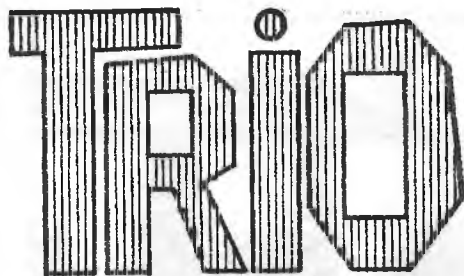

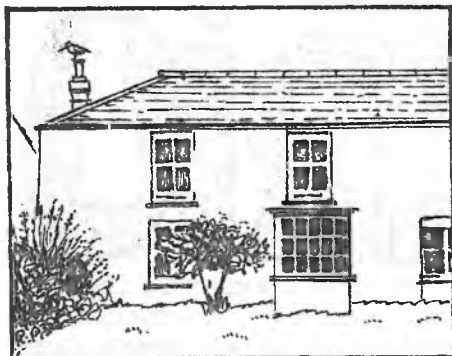

PARISH COUNCIL

Among other items discussed at the December meeting were the following.

It was decided to levy a 2p Parish Rate for the financial year 1985/86.

A supplier from Padstow was present to advise on Playground Equipment. Mrs. Benz asked permission to say that a charity might help with money.

Plans to waymark some paths, and the possible development of 'Recreation' paths with help from the Manpower Services, were discussed. It was agreed that liaison with St. Kew Parish would be necessary in one case. Problems with the path to the millpool, Port Isaac, destroyed by pigs, plus obstructions placed on the Watsons' drive came under discussion.

Dr. Barron pointed out that a new Transport Bill is due in 1985, and Mr. Symons spoke of the future needs at Trelights with its new houses.

Mrs. Cann reported that the new headmaster at Port Isaac Primary School is Mr. Bruce from Callington.

Plans for two bungalows, plots 5 and 6 Trelights, Mr. Dawe, were not commented on.

Notes of the Monthly Meeting, Trelights, 14th. January.

Finance. £2000 remaining in precept to be withdrawn. £500 to be used for expenditure, and £1,500 added to deposits of £1,600 (including interest) for use on the tennis courts, play-field equipment, village hall, etc.

Playing Field Equipment.

Mrs. Regler and Mrs. Benz had made suggestions regarding suitable items and a meeting of the full Playing Field Committee, which includes a representative from the school, is to be called. Items could cost over £1100 and it is hoped to make the area a welcoming enclosure.

Car Park Display Board. A map to be painted by a Port Isaac signwriter from a 'Blackthorn' design was approved.

It was felt that a scheme to sponsor improvements to the access to public buildings by the disabled would be of use to the Village Hall.

No action taken on an appeal for funds for Ethiopia as more help will be needed later on.

Footpaths. Mr. and Mrs. Watson, Port Isaac Mill, have agreed to work being done by the Manpower Services Commission on their land. The field containing the pigs is to be grassed over. A letter from Miss Greaves said that trees have fallen in Port Gaverne Valley. Mr. Welton reported that the M.S.C. are looking at the path. Mr. Bolton called for some 'decent' stepping stones at the place where the stream is crossed.

The curb where somebody fell last month at Hartland Road, has now been repaired.

Planning:

Mr. Julian Brown, Middle Street, Port Isaac, New House on site of existing garage/store. No observations as long as it is strictly in keeping with the requirements of the conservation area (slate roof, etc.).

Perhaps the Parish Council could explore, with the farmers concerned, possible compromises which would protect the path while not hindering the daily work of the farm.

RECIPE

Burgundy Beef Casserole (for 6)
Sauté 1 med chopped onion in
2 tblsp oil or dripping till soft.
Add 1 lb coarse beef mince
and 1 med diced green pepper.
When greyish, add 8 oz tomato
paste and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup red wine. Let
it bubble then stir in 1 cup of
cornflour and mix well. Add
1 cup sweetcorn, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup grated
cheese, salt, pepper, and chili
powder (optional). Beat 2 eggs
lightly, remove mixture from
stove and fold the eggs into it.
Pour into a flattish pie dish
and grate 1 oz of cheese on top.
Bake at 350° till golden - not
brown. Remove from oven
about ten min before serving to
set slightly. Serve with fresh
warm rolls and a side salad of
shredded lettuce, green peppers,
celery, and cress.
