It is all too easy to forget, even take for granted, the wonderful scenery which is the main attraction of this part of Cornwall. Occasionally it is worth taking a ride on the bus into Wadebridge. Sitting high up behind large windows you can survey the landscape for miles around and get the most splendid views of all. Driving along in a car, all you can see are the hedgerows and the car in front, with an occasional tantalising glimpse of scenery through a gateway or when you go over the top of a hill. It may be quick and convenient, but it is a relatively monotonous way of getting from A to B. It can also be nerve-racking!

On the Monday bus, for example, you get revealing views across Port Gaverne Valley to Tregaverne Farm, Trewethart, and Treore standing against a green background of hills. This bus then goes along to Pendoggett, back down the road to St. Kew, over the bridge, round to go through the water-splash (when it isn't too deep, that is!) and along the road that takes the ridge of the hill beyond the school. It is actually quite difficult to work out the various groups of buildings you can see from this high vantage point - Trevathan and Treswarrow for example. Finally through Trewethern and Chapel Amble, up to Three Holes Cross where you get glimpses of the distant Camel Estuary, then down the A39 into Wadebridge. And all for a mere 45p!


