which will be freely available throughout the North Cornwall Heritage Coast Region. 'We can't help holiday makers find the region,' he said 'but we can help them to enjoy themselves when they get here.'

Questions were then invited 'from the floor' and points were raised about the liaison between Port Isaac and Wadebridge information centre - the inevitable problem of refuse collection and litter in the streets - the number of replies people had received from advertisements in the 'North Cornwall Guide'.

Cllr. Symons, vice chairman, thanked everyone for coming along, and also the members of the 1987-88 committee who had put in a lot of hard work.

FOOTBALL NEWS

Port Isaac Football Club will be hosts to two teams staying in the village over the Easter period. They are coming from Birmingham and London to play matches on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday of Easter weekend. The matches will be played on a Round Robin basis and the winners will receive a cup. Come and give Port Isaac a shout! Secretary Brian Richards is also in touch with St. Mary's in the Isles of Scilly where Port Isaac is going in May for a Friendly. The two secretaries have yet to agree the exact date as Port Isaac could be involved in promotion matches.

When the extension is finished, the old kitchen and dressing room may have a storage loft above them extending the full width of the building.

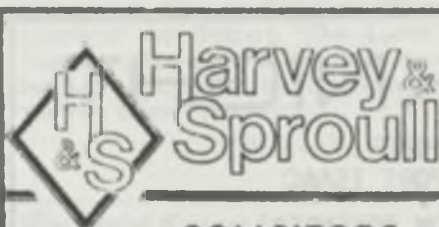
The problems with draughts will also be cured and the front doors replaced.
