Mrs. Bradley in Port Isaac

The BBC is currently in the preparation stages of making four one-hour episodes of 'The Mrs Bradley Mysteries'.

This series is set in 1929 and stars Diana Rigg as Mrs Bradley and Neil Dudgeon as her Chauffeur who happen upon murder mysteries to solve as they tour the country in a Rolls Royce. The BBC made one film last year which proved to be a great success, and all the new episodes follow the same format with each story being contained in each one.

The episode they are hoping to film here is entitled 'The Worst Viper', and occurs mainly at the seaside.

Their filming dates for this episode are from Tuesday 11th. May to Friday 28th. May, and as the script currently stands they would need to film for 34 days around the harbour, hotel, pub, and fishermen's sheds area of Port Isaac.

They are also hoping to film in other locations - Doyden Castle, the beach, one of the fisherman's cottages at Port Quin, and also at a 'spectacular cove' nearby, does anybody have any suggestions of the best one? It ideally needs good access for some vehicles to aid filming!

PARISH COUNCIL

Port Isaac Fire Practice

Assistant District Fire Officer Kevin Marshall advised the Council about the intended practice in Port Isaac for one evening, date undisclosed, in the last week of March. Sea water will be used as mains water may not be used for practices. If the plan does not work; things will be put right. In a rural area like Port Isaac the arrival time can be up to twenty minutes and it is crucial therefore that a fire is detected the very moment it starts – smoke detectors are essential.

No Parking Tickets

A member of the public who had reported to the police that some vehicles were obstructing Fore Street was told that no action can be taken where there are no yellow lines. Peggy Richards will clarify the situation with the police, and remind them that Fore Street is 'no parking at any time' without yellow lines!

Plans

Installation of an 'Orange' telecommunications aerial and equipment cabins at Port Gaverne is inevitable and the Parish Council felt it would be futile to raise any objections. Bill Dawe abstained from the vote.

Notices of approval were received for listed building work at Poltreworgey farmhouse, and for change of a barn to holiday accommodation at Little Treswarrow.

District Councillor's Report

Bill Dawe spoke about a wall that had been built across a well at 'Calenick' in Trelights and regretted that such old features were being denied to the villagers.

Chairman's Report

David Phelps spoke about a meeting of Parish Councils at St. Mabyn by Mr. Neil Pendleton the new North Cornwall District Council Chief Planning Officer.

Bryan Nicholls asked for details of the cost of refurbishing the main car park toilets.

Seats

A request has been received from members of family of the late John Riddex who wish to donate a memorial seat.

The usual contractor is to be asked again this year for a price, to be approved at the next meeting, for painting and oiling all the seats.

Playing Field

Further tenders are being sought for repairs and up-grades of the playground equipment.

District & Parish Council Elections

The North Cornwall District Council timetable for the May Election was presented. The Council decided that Official Poll Cards at a cost of 17p. each, were not required. Polling day will be Thursday 6th. May.

Concern was expressed at new arrangements for the count which this year is to take place in Wadebridge the day following the poll, and the Clerk was asked to write to the returning officer expressing disapproval. Volunteers who take a day off to be present during the election and at the count would now have to take an extra day off.

The Name 'First and Last'

A letter has been written to the owner of the building, Mr. Champness, requesting that the old name be retained after the proposed partial demolition and rebuilding works have been carried out

Verge At Trelights

Harold Barriball suggested that granite setts, like those around the old stone at Longcross, could be used to protect the grass verge alongside the road, north of the chapel, which is being damaged by vehicles parking.

Bank in Trewetha Lane

The bank, which is at the rear of properties in New Road, is slipping after so much wet weather and the problem is being made worse by large delivery lorries cutting away the base. Transportation and Estates is to be informed of the problem.

Notice Boards

The Parish Council will approach the Co-operative Society about a proposed new and larger Parish Council board at the side of the forecourt in front of the Port Isaac shop.

North Cornwall District Council has been notified that the Parish Council no longer wishes to keep the board at the main car park and full responsibility for this will be handed to Port Isaac and District Tourism Association which contributed towards the cost of the board when it was first erected.

Coastal Path, Port Isaac

Cornwall County Council Transportation and Estates are to be made aware of the bad state of the road and footpath

between the Council car park and Atlantic House and to ask if improvements can be made, pointing out that this is a premier path for most of the visitors to Port Isaac.

Coronation Park, Trelights

Harold Barriball proposed that, in addition to trimming the grass as usual, the present contractor could be asked also to trim the hedges, bushes, etc. within the park.

Tenders

The following tenders have been advertised on the notice boards and in the Cornish Guardian. Tenders had to be submitted by Monday 8th. March.

- a. Footpath Clearing.
- b. Grass Cutting on the Main, Port Gaverne
- c. Caretaker for Port Gaverne Toilets
- d. Rent of Grass Keep at the Parish Field
- e. Repairs to Wall alongside the Coastal Path at Port Isaac.

A quotation was received last year for repairs to the Wall At Coronation Park, Trelights. The contractor is to be asked if it still stands.

Annual Public Meeting

The meeting will take place this year on Thursday 15th. April and speakers are to be invited from several local services.

Car Parking Problems

Paul Tyler MP is continuing to make valiant efforts to get an improvement in the police cover for Port Isaac and to find a solution to the problem of illegally parked cars. The Parish Council meanwhile is to continue trying to arrange a meeting with the Department.






CHRISTMAS LIGHTS
