CRICKET CLUB

In its first year, 12 games were played against local and touring teams. 'Home' matches being played at St. Minver. While we appreciate St. Minver's help last season, we feel that our Club can only grow and thrive if we have our own pitch and facilities, so creating our own pitch this year is top priority, before we seek league status in 1990. The site was a problem but Bill Dawe kindly offered a four year tenancy on part of a large, fairly-flat field. We now need: 350m of post and pig-mesh to secure the perimeter against cattle, 80m of post, electric mesh, and small power unit to protect the 'table' from sheep, a suitable gate for car park access, a double set of nets, pitch tending equipment, large cylinder mower (second-hand?), heavy roller, a building for changing rooms, tea room and pavilion, connected to power, water and sewage. We also need to prepare the surface - two strips at first, later turfing or seeding an area large enough for five wickets. There are already 18 paid-up Members (annual sub. £24) and fund-raising activities have raised £520. We have found suppliers of posts and netting at good prices and we have temporary use of equipment to level and prepare the pitch. This is the first time our area has had a cricket team and we don't compete with other teams for players.

The Club's diary is fairly full for the early season with games against local and touring teams for nearly every Sunday in May and June and we hope to publish details next month. We also have a date for your diary: Bingo, Tuesday 28th. March at the Church Rooms, 7.00 for 7.30pm. Old age and alcohol are taking toll of our lads and we are keen to find new Members for the coming season. There is a vigorous fitness test (if you can hold a bat and stand your ground - you're in), so, if you're interested, just let me know at The Wheelhouse (880226).

## PARISH COUNCIL

A report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public during the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 13th. February. The room was very crowded with many members of the public present.

Mr. Stokes had examined all notice boards and said they all needed cork backs. Answering a question, the Chairman said the board on the wall of the fish cellars was for use by the public as well.

### Port Isaac Cricket Club

In a letter, secretary Neil James asked for financial help with the cost of equipment, preparation of the pitch, and construction of a pavilion for their ground at Pennant Farm, kindly leased by Mr. Dawe who declared an interest. The council is heavily committed, however, so detailed costings were asked for so that assistance might be considered in the next financial year.

### Playing Fields Association

No donation is to be made to Cornwall County Playing Fields Association as new play-ground equipment, etc., here is usually funded, by local people.

### Annual Parish Meeting

This was fixed for Thursday 13th. April in the Church Rooms, starting at 7.30. Invited to attend and speak are representatives of the Planning Dept., Finance Dept., S.W.W.A., Environmental Health Dept., Heritage Coast Service, and the Police, also Cllr. Harvey Lander, and the County Footpath Officer for this district.

### Port Isaac Valley Footpath

Mr. Welton said the path doesn't exist any more, it is gone, decimated. Pigs have reduced it all to a sea of mud and the damage to the old millpool is 'criminal'. There have been complaints from visitors and local people. The local County Council Footpath Officer had not been well received by the landowners but if an agreement could be reached the County Highways Dept. had public money available to do some work, but not if it was all likely to be destroyed again. The council are to write to the owners and see if a meeting can be arranged to discuss the problem with them.

### Port Gaverne Toilets.

Mr. Bolton asked whether any ar-

rangements had been made for opening, cleaning, etc. and would they be open for Easter. N.C.D.C. to be asked for a reply to a letter about this, sent last year.

### New Bungalow in Conservation Area

New planning approval will have to be applied for this as the building has oversize, plastic-framed windows, contrary to recommendations for buildings in the Conservation Area. Mrs. Cann is arranging for a meeting, to talk the matter over, with the Chief Planning Officer at Bodmin. 'Everything and anything will be built before we know where we are,' she said.

### Roads and Footways, Trelights

Mr. Dawe asked why provision was being made for road improvements and pavements at the Furze Park extension but not from 'Chapel Villa' up to the new sites.

### County Council Centenary Service

Mrs. Cann will represent the Parish Council at the service in Truro Cathedral on Sunday 19th. March.

### Bodmin Postal Revisions

As far as this area is concerned, the changes are only to collection times but people should take note.

### New Street Lights

The three new lights are to be erected at Trelights by N.C.D.C. and maintained by the County Council. The light at 'Springside', Port Isaac should also be included in the same schedule.

### Descriptive Sign at B.3314

County Highways will not allow use of direction signs for information, but wording could be added to village nameplates. This, however, would not be at the right place.

### N.C.D.C. What's On Guide

Notice was received of the three issues of the guide: Mar-Jun, July-Aug, and Sept-Nov, to appear this year. Items for inclusion must be submitted about two months earlier.

### North Cornwall Heritage Coast Plan

A consultation document, to be circulated to all councillors.

### Old Boundary Wall

The old wall running alongside the drive to the former Coast Guard cottages is in a poor state of repair, and the Property Services Agency have said that although they don't own it, and providing adjacent landowners will pay, they are prepared to demolish it and put up

concrete posts with wire chain-link fencing instead. The council are to protest to P.S.A about this.

### Letter from Resident of Trelights

The council received an apology from Mrs. Peggy Haynes, newly resident in the village, for disturbance caused by a young member of the family riding his motorcycle up and down 'Endellion Lane'. Some residents were making trouble, however, because of the many animals, stray animals being cared for, at her property. There was dog mess in the Lane before, though, and she hoped she was not thought responsible for this. Mr. Barriball sympathised and said that she was doing a lot of good work. Mr. Dawe said that people were coming from urban areas and must adapt to rural ways. About 25 dogs use the Lane.

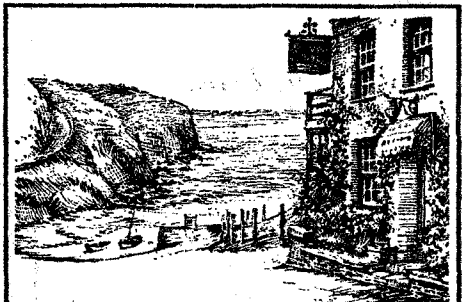

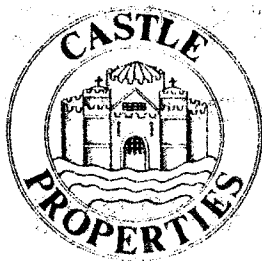
