
### Poppy Appeal

## PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the monthly meeting held on Monday 16th. September, at Trelights Chapel Hall.

### Footpaths

All the cards indicating completion of trimming the paths have been returned and the final payments made.

### North Cornwall Publicity

Cllr. Dawe pointed out that everyone benefits from tourism. Request for financial support towards a leaflet describing our area for insertion in the T.A.N.C. guide to be considered at the next meeting after consultation with other parties.

### Bus Shelter - St. Endellion

Letter from young people of St. Endellion asking for the bus shelter 'we can't all fit into the telephone box when it is raining'. £465 needed towards cost, but the shelter would be used every schoolday, and Trelights village have their own plans for a shelter. Mrs. Cann expressed concern about children having to cross road but 'safer in the long run than a bus stop on the blind corner' said P.C. Le Bailly, when asked. Mr. Norris proposed that the financial support be given in the next financial year. This was seconded by Mr. Provis and carried, with one dissension.

### Allocation of Council Houses

Even after consultation with the Parish Council, somebody was allocated a house 'out of the blue'. The public also had

knowledge of the allocation before official announcements. The Parish Council is angry and feels that there must be a 'mole' in the Housing Dept.

### New Telephone System

A letter to be sent to British Telecom reporting many complaints of crossed lines, lack of dialling tone, and phones not ringing when callers connected.

### Surface of Coastal Path

A complaint that the tarmac area for the car park is causing deep furrows with puddles, and making the path impassable. A letter to be sent to County Highways asking for a remedy and also whether other bad patches could be improved.

### Spider Crabs in Harbour

Visitors at Port Gaverne have complained about half-dead crabs flapping around on the beach. 'It is not very nice for the kids to see them.' A number of fishermen were present, and a spokesman said that they regretted the occurrence which was due to a different buyer who threw rejects on the beach. They will try to put them back in the sea.

### Port Gaverne Beach

A reply, explaining that the debris on the beach is mainly brought in by wind and tides, to be sent to a visitor who has said that 'Trebarwith Strand is far superior.'

### Home Security Scheme

Notices will be put up about a scheme to advise people how to make their homes more secure.

### Toilets - Port Gaverne

Suggestion from N.C.D.C. that a 'unisex facility' be provided as proposed internal layout not

giving enough screening to the female conveniences.

### Car Port - Rose Hill

A letter from Revd. Dunford to say that there is 'grave risk to life and limb to residents and children using the hill on the way to school' from cars using the car port. The application at 'Harbour Heights' (higher up) was vetoed for this reason. Another letter, from Mrs. Townsend, expressed deep concern about more traffic on the hill where children race up and down.

Mr. Cunningham, Chairman, had enquired about 'planning' only to learn that the car port was 'within a curtilage not on a trunk or classified road' and that it complied with the Conservation Order, but the Planning Committee were trying to have the bollard fixed permanently in position. Mr. Provis complained that there was uproar when a window was

The meeting felt that Rose Hill is too narrow for traffic; everyone is now entitled to have a car port and the whole area will be spoiled. It was decided to put proposals asking for the hill to be closed to traffic from the sewage works gate downwards.

Mr. Ross, Port Gaverne Hotel, Change from 7 Holiday Cottages and Licensed Bar to 6 Holiday Cottages, Resiting Bar, and Recreation Area (Green Door).

#### Public Discussion

Mr. Provis asked when Trelights or St. Endellion had been 'pushed to one side' as he was tired of hearing 'digs' to that effect.

'It is St. Endellion Parish Council not Port Isaac Parish Council.'

Mrs. Townsend said that Port Isaac Singers had distributed leaflets in Brittany only to get back home and find what had

happened to the village. She pressed for the re-formation of the Conservation Group through the Parish Council. Mrs. Cann thought that a separate body might be more effective. The whole matter is to be discussed at next month's meeting. Will the public please write to the Parish Council with any ideas about the scheme. 'Let us have letters', said Mr. Cunningham.


#### ANNUAL HARVEST FESTIVAL HELD AT LONGCROSS HOTEL

## RECIPE

### Fred's Meat Sauce

Suitable for use with pasta  
dishes, lasagne, etc.

1lb. steak mince,  
14oz. tinned tomatoes, cut up,  
½lb. chopped onions,  
1 med. green pepper, chopped,  
¼lb. sliced mushrooms (optional),  
1 beef stock cube,  
1 clove (or more) finely chopped  
garlic,  
½ tsp. each: oregano, thyme,  
parsley, and basil.

Fry the onions in vegetable oil,  
add the mince, and cook until  
grey. Remove from stove and  
strain to get rid of the oil.  
Place in a saucepan, add peppers,  
tomatoes, stock cube, ½ pint  
water, herbs, salt and pepper to  
taste, and **simmer** for about 1½ -  
2 hours (until it 'caramelises').

For lasagne use tagliatelle, it  
has much more flavour and  
cooks much more quickly.
