PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the monthly meeting held on Monday 8th. July, at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

Finance

Money on deposit to be paid into the current account and £600 to be precepted to meet expenses. £282 VAT to be reclaimed. The Annual Audit showed everything to be in order.

Tennis Court

Progress continuing. The lease is being signed by the Trustees. The Car Boot Sale raised £60.

Toilets - Port Gaverne Plans to install 2 wc's and a urinal in the courtyard of the old 'Loveday Carew' fish cellars were discussed. These are to be sent to the National Trust, owners of the site, but Mr. Norris expressed doubts that they would be favourably received as members of the public are not usually allowed inside the yard. There might be some N.C.D.C money for the project next year. Mr. Scawin's remarks, guoted in the 'Cornish Guardian' recently, were said to be incorrect.

Light - Trewetha Lane Residents of the Council Houses want some kind of light to help reduce night-time burglaries. Over the last 12 months, coal, logs, and garden tools have been stolen. The police would support the idea of an allnight light, as already in use at Mayfield Road. Mr. Provis said that petty thieving has been going on for years. The Council is to get a price for a light and discuss at the next monthly meeting.

Notice Boards

The owners of Homer Park

Hotel would like to put a sign directing the public to their hotel on the Parish Council board at the Fish Cellars, Port Isaac. The idea was defeated by a vote of 7 to 1 against it. The Clerk was also instructed to remove any trade notices from the board at the car park, this is to be used to announce events only.

Rubbish - Cartway Cove

Building rubbish, plastic sacks, etc. being thrown down in spite of sign to forbid the practice. Police not able to act as it happens in the small hours of the night. It was suggested that the Fire Brigade be asked to come out in the autumn and hose it all down.

Handrail - Teague's Pit

The chain is broken and some new posts are needed. John Sweet to be asked for a price to do the work. Mr. Norris felt that there should be a handrail, not a chain, and that it should be nearer the path.

Bus Shelter - St. Endellion The 'Jubilee Fund' has provided £120 so far, and £465 is needed altogether. Cllr. Dawe is not happy about plans supplied from Truro, building should be block, stone, and slate roof. County Council unlikely to give grant for use of school children only, Port Isaac or Trelights would therefore be more suitable. Mrs. Cann asked why the children have to cross the main road. If they didn't have to, theyt could shelter in the church porch. The whole matter to be discussed at the next monthly meeting to be held at Trelights when interested

Change of Use - Shops No reply from Planning Dept. regarding Parish Council enquiry about a fish shop and a charity shop. Mr. Welton has received complaints about the latter not being 'in keeping'.

Correspondence

Estimates of £55 for new notice board at Trelights, and £50 to repair, repaint, and replace gutter on bus shelter at Port Isaac, were received from John Sweet. Dr. Barron felt that the price for the notice board was too low for a decent one, but Mr. Cunningham said that some of the material from the old board would probably be used. The board will be sited in front of the bushes on the piece of and at Mr. Barriball's shop.

A 'wet paint' sign removed by a mischief maker from a seat at Little Hill, caused a visitor to complain of paint on a dress. The Council are to investigate whether the insurance company covers this situation.

The roads in Trelights, and Church Hill, are to be patched or to possible re-surfacing later on. The cobbled section of Church Hill will not be covered over. 'Accident Black Spot' signs which were to be considered, are not standard, so cannot be authorised by the Highways Department.

Permission was granted for the Lions Club to use the Playing Field for a 'Donkey Derby' on Tuesday 30th. July, with stalls and a barbecue. The Lions Club take 10% of profits to cover their expenses.

The footpath along Port Gaverne Valley is being used a lot now and a letter from Mr. Penna asked if a very obstructed stile could be improved, and better stepping stones provided where needed. The Highways Dept. to be asked to do this work.

Plans

Mr. Sherratt, Port Isaac: Demolish annexe and erect an extension, Fairholme Guest House. P.C. observation -'A great improvement'.

Mrs. McCrohon, Port Isaac: Erection of extension to Drakes Cottage. P.C. observations -'overdevelopment and dislike of flat roofs in Conservation Area'.

Next Monthly Meeting: Monday 12th. August, 7.30pm. Church Rooms, Port Isaac. Next meeting at Trelights will be in September.



RECIPE

Smothered Steak (for one)

6oz chuck steak, 1 onion, l green pepper, stick of celery, small tin of peeled tomatoes. 1 stock cube, and 4pt hot water. For the seasoning: oregano, a little thyme, basil, sugar, salt and pepper.

Coat the steak with flour and fry in oil and butter until brown. Transfer to a baking dish. Finely chop the onion, pepper, and celery and fry first the onion, then the peppers and celerv, and add the tomatoes last of all which can be cut up in the pan. Add the stock cube dissolved in the hot water, and stir in. Season with the herbs, etc., to taste. Pour this mixture around the

steak and put, uncovered, into a hot oven (350°F) to cook for $1 - 1\frac{1}{2}hrs.$

Maintain the level of the liquid by adding a little wine from time to time.

I'm glad so many people tried the walk up Port Isaac Valley to St. Kew, but sorry that some got a bit lost on the way Here is an attempt to describe the walk, in more detail than was possible last time, with a map of the section that caused all the trouble. It's a little bit squashed in as there isn't a lot of room in a 'Trio' column. Have a good walk.

Leave Church Hill, follow path along brake, through gate, pass sewage works on your left, cross field through wooden gate by ruined barn. through mill yard (between mill-house and other buildings). Up track to little wooden gate in fence on your left. Across field (along bank of former mill-race) down bank to fork at old millpool (path over little bridge, left, leads to lane up to Trewetha). Take right fork alongside the old pool-sometimes very muddy! - cross stone stile with pieces of wood on top, then straight along till gateway. Veer sharp right here, don't go through, and follow path along top of bank, over dilapidated stile, along sloping path past old orchard (private) and out int large sloping fieldcalled 'Fuzzy [gorsy] Parc'. Look for footbridge under trees on left. Cross, turn right, and walk along the lower edges of four fields. In the last one walk diagonally to trees at top on further side, through three gates into Tresungers farmyard. Straight past front of house and along track up to the B.3314 road.

WE GO ELECTRONIC

A new electronic exchange manufactured by STC and installed and commissioned by local British Telecom staff at a cost of approximately £413,000 was opened at 7am., Wednesday 3rd. July, at Port Isaac.

In the 1920's subscribers were served by switchboard operators. In 1939 the automatic exchange was installed but long distance 'trunk' calls were connected by operators at Wadebridge. From May 1964 Wadebridge went automatic and trunk calls were connected by Bodmin operators until Subscriber Trunk Dialling (STD) was introduced in 1972/3.

The new exchange has been provided as part of British Telecom's modernisation policy, to cater for growth in the telephone network and to ensure that rural communities enjoy the same benefits as are available in the larger cities.

All our numbers have now become 6-digit 'Bodmin' ones by prefixing with '880', e.g. 'Port Isaac' 299 becomes 'Bodmin' 880299.

The area code for calls made from other parts of the country is shortened to '0208'.

Most of the local codes have also changed and we give you a list below, taken from Table one, page 14, of the 'Phone Book'. We have been very careful to get these right but can't accept responsibility for any errors!


