PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public during the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 8th. May.

Once again the room was crowded with members of the public.

Election of Officers

This was the Annual General Meeting. Mrs. Cann was re-elected Chairman, Mr. Norris - Vice Chairman, Dr. Barron - Treasurer, Messrs Barron, Bolton, and Dawe - Playing Fields Committee representatives, Mr. Welton - Village Hall, Mr. Bolton - Emergency Committee, Messrs. Bolton, Stokes, and Symons - Cornwall Association of Town and Parish Councils, Cllr. Symons - Port Isaac and District Tourism Association, Messrs. Barriball and Dawe - Treights Village Green Association, and Mr. Stokes - Voluntary Hospital Car Organisation.

Signs - 'Historic Fishing Village'
Concern was voiced that the local tourism association signs have been erected before approval of the cost, Mr. Welton pointed out, however, that they were different signs from those discussed last month.

St. Endellion Lane

A site meeting will be held if work to clear the lane is not done soon.

St. Endellion Churchyard Fund

The donation this year will stay at £375, the same as last year.

Proposed Closing of Footpath 3

Letters from the public claimed the path - from Port Gaverne via the valley to Tregaverne - is a useful 'amenity' path but that the farmer who wants the path closed tries to

prevent its use. A proposal that the path be kept open was accepted by a vote of 5 to 1.

Proposed Bottle Bank

Our parish council will be the first applicant for a bottle bank in a scheme involving the County Council, North Cornwall District Council, and contractors United Glass. Mr. Phelps countering rumours about broken glass and noise said 'we must do our bit to preserve natural resources'. More information is awaited.

Port Isaac Cricket Club

The new ground will cost about £540 to prepare but as the parish council has only £300 set aside this year for donations, it was felt that, while the club should be encouraged, it ought also to be self-supporting. A token £50 is to be donated.

Annual Public Meeting

Mrs. Cann said it was encouraging to see a record attendance by the public at this year's meeting.

Brocagnus Stone, Long Cross

The council gratefully accepted an offer from a local contractor to cut the grass around the stone.

Sign at Silvershell View

Although the Highway Authority know of no planning permission for the 'Turning space only, no parking' sign, the resident, Mr. Sarfas, had received verbal permission from the Planning Dept. He was advised to get formal, written permission.

Street Sweeping, Port Isaac

Members of the public had written to say they fear that if, as rumoured, only Fore Street and the main road are to be swept by a machine this year, not only will this be inefficient but the other streets and alleys, if not swept, will become indescribably filthy. The parish council is to send copies of the letters, to N.C.D.C., with a strong letter of protest.

Community Charge

MP Gerry Neale agreed, in a letter, that it seemed unfair that people who offer Bed and Breakfast for six months should have to pay a trade collection rate for twelve. Mr.

Bolton said, 'they make you pay for having the audacity to let cottages, and attract visitors to the village to the benefit of everybody'.

Planning Applications

Mr. and Mrs. G.W. Cleave: Dwelling and Garage, land at Port Gaverne [opposite 'St. Illicks']. No observations.

J.H. Sloman & Sons:

Change of use of disused agricultural building to dwelling, Trefreock Farm. No observations. It was announced that an application for a building next to the cliff path at Port Isaac had been refused by the Planning Department.

Public Discussion

Mr. Shields said that as a visitor he had never seen the streets of Port Isaac look so disgusting; the rain water grids have not been flushed out for years and the dog mess was getting worse due to local dogs being let loose and fouling the streets every morning. Mr. Bolton replied that the owners should set the dogs an example and not throw litter everywhere.

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 12th. June at 7.30pm. in the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

FOOTPATH AT THE MILL

We feel we must reply to Mr Penna's letter in last month's Trio in order to put a few facts straight. The footpath going up to the Mill Pool is not the original path, that ran beside the mill race (long since diverted) but because it was not maintained the path became overgrown and as the Mill was unoccupied people just walked where they liked. The proposed diversion by the County Council (not at our request - merely a suggestion) means that the whole of our drive will then be a Public footpath, at the present time the stretch from where the footpath takes off to Trewetha and the sharp right hand bend is private property. Mr Penna is quite wrong in saying it is exposed (how can he say anyway since it is private*) in fact it is one of the most sheltered spots on whole farm as the animals will tell you. Furthermore if the diversion goes ahead people will be able to walk straight up the drive when they want to go to Homer Park or do the round walk to the village. At the moment they should go up the path to the end of the mill pool turn right up the side of the field and come out on to the drive at the sharp bend. Jim and Bertie Watson.

*The highest point of the diversion is on FP no. 40. R.P.
