## The Port Isaac **Community Taxi Service**



### Need to go to Wadebridge? The bus not convenient? Why not use the new Community Taxi? supplied by Wadebridge Taxis

This door-to-door taxi service, funded by the Doc Martin Fund, will operate every Monday morning and is open to everyone. Cost: £5 per person How it works:

- The Community Taxi will collect you from your home, starting at 10am and drive you to Wadebridge.
- You will then have until 12.30pm to do all you have to do in Wadebridge before returning to a designated pick-up-point.
- The Community Taxi will then deliver you back to your front door.

What you need to do:

- Register on the scheme straight away by calling Yvonne on 01208 880705 or 07411 766613. You will be given a registration number.
- When you want to go to Wadebridge, call Yvonne by no later than 4pm on Friday evening to reserve your seat for the following Monday, on 01208 880705/07411 766613, giving her your registration number.
- Be ready to be picked up at 10am on the Monday morning pick ups will start at 10am. Pay the driver £5 and then go and do your shopping.

The Doc Martin Fund are subsidising this scheme. It will be a case of use it or lose it! We'll give it a six month trial. Places in the taxi will be on a first-come, first-served basis and the taxi can only take eight people.



An early Easter message

'Early, on the first day of the week, while it was still dark,

Mary Magdalene came to the tomb' ... while it was still dark

- a reminder that Resurrection comes, not, as the saying is 'out of a clear blue sky' but out of

*darknes*s; out of the darkness of the night; out of the darkness of despair, out of the darkness of sorrow, abandonment, pain and grief. And even more astonishingly, resurrection comes out of the darkness of death.

We've only to look at Easter cards to see that Easter is most often illustrated as a festival of the morning - with bright sunshine, flowers and lambs frolicking - and there's nothing wrong with this, for the visible return of Spring raises all our spirits. But we need also to be aware that the natural symbolism of Spring may so dominate the Easter celebrations that the Easter message may lose its radical character, its cutting edge .

For the reality we experience in the natural world is death and decay - while Easter proclaims the opposite. Out of desolation and despair, out of wickedness and cruelty, out of the anguish and agony of the cross comes victory. In raising Christ from the dead, God has done a totally new thing, has performed an act of new Creation.

Here indeed is good news and especially today for those who are experiencing illness, pain and sorrow; those of our sisters and brothers who are at this moment being nailed to the cross in places of famine, conflict and natural disaster in our world. It's good news for those who are mourning the death of dear ones, whether of lives cut short by illness or combat; it's good news for all who are experiencing human cruelty, oppression and injustice.

For the God of Easter is the God who shares in human suffering, who in Christ Jesus has drunk to the full the cup of suffering and drained it to its dregs. Good news indeed!

Planning Applications

Members considered these planning applications and made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

 PA18/09791, Gwel Arvor, Tintagel Terrace, Port Isaac – reserved matters application (access, appearance, landscaping, layout and scale) following outline approval PA17/09691 for demolition of existing dwelling and replace with two dwellings.

Revised plans had been received, but Members did not find them to be an improvement. The pitched roof addition on top of the original design in response to the PC comment, only serves to increase the height bulk and scale of a design already at odds with its context. The twin houses impact on the neighbour in terms of loss of privacy and amenity are not addressed by the changes. It was RESOLVED to maintain the previous OBJECTIONS, namely: Members are in agreement with the opinion of the AONB officer, that the proposal would do harm to the character of the area.

Members urged CC to refuse this proposal with ref to NPPF para 12 Achieving well designed places.

Our emerging NDP, having satisfied SEA screening is in preparation for Reg 14. For information Policy 5H of our NDP for Character Area/ Tintagel Terrace, seeks to protect the residential harmony of the area and cautions developments should:

- Recognising the value of the roofscape in this Character Area to the general settlement form in views from the surrounding landscape.
- Ensuring any new development or redevelopment within the area accords with the existing building lines, ridge heights and roofscape.
- The appropriate use of materials suitable for an exposed marine environment and the sensitive and sympathetic use of colour in building finishes.
- PA19/01018, 49 Fore Street, Port Isaac removal of chimney and replace with wood burner stove flue. Members had no objection but requested a condition that the flue is black rather than silver to match the neighbour's flue, in consideration of the Conservation Area.
- 3. PA19/01309, 7 Tintagel Terrace, Port Isaac construction of a detached two storey single family dwelling with parking provision to the rear (all on a plot where a detached dormer bungalow and detached garage, used as a studio, has recently been demolished) with variation of condition 2 in respect of decision PA17/00575 dated 07.04.17 to amend approved plans to change design. On the basis of the information provided Members OBJECT because the and scale and bulk is overwhelming on a tight plot and will causing loss of light and amenity to the neighbours. In addition the proposal would cause harm to the street scene.

Members urged CC to refuse this proposal with ref to NPPF para 12 Achieving well designed places.

Our emerging Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP), having satisfied SEA screening is in preparation for Reg 14. For information Policy 5H of our emerging NDP for Character Area/ Tintagel Terrace, seeks to protect the residential harmony of the area and cautions developments should:

- Recognising the value of the roofscape in this Character Area to the general settlement form in views from the surrounding landscape.
- Ensuring any new development or redevelopment within the area accords with the existing building lines, ridge heights and roofscape.
- The appropriate use of materials suitable for an exposed marine environment and the sensitive and sympathetic use of colour in building finishes.

Members are prepared to re re-evaluate their decision if elevations with comparative rooflines are supplied. The plans as seen did not offer any comparison

- 4. <u>PA19/0146, 5 Roscarrock Hill, Port Isaac</u> proposed partial demolition, extension, renovation, remodelling and structural repairs. Members supported the application.
- 5. PA19/0146, 5 Roscarrock Hill, Port Isaac LBC for proposed partial

demolition, extension, renovation, remodelling and structural repairs. Members supported the application, but one member had concern reference the use of stainless steel and rope as a visual detractor in the garden.

6. PA19/01463, 30 New Road, Port Isaac – formation of new vehicular access with turntable. Members objected on the grounds this is an unresolved junction; if permitted, vehicles would emerge the wrong way onto a one-way street, with no pedestrian pavement and compromised views in all directions because of the volume of traffic, waiting coaches and turning buses. The proposal also involves vehicles crossing a right of way and pedestrian pavement.

- PA18/11604, Flat 5, 19 The Terrace, Port lsaac – replacement side extension and internal alterations.
- PA18/12085, Sunnycroft, Trelights ground and first floor extensions with demolition of the existing sun lounge and outbuilding.
- 3. PA18/11687, 1 Brooklands View, Port Isaac erection of garage workshops including MoT testing station and erection of artisan workshops/stores (Use Classes B1/B2/B8), formation of access and installation of package sewage treatment plant with variation of condition 2 in respect of decision PA13/09246 dated 04.12.13 to amend approved plans.
- PA18/09983, Meadow Stile, Trewetha Lane, Port Isaac – repair/replace 30-metre stone boundary wall on South East side of Meadow Stile Lane.
- 5. PA18/10784, 76a Fore Street, Port Isaac variation of Condition 1 of Planning Application No. PA12/00231 (dated 5th April 2012) to allow the shop to open until 10pm and to allow the shop to remain open on Friday and Saturday nights only from the end of October until the Thursday before Easter with no seats/tables outside.

#### Road Safety Issues

Members held a site meeting a representative from Highways to discuss various Road Safety issues in the parish, with the following outcomes:

- 20mph Speed Limit / Signs the provision of a 30mph speed restriction through Port Gaverne was discussed but Port Gaverne doesn't meet the current criteria.
- Bus Stop the existing bus stop is a
  designated bus limited waiting bay and
  should be displaying appropriate signage.
  He had asked that a new larger or
  additional sign is installed as per the
  example provided which will then clearly
  highlight its use and then can become
  enforceable if ignored. He had asked that
  the signs are ordered as a priority, along
  with the additional One Way signage for
  Fore Street.
  - Cllr. Penny said that coaches should be able to use the bus stop as a dropping off point.
- Existing 'SLOW' markings need to be repainted and new ones installed, in all areas, i.e. Trewetha, Trelights and at Port Isaac. Mr Jones confirmed the Highway

# Popular Chorale Concert in Camelford

Everything compounded against the Port Isaac Chorale's concert on the evening of Saturday March 16th at the Camelford Methodist Church.

The weather was atrocious; as Janet Townsend opened the concert she thanked the audience for turning out on such an awful night and admitted that she was sure everyone would have preferred to stay at home by the fire!

The England Scotland Six Nations rugby match was in full swing so most of the choir and audience had to leave their televisions before the final whistle. One choir member lives near Camelford so was able to update everyone on the final score just in time.

The concert, held in aid of the 100th anniversary of Save The Children, got off to a rousing start with the ever popular version of Sing A Song of Sixpence in the style of Handel. It certainly made the audience realise that the Chorale were in fine voice and they had a thoroughly enjoyable evening ahead.

Janet Townsend had put together a varied and interesting programme ranging from an archetypal English choral piece, Linden Lea, to the more rousing Rhythm of Life. The Chorale also performed two newer pieces which are proving very popular with audiences (and the choir enjoy singing them!). A Flower Remembered, written by John Rutter in memory of the Japanese earthquake and tsunami in 2011, and Homeward Bound, not the Simon & Garfunkel song, but an American choral piece which is supposed the reflect the journey made by many young college students as they go out into the world, only to return many years later. The Chorale feel that Homeward Bound reflects the journey of many of our local young people who go away for university or work but always plan to return. The Chorale were very fortunate to have two superb young local soloists who both perfored at the concert. Caleb Blackburn expertly played two contrasting piano pieces and his sister Tammy entertained the audience (and the choir!) with her beautiful playing of the cello, accompanied by her brother.

The concert concluded with another Handel inspired nursery rhyme. This time it was Old Mother Hubbard which made a light hearted end to a very successful concert which was followed by a substantial and delicious tea and hospitality, provided by the Methodist Church.

Steward will be putting a lining package of works together for the entry into Port Isaac on the B3267, this will include the installation of a new SLOW marking as discussed on site.

- Other White Lining the 30mph on the road at the entrance to Port Isaac is completely obliterated as is the sign warning of the school and all the white lining in the parish needs renewing.
- 5. Car Park Sign Mr Jones said new car park signage, incorporating the WC marking, will also be ordered and attached to the existing sign post and the warning signs that were obscured by growth adjacent to Hillson Close had since been trimmed back
- 6. <u>Trelights Highway Issues</u> a copy of the paper from Cllr. Kirkman had been provided to Mr Jones, who had been in agreement with the proposals. Ms Rapier had been asked to include this proposal in the Network RTO. The Clerk to seek an update from both officers.

## THE REAL RNLI LIFESAVERS

In a key scene in the Fisherman's Friends film, several of the band get called away from one of the most important gigs of their lives as their pagers beep and they drop everything to launch the lifeboat and go to the aid of people in danger in the sea – just like our real RNLI crew members do.

In total, five members of the original Fisherman's Friends band were RNLI volunteers, with sons of three of the band members following in their fathers' footsteps. George Cleave and Tom Brown, whose fathers are Fisherman's Friends singers, Jon Cleave and Jeremy Brown, are both proud lifeboat crew members here at Port Isaac Lifeboat Station.

George, who is 28 years old and runs his own business out of the Cornish town's fish cellars, said: 'As a young person in a small community like Port Isaac, there comes a point when, if you're going to stay in the village, it's time to join the lifeboat crew. Especially working and living so close to the station it is expected that you will be part of the team.

'But I love it. I love giving something back to our community and helping people. Most of the crew grew up in or around Port Isaac and we spent our weekends and holidays fishing or exploring the coastline, so we know it like the back of our hands. To be able to use this knowledge and the RNLI training to help people is why we do it.'

Fisherman and Harbourmaster Tom, 30, continued: 'We're a small station covering one of the biggest patches along the exposed North Cornwall coast where there is no shelter from the elements. The types of incidents we go to are varied, we have a lot of holiday makers who get into trouble, coasteerers, anglers and dog walkers. We are often someone's last lifeline and its amazing to know that we've played a part in that.

'We get called out at all times, often in the middle of the night. It's a huge adrenaline rush when you get woken up by the pager. As well as training and launching together, we're often at the same events or weddings and its just part of what comes with being on the crew that we might have to leave when the pager beeps.

'It's great to see our dads enjoying success with the Fisherman's Friends. They've always been singing, so it can be quite strange at times to hear them on the radio or see them on the TV, but when they get back to the village they are just the same, nagging us about the boat or something or other.'

# Scott Mann's update from Parliament

With Members of Parliament in the spotlight and the news filled with Brexit stories, the last few weeks in parliament have continued to be both challenging and tough. At the time of writing the biggest issue of Brexit is regrettably no closer to a conclusion but I am still positive that the deadlock can be broken, and a positive conclusion can be reached.

With spring upon us Cornwall is warming up and it is now time for all to embrace that Cornish sunshine. Padstow, like many North Cornwall towns, regularly receives a lot of tourism in the spring with many people coming to visit the worldfamous locations and popular Cornish beaches. It is, however, important for many to know the risks of walking on the cliffs in North Cornwall; especially with dogs that are off the lead. Many rescues have occurred in previous months regarding our poor canine friends tragically falling off cliffs, many due to not being on leads. Only in February did poor Issey, a springer-doodle, fall eighty feet off a cliff in Trevone Round Hole; luckily the dog survived with superficial injuries. I urge all to ensure that when walking their dogs around the beautiful coastal areas that they take necessary precautions to guarantee the safety of both pets, and owners, alike.

I have also been busy working on some of the initiatives which I hope to bring to North Cornwall. Recently, and after taking part in the parliamentary debate on autism, I had a meeting with the National Autistic Society Cornwall. They have kindly offered to give my staff and I a training session in autism awareness, and I'm hoping we can make Bodmin Cornwall's first autistic-friendly town. Businesses and shops which sign up would turn down music and dim lights to support autistic customers for a period each week.

The coast is close to my heart and I am very keen to see my Bathing Waters Bill included in the wider Environment Bill, which will set the benchmark for our environmental and water quality standards after Brexit. With that in mind, I jumped at the chance to take part in a community beach clean at Sandymouth Beach in Bude. The event was hosted by the Pennon Group as part of the 'Great British Spring Clean' campaign organised by Keep Britain Tidy in partnership with the Daily Mail. Other clean up events took place across North Cornwall and I very much enjoyed seeing the pictures posted online.

Finally, I am proud to be one of 41 MPs who have written to Ofcom, on behalf of the all-Party Parliamentary Group on Rural business, to highlight the need for annual monitoring of mobile operators' commitments on increasing rural 4G mobile coverage. Ofcom have recently made moves to maximise 4G coverage across the country including here in North Cornwall. Having more access to 4G across North Cornwall is firmly in everyone's interest with greater coverage allowing for better communication access for both constituents and local businesses alike. I know how important this is for many of my constituents and we continue to fight for better coverage.

# Volunteering with Cornwall Samaritans

In an old Victorian house in Truro the phone rings three times. A volunteer picks it up. "Samaritans – can I help you?" And so starts a conversation that may last a few minutes or an hour or so.

The only branch of Samaritans based in Cornwall is entirely run by approximately 110 volunteers, it is their vision is that fewer people die by suicide; they work to achieve this by making it their mission to alleviate emotional distress and reduce the incidence of suicidal feelings through the simple act of listening and providing a confidential opportunity to explore feelings and emotions.

Cornwall Samaritans, last year received over 50,000 contacts. By phone, email, texts and face to face. Sue Wright, the branch director said "We listen, support, we don't hurry a caller, neither do we tell them what they must do. All in a non-judgemental way, offering absolute confidentiality."

Volunteers are at the heart of Samaritans and are welcomed from all walks of life and of all ages. Full training is given and there is incredible support at the branch. Sue also mentioned that - "We not only welcome listening volunteers but also people to help support the branch by undertaking a wide range of other activities, such as administrative work, fundraising, iT, publicity or helping us look after our building. To touch another person's life when it really matters, by helping them directly, or by keeping our branches running, is a rare gift."

At a recent Information Evening held at the branch on Treyew Road in Truro, 19 people attended, many of whom will go on to attend a Selection day and then, after an informal interview with further discussions and references, they will be asked to enrol for the next training course - the start of a journey to becoming a fully-fledged Samaritan.

The Cornwall branch relies on volunteers from throughout the county, who fulfil 4 shifts a month, including an overnight duty; they carry out listening shifts and Outreach work, as well as attending various awareness events throughout Cornwall.

Outreach events are very important. Creating awareness of who Samaritans are and what they can do. A regular shift is staffed at the busy A&E dept. at Treliske Hospital, another shift is a monthly shift at a gardening project for vulnerable people, near Penzance. The branch has regular days at Truro Railway station, with co-operation from Network Rail and GWR. The branch also has a dedicated Talks Team who regularly visit different groups and organisations throughout the county.

Volunteer, Richard Sutton, said: "I have been a Samaritan for over twenty years and I am still learning so much about people and life, it's the most worthwhile thing I do, it makes me realise that my problems are not so great after all. Samaritans has changed my life and the way I look at others. I'm sometimes asked if volunteering has changed at all in those years? Callers problems and concerns certainly haven't changed, but we are much busier now and, interestingly, there is a marked increase in emails and text messages, particularly from younger callers."

# Chef Lanyon's Cornish Meatballs (swedish style ... ish)

# To feed four FOR THE MEATBALLS

8oz lean minced beef 6oz minced pork 4oz dried cranberries 3oz panko breadcrumbs 1 small diced red onion Small handful of chopped parsley I beaten egg

#### FOR THE SAUCE

2 sliced red onions Rapeseed oil 2oz sugar 4oz butter 4oz plain flour 1 pint milk ½ pint double cream 1 bunch fresh Dill, chopped Handful chopped parsley Juice of a lemon Salt & Pepper



#### **METHOD**

Soak the dried cranberrries in hot water for about 20 minutes.

Then put all the meatball ingredients into a bowl and mix thoroughly together.

Form the mix into meatballs.

Heat some oil in a pan and seal the meatballs before putting in to a deep tray.

#### Next make the sauce:

Fry the sliced onions in the oil with the sugar until caramelised. Remove from the pan.

Add the butter to the pan and melt. Then add the

flour and cook until you get a sandy texture (Ed: I remember this from school ... a roux!). Slowly add the milk, bringing to the boil before adding the rest of the milk. Whisk the mixture all the time to make sure it has no lumps. When all the milk is added, add the caramelised red onions, chopped dill, parsley, lemon juice and seasoning and simmer for about 30 minutes.

Pour this sauce over the meatballs. Then pour over the double cream, cover the dish with foil and nake in the oven for about an hour.

Serve with boiled new Cornish potatoes and pickled red cabbage.

# Kim's Hide the Veg Curry (low calorie and no wheat)

This is a recipe of many variations so put in or take out what you don't like. It can be a delicious vegetarian curry with butternut squash and sweet potatoes if you leave the chicken out ... or you can make with beef or lamb if they are your favourites ...

#### Main sauce:

I tbsp veg oil

6 largish carrots

4 big onions

1 Jar Pataks Tikka Masala Paste (I know its cheating but Pataks is consistent and doesn't rely on you having cupboards full of stale old spices). There are 587 calories in the whole jar but this recipe will do so many portions it's not so bad

Vegetable stock

I tin light Coconut milk

#### **Extras**

Chicken cut into bite size pieces Broccoli cut into bite size pieces Cauliflower cut into bite size pieces Raisins

Cashew Nuts

Green Beans cut into 3cm lengths

**Sweet Potatoes** 

Butternut squash Celery

Fennel

#### Method

Roughly chop the carrots and onions and any other veg you want to use into big chunks and using a tablespoon of veg oil caramelise them in your big saucepan (heat over high heat until they actually brown).

Then add the jar of paste, stir well and heat, then add vegetable stock. This depends on how big your pan is and how many you are feeding but enough to cover the veg is good. Adding this to the pan will deglaze all the "burnt" bits into your sauce and add to the flavour - use a wooden spoon rub the bits off the bottom.

Add the coconut milk, stir and leave to simmer for 20 minutes.

Once your 20 minutes are up use your stick blender to blend all the contents of the pan to a thick sauce, This is the basis of the curry and already tastes great ... if you add a bit more stock is a lovely vegetarian soup.

#### To enhance it:

Add the chicken pieces, again a matter of preference as to how much and how big your pan is. As they are raw you need to make sure you cook at a simmer for at least another half hour (it can carry on cooking for an hour if you want to). Than add all or any of the other ingredients about 15 minutes before you serve so that the vegetables still have some life in them and are not cooked to mush.

# WEBSITES MONTH



The flowers are finally in full bloom and everything looks green. The trees are in bud and so Spring has properly arrived. I did think of doing this column on the flower farms in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly as I saw a feature on the television featuring Ron Scamp's daffodil farm in Falmouth with the worlds largest collection of varieties https://qualitydaffodils.com . There is a nice blog about the history of flower growing in Cornwall here https://tinyrul.com/Cornish-daffs .

However, although that was a nice idea, and will perhaps do that another time, this month, given that it is Spring, I am concentrating on Spring Cleaning. There is something about this time of year that perhaps is an echo of coming out of hibernation. The days are getting longer and we maybe have a bit more energy. We also maybe become aware of the amount of stuff there is cluttering up the place. Decluttering has become an enormous industry and the web has some good places for sampling this although has a long history – Mrs Beeton had much to say on the topic (see picture) and you can download her books from here www.gutenberg.org/.

One of the stars is Marie Kondo, who brings her particular Japanese approach to how we view our stuff and it is an approach that some people hate and some people love. You can see her website here https://konmari.com and there are also lots of Youtube videos and also an app. She says that we need to connect with the meaning of the things that surround us, our home and the possessions we have. When she visits someone's home to help them she begins by thanking the home. Appreciation is a key aspect of her style. If you read her book, she didn't quite start off like that. She used to tidy up her parents possessions, throwing out ones they didn't use, until she got found out and was banned from the relevant rooms and cupboards! The touchstone for whether to keep something or not is whether, when you hold it, it 'sparks joy'. Even if you don't go the full works, she has good ideas about how to keep your drawers tidy.

There is also some good research about how decluttering can help you feel better and he British Psychological Society has a research digest (that I recommend anyway as it has some excellent stuff and is free) on this topic https://tinyurl.com/BPS-declutter . There are a couple of links worth exploring here, one to an article by Christian Jarrat, who oversees the research digest entitled "The psychology of stuff and things" which explains what we know about how we develop the attachments we do the the possessions we have, and how important they are. Another link is to a group called The Institute for Challenging Disorganizatio www.challengingdisorganization.org that aims to develop evidence-based approaches to people who have difficulties being organised. Their website has some interesting links and publications on this topic if you want to get into it. The British Psychological Society (again) have produced some guidelines on hoarding https://tinyurl.com/BPS-hoarding (registration needed but free to download) that explain how this can become a really difficult problem and some ideas on how best to help.

If and when you do decide to get stuck in and Spring Clean, you may have a lot of stuff to clear out that would be a shame to just send to landfill. The old mantra, reduce, reuse, recycle comes in handy here. If there are things that can be reused that would be the approach. The Re Source www.myresource.org.uk/donate.html in Bodmin is good for furniture, and the Freecycle organisation is great for other things, https://




