## PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public during the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 12th. September.

Chairman, Mrs. Cann, welcomed new parish councillor, Mr. David Phelps.

### Minepit Corner

Mr. Dawe reported that the site has been tidied up but that it now needs some weedkiller.

### Finance

£346.30 is left in the current account after paying the expenses for the month. These include the water rates for Port Gaverne toilets. The yearly cost of the toilets is to be given at the next meeting.

£872 is left in the parish council's deposit account.

£369.12 has to be paid for one of the recent by-elections.

A donation of £25 is to be made to the British Legion Fund as usual.

The Annual Audit shows the accounts to be in order.

### Car Parking

It was felt that a new or larger car park is needed for all the visitors. The recent 'Lifeboat Larks' could have made twice as much for Lifeboat funds if there had only been somewhere for the extra people to park. There used to be a field at Silvershell which used to serve as a supplementary car park before the houses were built. Park-and-ride schemes were not thought to be successful. Mr. Phelps asked whether extra car parking was justified for five weeks of the year - the only time it would be busy. The Parish Council finally decided, however, that nothing can be done.

### Footpath Management

It was agreed that the proposals for footpath management to be handled more directly at local level should be accepted, after examination of a document from the County Council.

### Gatepost at Playing Field

One of the old posts will have to be replaced to take the new gate.

### Footpath - Port Gaverne Valley

Owners of the land over which the path runs, members of the public and the parish council and County Footpath Officer, Mrs. Doney, have walked the path after receiving complaints about its waterlogged state. A further meeting is to be held to discuss how to solve the problems.

### Air Ambulance

Alternative landing sites were considered for the ambulance as the locked gates at the playing field car parking area prevent rendezvous vehicles bringing patients right up to the helicopter. No other site is as convenient, however, so a key will be kept at the surgery.

### Street Repairs

One or two of the streets in the area are in need of repair and County Highways are to be asked to have a look at all streets.

### Cars Parking on Pavements

In some places pedestrians have to walk in the road because of parked cars. The police are being asked to take appropriate action.

### Paths, rear of Hartland Road

Residents have asked for a site meeting in the dark so that parish councillors can see for themselves that lights are needed at the back of the council houses.

### Seat at Minepit Corner

The seat, needed by elderly people, will hopefully soon be renovated after being smashed by a lorry, and replaced.

### Beach Car Park

A complaint from a visitor whose car was swamped by the sea is to be passed to Harbour Commissioners.

### St. Endellion Lane

County Highways are to be asked to consider the deteriorating condition of the lane, particularly where it seems to be getting lost in the field near the churchyard.

### Restricted Zone Signs

Extra plates have been put up just within the zone where it ends near the garages.

### Revised Layout, New Road/Back Hill

County Highways have tried to secure a revised layout for the junction but this will not happen in the current financial year.

### Slippery Lines

County Highways are to be asked to find a remedy for the slipperiness of the painted-out yellow lines in wet weather.

### Telephone Boxes

Following a request from a member of the public that the old red boxes are not replaced with modern ones, it was proposed to send a letter to British Telecom. A scheme for parish councillors to look after the boxes is to be considered next month.

### Coastal Footpath

A complaint was received from a member of the public, who a while ago had fallen and received serious injuries on the coastal footpath at Port Isaac, that the path is still dangerous.

### Planning Applications

Retention of wooden bungalow, Withy Garden, Mrs. May: no observations.

Erection of dwelling, Cranstoun, Mayfield, Mr. Wesley Blake: no observations but a bungalow would be preferred.

### Public Discussion

It was pointed out that a new opening to the 'carpenter's shop' at Trelights was potentially very dangerous to traffic.

The condition of the footpath in Port Isaac valley is to be examined by members of the parish council.

In reply to a question: an extra street light will be installed at the corner of Fore Street (entrance to 'Springside') at the next opportunity, i.e. when the appropriate SWEB workmen are in the village.

### Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 17th. October at Trelights. This meeting will be one week later than usual due to a holiday.

## LIFEBOAT

The Four Legged Race attracted a lot of spectators on 19th. August. The winners were - Fancy Dress: Golden Lion Ladies Nina Daly, Rhoven Mably, and Penelope Davis. Ladies Prize: The Huntsman Team Sarah Irons, Zoe Coshall, and Elizabeth Townsend. Men's Prize: The Pityme Team Chris Palmer, Mark Jarvis, and Richard Matherson. The amount raised will be published when all the sponsorship money has been collected.

A regular visitor to Port Isaac for some twenty years, Mr. Peter Morris, from Essex, ran in the London Marathon and raised £250 for the RNLI, which he presented when on holiday in August.

On 26th. August the Jet Ski races at Port Gaverne drew a lot of spectators in spite of bad weather. The organisers donated the proceeds of their barbecue and collected money in Lifeboat boxes. Bernie and Julie Corrigan kindly let us put the Volvo on their car park which helped in selling draw tickets. The event has raised £411 so far, and the organisers are also donating a part of the race entry fees.

Our new Lifeboat was formally handed over and dedicated on Sunday 4th. September. The Platt was packed for the ceremonies which were attended by locals, visitors, and guests representing the rescue services, neighbouring Lifeboat Stations and Branches, and civic authorities.

The new boat was donated by Peter and Mollie Tabor, from Glastonbury, who have promised to return to Port Isaac. Emily Walton, elder daughter of crew member Andy Walton, presented Mrs. Tabor with flowers on behalf of the Station.

The service of dedication was conducted by Father Hugh Fryer and Revd. John Young. Music was provided by the St. Breward Silver Band and the Port Isaac Singers.

After the service, a Sea King helicopter from RNAS Culdrose flew over the harbour in salute, displaying the RNLI flag.

On 10th. September, the Lifeboat joined Padstow Lifeboat and a helicopter from RNAS Culdrose in the search for two divers reported overdue near the Quiles off Trevoze Head. The divers were found, unharmed, by the helicopter, and rescued.

The same evening the Lifeboat joined a search for an aircraft reported to have 'ditched' in the sea off Pentire Point. HM Coastguard ended the search after two hours, when checks confirmed no aircraft was missing.

On 11th. September, the Lifeboat stood by below cliffs at Polzeath while a Coastguard team raised a party of seven persons to safety.

On 13th. September, in poor sea and weather conditions, the lifeboat was launched to assist a windsurfer reported in difficulties off Trebetherick, but was recalled when the casualty reached safety unaided.

A report of a swimmer in trouble at Trevone Bay, on 14th. September, resulted in the Lifeboat being launched, and then recalled when the swimmer reached safety soon afterwards.

The Harvest Festival at the Cornish Arms, Pendoggett, on Friday 16th. September, began with a short service conducted by Father Alan Wainwright. A large display of donated gifts then came under the hammer of auctioneer Neville Andrews who persuaded those present to part with £467. Mrs. Hilary Butler from Camelford bought the Harvest Loaf for £26 then gave it back to the RNLI for resale. The Loaf was offered by the slice, with cheese and garlic butter, at the Golden Lion on Sunday morning and, together with donations, raised a further £41, making the total a record £508.
