

Robert Henry Chadband

Private 5613872, 30th Battalion Devonshire Regiment

Died April 9th 1943, aged 35

Memorial at St Endellion Churchyard

Son of Thomas and Mary Elizabeth Chadband;

husband of Florence Ethel Jane Chadband, of Wadebridge



Thomas Chadband was also in the Devonshire Regiment and was killed in the First World War at the Battle of Arras in 1917. His son, Robert Henry Chadband, is an uncle to Alan Chadband.

30th Battalion Devonshire Regiment was formed in 1941 from the 10th (Home Defence) Battalion. 30th Battalion spent a year at Torquay, then moved to Kingsbridge, Falmouth and St Marys, Isles of Scilly, before returning to Falmouth where they stayed until April 1945.



Private Robert Henry Chadband died at the Ministry of Pensions Headland Hospital in Newquay. The death certificate records the cause of death as Hypertension Heart Failure and Chronic Nephritis (*inflammation of the kidneys*). His address was given as 3 Ball Terrace in Wadebridge. He is buried in St Endellion Churchyard.
