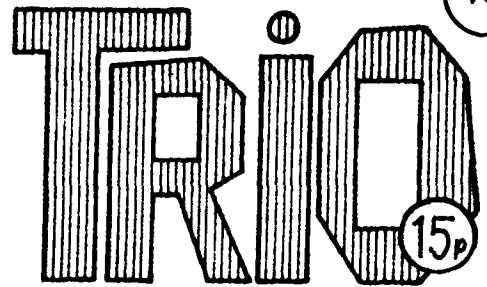

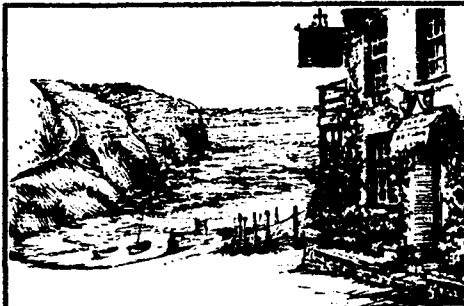

PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public during the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 11th. June.

A meeting of the Playing Field Committee had been held and minutes will be supplied later.

Finance

Total in Bank £561.57, deposit account £2751.10. After monthly expenses of £209.14, balance in the bank £361.43.

Pedestrian Crossing

The possibility of a pedestrian crossing at the new building site on the B.3267, raised at the Annual Parish Meeting, cannot be discussed until the buildings are completed.

Footpaths

Councillors were allocated sections of footpath trimming to inspect.

Playing Fields Project

Mr. Bolton reported on a meeting of the newly formed Port Isaac Playing Fields Action Group at which three new items had been requested:

1. A sign 'No Dogs. By order of St. Endellion Parish Council'. This is to be provided.
2. A seat to replace one that was vandalised. Mrs. Pam Richards to be asked if concrete seat ends at St. Endellion Vicarage can be used. The original nameplate commemorating Mr. Tonkin may be affixed if it can be found.
3. A request for another litter bin was turned down. It was proposed that £500 for the Port Isaac Playing Fields Action Group could be made available when needed.

St. Endellion Churchyard

The field could be valued at £1,300 plus legal and surveyors' fees, and the cost of fencing - a possible total of £2,000. Cllr. Symons felt

that this type of land should be valued at only about £1,300 an acre, and so, being less than half an acre, could cost only £500.

The council is to go into more detail of costing, etc., and the matter will be on the next agenda.

Flytipping Church Hill

The landowner had been seen tipping beds, mattresses, refrigerators, etc. from ground above the old quarry furthest up Church Hill. Cllr. Symons said surely he could do as he liked on his own ground. The council, however, is to write to the Environmental Health Department of N.C.D.C. for information about this.

Consistency in Planning Decisions, and The Role of Parishes Within a Double Tier Local Government System

Cllr. Symons reported that the matter of consistency in planning decisions had been dealt with at Truro. It was a failure of planning authorities throughout the country and difficult to achieve. Varying reasons were put forward on planning applications and variations in the way different members of planning committees voted.

On the role of parishes within a single, not double, tier system of local government, a working party found that the County Councils could possibly be done away with and the parish councils could have more say, as they should. But central government was presently dictating to the county and district councils.

Development at Glebe Farm

No action was taken concerning an anonymous letter.

Clerk's Correspondence

A. St. Peter's Church Flower Festival, August 9 - 12th. Mrs. Barron is to be asked if she would be willing to make a flower display on behalf of the council.

B.C.A.L. & T.C. Constitution documents were handed to Cllr. Symons to make specific comments at the next meeting.

C. An earlier request is to be repeated for a wheel-chair ramp alongside the steps on the cliff footpath in front of the coastguard lookout station.

D. Access to Overcliff. The Highways Department have suggested that a small sign 'Keep clear private access' be mounted on the wall.

E. Drains in Port Isaac. A report from the Divisional Surveyor that all have now been cleared.

F. Bushes in Margaret's Lane and Little Lane. The Divisional Surveyor has arranged for these to be cut.

G. 1989 Cornish Buildings Awards. Disappointment was expressed that the council's recommendation of the new house in Middle Street was not among the winners.

H. Car park notice board. Mr. Werrillow is to be asked for written details of price and how much the Port Isaac and District Tourism Association is willing to pay towards the cost before a decision at the next meeting.

I. Devon & Cornwall Police Authority. No council member was free to attend a meeting of the Mid-Cornwall Police Liaison Consultative Committee in Wadebridge. Cllr. Symons is already involved with a similar meeting at Launceston.

Planning

A list of recent planning approvals was read out.

New application: Alterations and extensions, Trewithick Farm, Trelights, Mr and Mrs. A. Gordon: The council were in approval but said the corner of the road needed to be widened.

Public Discussion

A. Mrs. D. Hambly said the existing notice at the Playing Fields 'Don't let dogs foul playing area' will have to be modified when the 'No dogs' sign is erected.

B. Mrs. C. Richards thanked the parish council for the promise of £500 which, with their own money, would make the Port Isaac Playing Fields Action Group eligible for a £4,000 grant, and enable them to proceed with their plans.

Mrs. Richards also spoke of the reckless behaviour of a van driver delivering plastic containers to the coach park, endangering some small children in her care and causing damage to the fence. Mrs. Peggy Richards will attempt to trace the owner of the vehicle and the matter will be discussed next month.

C. Miss S. Gaunt said that the path leading to Lobber was blocked by a low hanging tree.

She also asked if there would be a bottle bank in Port Isaac but was told that this was unlikely although the matter was still 'in the air'.

The public were then asked to leave as the council had to discuss footpath tenders and a council house allocation.

Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 9th. July at 7.30pm. in the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

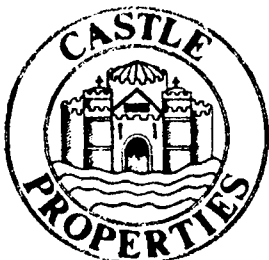

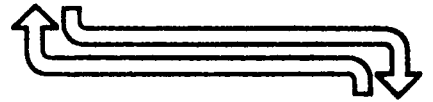
