TELEVISION AERIAL

The new television relay station will shortly bring good reception to about 300 people in Port Isaac. It is being built jointly by the BBC and the IBA and is expected to open in a few weeks time. The channels to be used are:

Channel 55 BBC 1 South West Channel 59 Channel 4 Channel 62 BBC 2 Channel 65 ITV-TSW

Viewers with teletext receivers or adaptors will be able to obtain Ceefax on the BBC channels and Oracle on ITV and Channel 4.

To take advantage of the new service, viewers will need group C/D aerials, carefully fitted outdoors, and directed towards the new relay with the rods vertical. Aerials used for reception from other stations may be of the wrong group and, if so, should not be used for the new relay. The BBC and IBA do not recommend the use of settop aerials.

A few people living in Port Gaverne are not expected to benefit from the new station, due to the nature of the local terrain.

Viewers should consult their local dealer or aerial contractor, on how to make best use of the new service, but technical help is also available from:

PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled notes taken during the monthly meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 8th. February 1988.

Please note: The notes are made in the 'public gallery' where it is not always easy to follow the discussion, they may, therefore, contain inaccuracies. If you need exact information, you are advised to contact a Parish Councillor or the Clerk to the Council.

Parking in Fore Street

Only two comments were received from members of the public; one in favour of all-year parking restrictions, and one against. Mr. Dawe said that the police should take action when obstructions were caused. Mr. Stokes said the problems only occurred at Christmas and in the summer. Mr. Fisher (Spar Shop) was invited to comment and said that most Thursdays the police had to come from Launceston to make a way for the delivery vans to get through. Five of the delivery firms in fact now refuse to come to Port Isaac. It was decided to ask the police and Cornwall Highways Dept. for advice.

Annual Parish Meeting

This is to be held at the Church Rooms on Thursday 28th. April. Guest speakers are to be invited.

Bus Shelter

Consideration was given to the idea of using the bus shelter by the entrance to Church Rooms as an information kiosk. It was reported, however, that the shelter is still used by people waiting for the Trago Mills bus and also when jumble sales were on. The Council is to seek a price for repair work.

Port Gaverne Toilets

Tenders for the cleaning and opening of the toilets must be with the Council by 29th. February. The toilets will operate from 30th. March to 30th. September.

Playing Field Gates

A price for new gates has been received and was discussed in private at the end of the meeting.

Road - Treore Turn to China Downs The road was said to be covered with mud and Cornwall Highways Dept are to be asked to investigate.

Notice at The Main

A new 'no camping' notice in red and white to match the other notice at Cartway Cove is to be made to replace the old one which has disappeared.

Bollard, Rose Hill

The old bollard mysteriously reappeared the same night that it was reported missing. Cornwall Highways Dept. are prepared to make a replacement in future if necessary.

Street Lighting

A meeting was announced for 10th. February at which villagers of Trelights were invited to attend. In Port Isaac, there will not be a 'Victorian' lantern outside 'Pride of Place' as this would need an extra pole. Two new fittings are to be supplied on the private section of Roscarrock Hill, paid for by the Parish Council (£15 each). Mr. Couch was asked to speak and told the Council that 'Springside', Fore Street, which has 22 permanent residents, is now totally dark since the light was removed under

the new scheme. North Cornwall District Council are to be asked to deal with the problem. Mr. Norris pointed out that another private road, Lundy Road, had two lights in it.

Village Hall Grant

Mr. Welton reported that work is going on well at the Hall but that as it was nearly impossible to make bills for materials equal exactly £500, the Hall would prefer the grant in money form instead of materials.

Cornish Alternatives to Structure Plan C.A.S.P. a group seeking alternatives to the Plan which allows for 39,000 houses to be built in Cornwall over the next fourteen years, is to get the support of the Parish Council. As the population of Cornwall is expected to remain stable, the houses would only be occupied by people from outside the county. It was also pointed out that there were not enough jobs for all these people and that the road network was already not adequate for the present traffic.

Wadebridge Action for Swimming Pool Another group, W.A.S.P., are to receive a letter of support in their campaign for a much-needed swimming pool in Wadebridge. There is not to be a pool in the new sports complex apparently.

Sub Post Offices

Mr. Barriball (Trelights P.O.) said that M.P. Gerry Neale is to make a stand against proposals to reduce opening hours whenever a sub-postmaster resigns. He also felt sure that the locals would petition strongly if the opening hours were reduced.

Statement from the Chair

Mrs. Cann, Chairman, said that she had taken unkindly to the letter in Trio last month where the Parish Council was criticised for not using powers under the Local Government Acts 1976. 'We did all we could, and I also hope that it will be the last letter on the subject," she said. 'Meanwhile the the drain problems are being dealt with by Cornwall County Council.

Planning Application

Plans for change of use of barn and outbuildings at Trecreege Farm, without the previously planned 15-acre area for recreation, were represented. The Parish Council made no observations.

Public Discussion

Mr. Welton enquired about a 40' animal feed bin at Poltreworgey which seemed to be too near to the road.

Miss Hambly asked if some trees could

be planted at Trewetha.

Mrs. Brown asked if the Council knew who owns the land next to Trelights Chapel. Mr. Dawe replied that he would call it 'common land', and that Peter Blake ought to be congratulated for the way he has cared for it.

Mr. Stokes reported that the water in Port Isaac was like mud. South West Water Authority thought that this could have been caused by the violent weather and had now flushed out the main from the bottom of Church Hill and apparently cured the problem.

Mr. Lobb asked for a seat at Trelights to be discussed at the next meeting.

The public were asked to leave at the end of the meeting while the price of a new gate at the Playing Field was considered.

Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 14th. March, at 7.30pm. in the Chapel Room at Trelights.
