

PARISH COUNCIL

Notes taken at the monthly meeting at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 9th. June.

Financial Statement

After deductions for the month, a balance of £347.92 is left in the current account and £717.69 in the deposit account.

Donation for Trio

Cllr. Dawe proposed that this be increased to £75, seconded by Mr. Bolton and carried.

Donation to Village Hall

Mr. Welton outlined the position in connection with the loss of the Entertainments Licence, and said that £4,000 would be needed for the building materials for necessary improvements. It was hoped to use an M.S.C. scheme to carry out the work. Cornwall County Council had set aside £1000 grant funds for the work and there is a fair chance of a similar grant by North Cornwall District Council after estimates have been submitted to them. Meanwhile fund raising efforts have got well under way. Mrs. Cann expressed concern that other halls in the area could be affected by the same regulations and had made enquiries to the District Council who told her that the number of toilets stipulated is only a recommendation and not mandatory therefore the Hall will get a licence and be given 18 months to do the work. Mrs. Coates who was present as a member of the public was asked to clarify the situation and replied that a licence had since been issued but the Hall was not to be used while work was in progress and this to be complete by 1st. April 1987.

It was finally decided to donate £500 now plus some more later on. It was also arranged that the Parish Council should buy the materials and get back the VAT.

Road Sign 'Trewetha'

Mrs. Cann proposed that this sign be put up on the B.3314 at Port Isaac Turn, seconded by Mrs. Richards and carried.

Tennis Court Report

A new estimate had been asked for but the cost would still be £9000 for the courts. £2000 is 2 still needed and organisations are being asked for donations. The secretary, Mrs. Pavitt, has had to give up and somebody is needed to replace her.

Approval of Footpath Tenders Tenders for clearing work were accepted as follows: Mr. Watson £40 for path from Church Hill to the Mill, and J.M.Dawe £270 for all the other paths, plus £30 for clearing around seats. Clir. Dawe declared an interest in the second tender.

Inspection of Footpath Clearing Councillors were appointed to walk footpaths and inspect them after the clearing work is done.

Parking - Trewetha Lane

Reports of large vans parking and restricting access to houses and visibility were received. Problem to be mentioned to Community Constable LeBailly.

Street Cleaning - Port Isaac Complaints were received that the work is not being done properly by the new cleaner, due, apparently, to lack of instruction. Mr. Cunningham has encouraged some shopkeepers to put litter bins on their premises to try and keep the problem of litter to a minimum.

Correspondence

It was reported that the reason the farmer at Pendoggett had a change of mind about allowing walkers to use an alternative route across his land adjacent to Pendoggett Farm, was that the privilege had been abused by some people whose dog had been allowed to chase the sheep. Mr. Symons pointed out that it is now illegal to have a dog not on a lead in a field where there are sheep.

Permission was given to the Village Hall Committee to hold a 'Country Fayre' at the Playing Field on Wednesday 20th. August.

A suggestion for a notice board in Trewetha Lane is to be put on the agenda for next month.

Port Isaac School Headmaster, Mr. Bruce, has agreed to join the Playing Field Committee.

Planning

Peter Richards Farms (Cornwall) Ltd. - replacement of old agricultural buildings with one new agricultural building, Treore - no observations.

Mr. Dawson - use of asbestos slates on 'Old Vicarage' on side facing Margaret's Lane (not on front elevation or roof) due to difficulty of getting Delabole slate - accepted.

Public Discussion

Mrs. McCrohon asked if the Parish Council was aware that a. site meeting had been held in Rose Hill and that interested parties had not been informed. This is to be investigated. Mrs. Carney pointed out that if Rose Hill was closed to traffic it would make it difficult for coal to be delivered to the top of Dolphin Street as well.

Mr. Lobb, Trelights, complained that the streets there were only cleaned once in six months. Mr. Symons suggested this might be included in a letter to the District Council.

Mr. Rotherham, Trelights, asked who cut the grass in Coronation Park and was told that there is a management committee but as the park has been taken over by



the Parish Council they will discuss at the next meeting the possibility of paying towards it.

The public were asked to leave at this stage for a private meeting of the Council with Ms. Richmond, National Agricultural Centre Rural Trust.
