## ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Mrs. Cann urged electors to 'have a go' for an election next year.

The Financial Report showed the second most expensive item is running Port Gaverne toilets - over 17% of the annual expenditure.

County Cllr. Harvey Lander spoke about his committee work, the county budget and the new Community Charge.

The road at Pendoggett will be widened during the next two years but Bodannon was still 'on the books'. Endellion Lane at Trelights is to be cleared but not tarred.

Mr. Hill, County Rights of Way Officer, spoke of Parish Council involvement in the need to encourage the public to use footpaths, the sole means of reaching the depths of the country and important routes of communication with minor maintenance cost compared with vehicular highways.

Cllr. Henry Symons said this year there has been the biggest upheaval in council history.

When refuse collection contracts were drawn up, some of the finer details were often forgotten.

The district rate was 18% higher than last year but 9% due to the cost of collecting the Community Charge. Other increases due to cost of administration, private tenders, and high cost of refuse collection. The council's 50% nominal right to rent at the Housing Association development above the school, will be, effectively, as much as 90%. If the public complain, the council now have a statutory duty to clean a street - but at a cost.

We are reliant on tourism but the support is not strong enough. North Cornwall's best advertisement is to get the infrastructure right.

Inspector Buckingham said police officers were being taken to other areas for the 'Birmingham Six' investigation, Dartmoor Prison Death inquiry, etc. and not being replaced. If you feel there should be more police, write to your MP.

Out of 52 crimes in the area during the year, 69% were detected.

Many cars are being parked in the wrong places but there is a lack of resources to deal with them, 'but beware the roving traffic warden!'. When there were no questions, Mr. Buckingham said 'this must be a safe place to live'.

The Public Discussion covered the topics of St. Endellion Lane, need for a zebra crossing at the new estate where the surgery will be, when will 'children' signs be put up near the village hall, problems with the footpath at the mill, work done on paths without landowner's knowledge, lack of protection for landowners against misdeeds by walkers, dogs in the playing fields, the road condition by the garages, and the Community Charge and Business Rates.

## PARISH COUNCIL

A report of the monthly meeting (the 'Annual Meeting') at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 14th. May (held in the main hall instead of the kitchen due to possible danger from an 'unsafe' chimney).

Mrs. Cann did not wish to stand for Chairman this year and Mr. Bolton was elected on a vote of 6 to 3.

Mr. Dawe, disappointed at being passed over for the chair, after twenty years' service to the Parish, announced his intention to resign. The election of other officers and members of committees took place.

Mr. Stokes said he had walked around the village and thought it looked o.k., except for the litter. Mr. Dawe said the streets have not been swept, the drains have become blocked and there will be flooding when it rains. Letters to be sent to the County Council and North Cornwall District Council stating the urgent need for work.

## Finance

£2,375, the first half of the year's precept, has been received, and after payments, a balance of over £2,000 is left. £1,500 is to be transferred to the deposit account, bringing this to just over £3,900.

## Footpath Trimming Tenders

Notices are to be displayed inviting tenders for the footpath work.

## Playing Fields

Permission was granted for Donkey Derbys to use the fields on 24th. July and 14th. August.

A suggestion for a public toilet and guide/scout hut was thought a good idea but would cost too much unless, perhaps, the organisations involved would be able to get some grant aid. The Community Council Field Officer who was to have spoken about safety in playgrounds, failed to attend.

## Burial Ground

The Council are to value the land at St. Endellion with a view to purchase and the clerk was asked to obtain relevant information.

## Map Notice Board

This will not be up-dated to include the names of new businesses as it is only meant to be a guide map, not an advertising board.

## HRH Duke of Kent's Visit

The Duke will arrive by helicopter to visit Port Isaac RNLi Lifeboat Station, on Wednesday 18th July, and the 'Mayor' (Chairman of the Parish Council) has been requested to meet him at the slipway.

## Clerk's Correspondence

a. Mr. Melhuish of Trelights has asked for the path across to St. Endellion Church to be considered as a right of way. Footpath Officer Mrs. Doney is to be consulted.

b. Mrs. Buckden, 5 Overcliff, wants cars prevented from parking across the Fore Street access. The police and County Highways are to be told.

## Planning Application:

Erection of 2 Farmworkers' Cottages, Treore Farm, Pendoggett, R. and J. Pennington: the application was supported by the Parish Council.

## Public Discussion

Mrs. Strout said she thinks the village is very dirty, 'and some of the worst offenders are locals who should have some respect for our own inheritance'. She is prepared to walk Mr. Stokes around to show him. Mr. Penna said he frequently had to sweep his section of Dolphin Street. Mr. Thompson often did the same for Temple Bar and had recently even cleared out the gully so it would not be necessary to make a very long detour when there is heavy rain.

Mrs. C. Richards suggested that St. Minver Parish be asked how they bought their new burial ground. Mrs. C. Provis mentioned hostility encountered during her efforts to raise money for playground equipment, some people remember donating money in the 1950's for a playground to be where the present main car park was created instead.
