A report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public during the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, Monday 9th. July.

Seat at Playing Fields

As the 'nameplate' on the old seat was carved into the wood of the back, this will be kept at home now by Mrs. Short. A new hardwood seat at a cost of £185 will replace the old seat, but this will only cost £155 if existing concrete ends can be used.

Flytipping Church Hill

The sites for refuse tipping are controlled by Cornwall County Council and enquiries are to be made to see if any action should be taken about rubbish being dumped in the quarry off Church Hill.

Donation to Trio

The Parish Council decided to make a £100 donation to the newsletter.

Donation for War Memorial

£30 is to be donated towards the cost of clearance at St. Peter's Church War Memorial.

Playing Fields - Notice Board
Councillors commented on the amount
of litter, etc. at the Playing
Fields and also that mothers were
sometimes seen with dogs when taking
their children to the playing area.
A notice is to be displayed to
prohibit anyone from taking a dog on
to the Playing Fields. Mr. Phelps
asked for a paragraph to be printed
in Trio about the situation.

Playing Fields - State of Car Park
Mr. Phelps said he had received

the area as this keeps them from using the street or the public car park but they should not be allowed to abuse the permission. Mr. Welton was in favour of a strongly worded letter, a 'last warning' that the permission would be withdrawn if there were any more complaints. Mr. Norris said that it is for the convenience of the public as much as for them and they will go elsewhere if stopped from using the car park. He felt that the fishermen were not being fair. It was suggested that Mr. Hooper, Secretary of Port Isaac Fishermen Ltd., should hold the key. Mark Dawe is to be asked if he can do something about the gatepost which is splitting. St. Endellion Church - Glebe Land

£100 for a surveyor was thought by some councillors to be money wellspent if a professional valuation put the price of the land lower than the price being asked. Mr. Welton said it is public money and we should behave responsibly. Others thought a surveyor to be unecessary but the idea was carried by a vote of 6 in favour to 3 against. Notice Board - Port Isaac Car Park A letter from Mr. Warrillow, Port Isaac and District Tourism Association, stated that the cost of the new board would be £180 and that P.I.D.T.A. would pay half of this. It is to be an 'open' public board but trade advertisements would be barred. Mr. Welton proposed that the idea be accepted but Mr. Warrillow should be asked to clarify any extra costs involved, e.g. cost of erection. Mr. Norris was told that the old board could be given to St. Peter's Church Hall who had no board at present.

Removal of Seat to The Main

Mr. Coulson had asked if the seat commemorating his wife's death could be moved to The Main. This was accepted and a site was suggested at a position near the beginning of The Main. Mr. Coulson is to be asked if he is prepared to meet the costs of removal.

Seat at Minepit Corner

Mrs. Richards said some of the elderly had asked for the return of the seat that used to be at Back Hill but which was destroyed by a lorry and had not been replaced due to the improvement of the pump how which, said Mr. Stokes, now contained a seat for two people. An item will be printed in Trio newsletter to ask if any one would like to donate a seat.

Visit to Delabole Fire Station
The Parish Council have been invited to see the fire station fully operational and a demonstration of the new equipment. This was thought a good idea and perhaps the public who attend the monthly Parish Council meetings might be invited as well. Mrs. Richards will report back next meeting with a date.

Drain at Minepit Corner

Mrs. Willmott, Clerk to the Council, has the matter in hand. Mrs. Richards said the drain had been inspected and that the road may be dug up for a few days while they located a blocked s-bend. Cllr. Symons said that Mr. Dodgeon of Cornwall County Highways had said that the drains in Port Isaac are antiquated and provisions are being made in next year's budget for the installation of larger ones.

Gypsy Count

As usual, the count of gypsies in the parish is - nil.

strange to the area are driving across in front of traffic leaving the village unaware of the sharp bend to the left. Mr. Phelps said there would be no danger if they got on with the scheme to improve the corners. Mr. Wherry, Cornwall County Highways, will provide a continuous white line, a bend sign, and possibly chevrons, as a temporary measure, and the main improvement will take place within twelve months.

e. The National Rivers Association are providing an emergency 24-hour 'Freefone' number 0800 378500 to enable the public to report pollution, dead fish, poaching, illegal abstraction of water, etc. but not complaints about the quality of the water supply.

It was mentioned that the cloudy water on 8th. July was due to a burst main at Pendoggett and that the water was at no time unfit to drink.

There were no applications for consideration by the Parish Council.

Public Discussion

Mr. Bolton, Chairman, said that during the discussion, which took place after the meeting was closed, the public were allowed to raise points of interest, and that councillors might reply to questions but that no decisions could be made and no minutes would be taken. Matters could, however, be put on the agendas of future meetings. Mrs. C. Richards reported on the activities of Port Isaac Playing Fields Action Group and details are given in a separate item in this edition of Trio. She asked Mr. Dawe whether he was in favour of their fund-raising and he replied that he most certainly was.

Miss D. Hambly asked if we could have new reflector posts at the approach to Coldstanton Corner from Poltreworgey.

Mrs. M. Dingle asked why the seat at Minepit Corner hadn't been replaced as soon as it was destroyed. The council thought this was due to the plans to improve the pump house but now realise that there should have been an insurance claim.

Mr. Penna thanked the Parish Council for the donation to Trio.
