



COMMUNITY POLICE

As most will be aware, the wait-September. However, as the result of complaints relating to obstructions and parking on footpaths, particularly in the Fore Street area, some police action will be taken this winter. In this respect, recent legislation the fixed penalty system will provide an easier and more immediate remedy for the existing problems. Offences such as obstruction and parking on the footpath can now be dealt with in this manner, and should these offences come to light they will be dealt with in this way. The legislation provides for penalties of £12 and £24 depending on the class of offence. Failure to pay the penalty will result in an automatic 50% increase.

Your assistance in the prevention of such matters is requested, and please bear in mind the nature of the access to the lower part of the village, should there be a fire, what could happen? How would the fire brigade get access? particularly with inconsiderately parked vehicles. Could you live with yourself if your parking resulted in loss of life? Not only the fire brigade, think of the ambulance.

NEW BUS SERVICES

With the implementation of new Transport Acts, anyone can now run bus services where and when they like. Unfortunately, routes in this area are not profitable and nobody has offered to run any buses here. To ensure that services are provided, however, County Hall are to support certain routes and have asked contractors to tender for these. Prout Bros, submitted the lowest tender for the route from Port Isaac to Wadebridge via Polzeath and Rock, including in fact, more buses than the minimum required by County Hall, and a copy of the timetable is inserted in this issue of Trio, courtesy of Trelawney Garage. The new service replaces the old one and we shall now have four buses in each direction for six days a week including Saturday. So that Port Isaac passengers won't be penalised for the extra mileage involved, the single fare to Wadebridge will be 60p. only - fares from Polzeath onwards starting at 55p. Pupils who want to travel to Wadebridge school can do so but must pay the normal fares. School buses to Camelford are not affected by the changes, but the Monday bus to Wadebridge via St. Kew has been withdrawn. The Thursday coach to Plymouth will run as at present until further notice.
