

## LIFEBOAT

On 1st. July, a commemorative shield was presented to Mr. Martin Taylor, proprietor of Rosedale Valley Caravan Park, Polzeath, and his team members Neil Standfield and Bill Dingle, regular entrants in the Four Legged Race. The team raised over £800 in sponsorship for last year's race; they asked that their prize, a meal for six, donated by Mr. and Mrs. Freddie Ross at the Port Gaverne Hotel, should be given to members of the Golden Circle, Port Isaac. Six members duly had a most enjoyable lunch on Tuesday 19th. July, and expressed their thanks to the winning team.

Wednesday 13th. July was the night Mr. and Mrs. Chris Harris held a barbecue at the Headlands Hotel in aid of the RNLI. The amount raised will be announced in the next issue of Trio, but in spite of a cool, windy night, with threatened rain, the even was clearly a success.

The lifeboat has been launched four times so far this month.

On Friday 1st. July, some windsurfers were reported stranded on rocks at Polzeath. Due to the conditions, the lifeboat was unable to get in to take them off, but stood by until all were safe.

Early on Saturday afternoon, 2nd. July, the lifeboat was launched following a report of a person in the sea at Hole Beach. Carrying out a search in heavy surf, the lifeboat capsized, and the crew were thrown into the water. A helicopter from RNAS Culdrose, and Padstow lifeboat responded immediately. Meanwhile the crew righted the boat and, after some difficulty, restarted the engine. The helicopter continued the search, in which nothing was found, and together with Padstow lifeboat escorted Port Isaac lifeboat back to the harbour.

Port Isaac lifeboat was then taken out of service while it was fully checked, and the incident reviewed. The boat was placed back on service that evening, with a new engine and replacements for a few minor items of equipment lost, all sent urgently from RNLI Headquarters at Poole. Crew members Neville Andrews, Andy Walton, and Nigel Andrews, who were not hurt, were commended by the Hon. Secretary, Mr. David Castle, for their competent handling of the incident.

On 10th. July the lifeboat was launched to aid a canoeist in difficulties at New Polzeath, and on 14th. July to seek a windsurfer overdue at Daymer Bay. In each case, the lifeboat searched until being recalled on information that the respective casualties had reached safety.

## PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public at the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 11th. July.

It was reported that the steps between Mayfield Road and Silvershell View have been repaired. It was not certain if work had been done yet to make the playing field equipment safe.

### Finance

With much expenditure to face - toilets at Port Gaverne, painting seats, etc., plus the cost of two by-elections, it was decided to raise a precept of £1,500.

### By-election

More than ten people in the parish have requested that there be an election. If the seat is contested, an election will be held on 11th. August.

### Fore Street, No Parking All Year

Mr. Savile of Cornwall County Highways has considered the possibility of a twelve-month parking restriction but says that to make this apply to Fore Street only would mean too many signs. The Council are to ask if the middle part of the village - Fore Street, Dolphin Street, Church Hill, Roscarrock Hill - could be considered instead.

### Vegetation, Little Hill

County Highways are to be asked if they can clear the growth on the cliff which is beginning to block the view of the harbour from 'Little Hill' (in front of the Post Office).

### Seats Along Cliff Path

Mrs. Cann said that the seats along the cliff path from the main car park were somewhat uncomfortable due to the angle of the slats at the back. Nothing is to be done about this immediately, the seats will be replaced eventually.

### Wall Along Cliff Path

Estimates have already been obtained for either placing new stones on the top of the wall (£580) or just making good (£380). The matter will be dealt with in the next financial year.

### School Bus - Trelights

Mr. Barriball reported that the school car is now full up and asked if the bus could call into the village. Mrs. Cann said that the car did not take pupils to the same school as the bus but would look into the situation anyway.

### Pump, Minepit Corner, Back Hill

Mr. Stokes said that the demolition work cannot start until after Mr. Dawe has completed his harvest as he will not have transport available until then.

### Footpath No. 32

The clerk reported that Mrs. Doney, Footpath Officer for the District, has seen the site near Burrow Park. She now needs the names and addresses of landowners on the proposed route.

### Northcliff, Listed Building

The owner of the house, on Roscarrock Hill, has asked if the Council could contact her at her London address if there are any worries about the building.

### Water Problem

Cllr. Henry Symons proposed that a letter be sent to South West Authority, to arrive with the Chairman in time for the meeting to be held on Wednesday, complaining about the lack of communication during the recent 'arid water' crisis.

### Planning Applications

Erection of Dwelling and Garage, Mr. B. Blake, Trelights. No observations were made except that the footpath crossing the site diagonally might have to be diverted.

Change of Use to Part of Launderette to Retail Shop, S. Crump & Partners, New Road. No observations were made against the application. It was thought that the work already carried out was an improvement to the existing sheds.

### Public Discussion

Mr. Philp, Mayfield Road, asked why he was the only person to receive a letter from the District Council about rubbish being dumped. Cllr. Symons said he would investigate the matter.

Mr. Penna asked if a suggestion might be included in the letter to S.W.W.A. that photocopied notices advising the public about any water crisis could be displayed on notice boards or even on the small water tankers that were installed about the village to provide clean water while the problem was being dealt with.

### Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 8th. August, at 7.30pm. in the Church Rooms at Port Isaac.

As there is some space to spare this month, we thought readers might be interested in the following excerpts from 'A War Diary' kept by Mrs. D. Penna while living here.

7th. October 1939

...The village has been affected in the way of loss of men as most of the male population down here are on the R.N.R. list and many have already gone. Fishing is therefore suffering - there being a lack of men to take out the boats.

6th. February 1940

... It is planned that the lovely Port Isaac Bay is to be utilised as a bombing practice range and a large tract of ground has been purchased to make a landing ground for aeroplanes. All fishermen sailing out from the Padstow district received notification that fishing was to be prohibi-

ted because of this and there was naturally enough quite a loud outcry against it. A protest meeting was held and a petition drafted to the local member of parliament.

30th. April 1940

... All the fishing has stopped now and most of the men have gone to work at the aerodrome. It seems such a pity that the West Coast fishing - which must be so valuable to us in these times - doesn't come in for more encouragement.

[In fact, fishing did continue, the boats including 'Boy Fletch', 'Willing Boys', 'A.L.B.', and 'Lilla' being taken out by the older men who were not eligible for call-up. They received notice of when target practice was due to take place and certain areas, indicated by buoys, had to be kept clear of. R.P.]
