A total of £90 was raised and thanks are given to all who helped.


In response to many requests, another Crossword Competition will be run in the Autumn.

## PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the monthly meeting held on Monday 15th. April, at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

### Minutes - Matters Arising:

Waymarking. Permission has been obtained from the land-owners affected. Mr. Sloman is in favour of the scheme. Mr. Watson, Port Isaac Mill, and Cllr. Dawe, Pennant, will put the signs up themselves.

Seat - New Road. Several comments were made about the appearance and smallness of the new seat, but now it has been installed it must stay as it is.

Seat - Church Hill. County Highways don't think permission was ever officially given for the previous seat. The matter will be discussed at the next monthly meeting.

Rates. The Council was surprised to learn that a 1.7p parish rate was to be levied instead of the 2p they had asked for. It seems, however, that the District Council still have 'something in the kitty' which will make the budget up to the 2p. level.

St. Endellion Churchyard Fund. Dr. Barron proposed that the annual grant to the Churchyard Fund should be increased from £275 to £300. This was seconded by Mr. Norris, and carried.

Village Hall. Estimates for work to improve the hall were read. About £700 would be needed to renovate the toilets, install a hot water system, and finish the plastering work not done by the MSC scheme. Cllr. Dawe pointed out that a lot of hard work had been done by various committees over the last 12 years and that they had

not had much financial aid from the Parish Council. 'The village is privileged to have such a hall', he said, 'it is for the benefit of all the community.' Mr. Norris added that there is always the chance that one day we could lose the Church Hall. 'We lost our vicarage,' said Mrs. Cann. Finally it was decided to wait until the hall committee came forward with the actual amount that would be needed, and a grant might be made then.

### Seat Painting.

In response to advertisements for tenders, one only was received from Mr. J. H. Sweet, at £9.50 per seat for preparing, primer, undercoat, and gloss. Mr. Bolton proposed that the tender be accepted. This was seconded by Cllr. Dawe, and carried. A letter of thanks is to be sent to Mr. Julian in appreciation of all his work on behalf of the Council.

Litter Notices. The usual notice to be distributed to the holiday cottages in the village.

Historic Buildings. The Dept. of the Environment is soon to carry out a re-survey of all buildings that might be eligible for 'listing' as of outstanding historical or architectural interest. The owners will be informed during the next few months.

### Footpath 35, St. Endellion.

A letter from Mr. Penna, saying that if an MSC scheme is going to improve the path down from Trewetha to the the Millpool, then work should be done to restore and improve the section between the pool and Port Isaac Mill itself.

### Drain under Playing Field.

Mr. Bolton proposed that the District Council be granted

permission to do this work, required to drain surface water from the new Telephone Exchange. Seconded by Mr. Symons and carried.

### Unsafe Cliff, Port Gaverne.

A large area of the cliff face above the old quay is unstable. It was decided that remedial work would be very skilled and that expert advice should be sought. It was thought that Bodmin Fire Brigade could be asked to wash down the loose soil with their hosepipes, or that someone from Delabole (or De Lank) quarry could be asked for advice. These solutions are to be considered if there is no reply to a letter which is to be sent to the County Council.

### St. Endellion Festival - Parking.

Mr. Symons expressed fear that there would be an accident if better arrangements were not






Where to from here?

## RECIPE

### Chicken Romana

Put 4 Chicken Quarters in a paper bag containing salt-and-peppered flour, and shake until they are coated. Melt 2 tbsps. butter with 1/2 cup cooking or olive oil. Sauté the chicken until lightly browned. Add 1/2 clove of garlic, minced, 1 tbsp. rosemary, and 1 1/2 tbsps. salt. Sauté further until golden brown. Add 1 tbsp. wine vinegar and 1/2 cup of chicken stock. Put into a casserole in a moderate oven for about 20 minutes. Serve with duchess potatoes, glazed carrots, and peas or any other green vegetable of your choice. A chilled white wine is a good accompaniment.
