#### ROSE HILL

We understand that Cornwall County Council has posed the hypothetical question to the Secretary of State for the Environment as to whether it would be possible to close the road to vehicular traffic or not. MP Gerry Neale has been asked to keep residents informed on the situation.

#### ROAD SIGN

Cornwall County Highways Dept. is considering the possibility of putting up a 'directional' type of sign for drivers entering the village on the B.3267. This would indicate the routes down to the harbour, the no-entry roads, car park, Port Gaverne, etc.

### MIDSUMMER MADNESS




