Notes of the monthly meeting, Port Isaac, Monday, 11th March.

Mr. Cunningham asked for it to be pointed out that there was a misunderstanding about loans for the Tennis Club from Lloyds Bank - they aren't interest free.

Annual Parish Meeting.
Several speakers, from Housing,
National Trust, Police, and
County Cllr. Lander, have accepted invitations to attend.

Playing Field Equipment.
With any luck the Wendy House will be installed by Easter.
A quotation of £284.18 for new swing seats, chains, etc., was accepted.

Footpaths. The Footpath Committee are to go ahead with the plan to waymark certain paths. Mr. Welton said that after some delay, the County Council had given approval for the work on the 'Reacreational' paths, but stile-, gate-, and bridge work is the responsibility of Highways. Tenders for Footpath Clearance to be advertised as usual and at the same time tenders for repainting the seats. Mr. Provis suggested that the Fish Cellars notice board be included.

Seat - New Road/Back Hill.
Installation of a new seat also to be included in the seat-painting tender advertisement.
Mr. Provis asked whether a seat should be placed on the highway by the telephone box in Church Hill. Mr. Cunningham will verify this with the police. Meanwhile Mr. Norris proposed a narrow bench seat at the site, seconded by Cllr. Dawe.

Tennis Court. Mrs. Willmott, Clerk to the Council, noted that the quotation for the court had risen from £9280 to £9720.

Bus Shelter - St. Endellion.
Cllr. Dawe said there is a group of young people prepared to build a shelter on a voluntary basis if a Jubilee Fund grant application could be sent in within ten days. Mr. Welton pointed out that a planning application would have to be made. Cllr. Dawe felt that if the Parish Council would offer a grant towards the project there

might be a better chance of a grant from the Jubilee Fund. Mr. Cunningham enquired what the cost of materials was likely to be, but Clir. Dawe was not able to answer this. When Mr. Cunningham suggested £50 from the Parish Council, Cllr. Dawe replied 'Peanuts! You never want to spend any money on us folk up to Trelights.' Dr. Barron asked if a committee had been formed, and it was decided that until there was a proper organiation no money could be granted, but that a grant would be made if the scheme goes ahead.

Village Hall. A letter of thanks from the Committee thanking the Council for allowing the Hall to use the £250 grant without further grant aid from the North Cornwall District Council. Mr. Welton presented the annual accounts for the Hall.

Light - Trewetha Lane. If a light was installed on the existing pole, N.C.D.C. would pay for the electricity and maintenance. S.W.E.B. to be asked to quote for the installation.

Community Projects for the Disabled representative, Mr. Harris, had visited the Village Hall and said that it would be perfectly feasible for a digger to excavate a path at the side of the Hall to provide slope to the side entrance, and he will be happy to do this.

No Parking Zone - Church Hill.

Mr Provis asked if the zone
could be extended to the top of
the hill to prevent the problem
of cars parking adjacent to
'Hillcrest'. The possibility is to
be investigated.

Footpath Work, Pinehaven.
Mr. Provis asked if the Clerk
could find out what exactly was
being done as the excavations
for the new path looked more
like a motorway than a path.

#### RECIPE

Bread and Butter Pudding (Luxury Version)

Cut a bunloaf into thick slices and butter them. You can use four or five spice buns or current buns but this costs a lot more. Arrange the slices in a deep pie dish. Beat two eggs, then add 1 pint of milk and three tablespoonsful of white sugar. Mix well and pour over the bread slices.

Bake at 350° for about 3/4 of an hour, or until golden brown. Remove from the oven and spread some apricot jam on the top. Return to the oven for a few minutes so that the jam melts a little. Serve warm, with cream.

To make this recipe into a 'Queen's Pudding', beat the whites of two eggs until very stiff, fold in some sugar, and use this meringue mixture to cover the pudding. Bake until it is golden brown.



### PORT ISAAC ROAD STATION

How many people can remember when Port Isaac still had its own railway station? Opened in June 1895 and closed in October 1966. A mere 3½ miles away, perched 400 feet above sea level and in St. Kew Parish actually, near to Trelill. It was the direct link to Launceston, Okehampton, Exeter, and Waterloo in one direction -Wadebridge and Padstow

in the other. Until 1965 there were


steam trains, but in the last two years local trains consisting of the comparatively modern diesel 'multiple-units' were used.

The train in my picture is the Padstow to Exeter afternoon one usually called 'The Perisher' for the 'Perishable Goods', it had a van full of fish from Padstow at the rear!

More familiar to holidaymakers was the 'Atlantic Coast Express' from Waterloo. In later years it was driven by streamlined 'West of England' class locomotives.

The venerable engine shown is a 'T9' class 4-4-0, built 1899 in Glasgow, stabled at the Exmouth Junction shed in the 1940's an withdrawn in June 1961.

The station buildings and yard are now the premises of Messrs. W.T.Tucker & Sons.
