

ST. ENDELLION MUSIC FESTIVAL

Variety and vitality were the keynotes of the concerts of the 31st. Summer Music Festival. Cambridge theologian, Canon Brian Hebblethwaite, was preacher at the Evensong on the 1st. August. The rector was celebrant and preacher at the Sunday Sung Eucharist, with 185 communicants, and the Rt. Revd. Richard Llewellyn was celebrant and preacher at the final Sung Eucharist on Friday 11th. August, with over 120 communicants. All concerts were well attended, and some concert-goers had to be turned away when the church was full. Richard Hickcox was main conductor with help from Stephen Clarke and Stephen Jackson. The major concert which included Brahms's violin concerto in D and the Mozart Requiem was repeated to great acclaim in Truro Cathedral.

On the Friends' Day, Sunday 27th. August, four years of hard work by the Friends of the Church culminated in the dedication by the Rt. Revd. Bishop Cartwright was celebrant at the Sung Eucharist and presided at the Annual Meeting of the Friends held in the Church Hall, and Canon Cooke, former rector of St. Columb, gave an interesting talk on the architecture of Cornish churches.

Port Isaac lifeboat crew won the Jug-O-War against a team from the Coastguard and allcomers.

The day raised a total of £656.

A total of £683 was raised on Port Isaac's Lifeboat Day on the 10th. August.

On the evening of 25th. July, the lifeboat was launched with crew members Neville Andrews, Bob Young, and Richard Hambly, to search for a possible missing person at Castle Cove, Tintagel. After a search, nothing was found, and the lifeboat returned to station.

Late the next evening, the lifeboat was launched in response to a Mayday call from the 9 ton yacht Christina, which had gone aground at Polzeath. Padstow lifeboat was also launched, and, after HM Coastguard team had reached the yacht and taken a line aboard, attempted to pull the yacht off without success. Port Isaac lifeboat, with crew members Neville Andrews, Richard Hambly, and John Collins, stood by in moderate surf, and was recalled when the attempts to refloat the yacht were abandoned, and the yacht's crew of five were safely ashore.
