PARISH COUNCIL

An unofficial report compiled from notes taken by a member of the public during the meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 13th. November. For official information, please refer to the Parish Council minutes.

Present were: Harold Barriball, Bill Dawe (District Cllr), Richard Hambly, Malcolm Lee (Treasurer), Bryan Nicholls, Jill O'Connor, David Phelps (Vice Chairman), David Philp, Mark Provis, Bryan Richards, and Henry Symons (Chairman).

No matters for discussion were raised by the public present.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

a. Approval was recommended for the renewal of permission for two dwellings at Port Gaverne Cottages, Dennis Knight.

b. Approval was recommended for erection of a garage at 9 Trewetha Lane, Trevor Grills.

c. No objections were raised for consent to display a directional sign on the Wadebridge to Delabole road (top of Gravelins Lane), Mrs. J. M. Cleave (Tregellist Farm).

GENERAL BUSINESS

Finance

It was agreed to transfer £500 from the high interest account to cover monthly expenses of £684.24. This will leave £45.30 in the current account and £3271.89 on deposit.

The same donation as last year, £100, will be made towards the cost of the fireworks at Port Gaverne. Trelights had no display this year.

A quotation in the sum of £65 + VAT was approved for a glass-fronted notice board on the post office wall for the Friends of Port Isaac School. The Parish Council will install the board but will not be responsible for its upkeep.

Bottle Bins

David Philp proposed that the bottle bins be re-sited at the bottom of the car park where the noise of collection at 6am. would be less of a disturbance to nearby residents and visitors. They are also somewhat unsightly. People will find them wherever they are, he said. Brian Nicholls suggested the Coach Park at the playing fields would be as good a place as any. David Phelps agreed that the bins were an eyesore but to put them at the playing fields was a horrendous idea as there were enough problems with rubbish there already. Bill Dawe expressed anxiety about broken glass near the children's playground. It was finally agreed to leave the bins where they are for the time being.

First and Last

Bill Dawe proposed, seconded by David Phelps, that the old building be put forward for listing as of historic importance. George Steer has offered to write a 'history' which will be provided to English Heritage, together with photographs and maps, for consideration.

Trelights Meetings

On a proposal by David Philp, seconded by Harold Barriball, it was agreed that the Council should meet at Trelights in February, June, and November in future.

Crime in the Parish

Brian Nicholls proposed that a letter be written to Devon and Cornwall Constabulary requesting foot surveillance. There are more robberies and burglaries than ever. A teenager who had stolen one of the lights off scaffolding in Fore Street claimed that he 'collected' lights, and couldn't tell the difference. On drugs, one girl when warned not to get involved with them at university had said that if she wanted any, she could get all she wanted in Port Isaac. One old lady is afraid to go out and has to bring her daughter down from London when her son is away. There is just one constable for the area from Wadebridge to Bude. The police car drives through the village without stopping and only visits after a burglary. Paul Tyler should be invited to come and tell us what the government is doing. The proposal was seconded by David Phelps and carried.

Councillors were urged to attend a meeting of the Police Liaison Group which was to be held in Bodmin on November 15th.

Jill O'Connor announced that she was about to start a youth club at the Church Rooms.

Trewetha Lane Traffic Calming

The application has once again been put on the waiting list for consideration. Malcolm Lee pointed out that the criteria had not been detailed as requested so another letter will have to be sent asking again for this information.

Coastal Path Steps

The proposal by David Phelps, seconded by Bill Dawe, that the steps be removed and the path reinstated, caused a lot of discussion about the merits of steps versus a slope for wheel chairs and baby buggies on the coast path. Henry Symons amended the proposal, seconded by David Philp, that wheel chair organisations should be consulted on what is required. The amendment was carried.

New Directional Signs

Malcolm Lee made a proposal that County Highways be asked to re-erect the sign, just before Tintagel Terrace, at a new position beyond the junction in order to avoid confusion, and the one opposite Penreal Estates to a position where it is not partially obscured by a telephone post as at present. He said the signs had been under consideration since 1991 - started by the parish council previous to the last one. *We don't need the signs, he said, but 250,000 visitors do, four out of five of whom have never been here before.* The Parish Council had also not been asked to advise on the siting of the signs. We certainly need the signs, said Richard Hambly and suggested that the Tintagel Terrace sign could have a short black stub added indicating the terrace. He agreed that the other sign was so small that you needed to get past the telephone post before you could read it. Brian Nicholls said, however, that walking down New Road he could see the sign from Cassie Saundry's. David Phelps proposed an amendment that a sticker be put on one sign, and that the other should have larger lettering and be cantilevered out towards the road. The amendment, which was seconded by Malcolm Lee, was carried.

District Councillor's Report

Bill Dawe said he had taken up the matter of the missing light in the telephone box at Mayfield. He had also reported that all the rubbish bins had been full on one occasion. The Champness development has been deferred until vetted by consultant architect Max Young, he added.

Chairman's Report

Henry Symons spoke of the meeting about the possibility of a new Mid-Cornwall Hospital at Bodmin and said that a steering committee has been set up. There is strong support from all the parishes in the area.

CLERK'S CORRESPONDENCE

a. An appeal is pending regarding the planning application for three dwellings at Glebe Farm.

b. Under 18's using the Wadebridge Sports Centre may get reduced rates if this will reduce the numbers of youths congregating in the streets. Jill O'Connor welcomed the idea but pointed out that there is no evening transport from Port Isaac to Wadebridge. The item is to be discussed at next month's meeting.

c. As the road through Trelights is well lighted a speed limit is automatically in force and steps will be taken to assess improvements needed to the signing.

d. A letter from a visitor complaining about how she was stopped from walking the footpath at Burrow Park. This item is to be put on next month's agenda.

Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 11th. December at 7.30pm. in the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

PLANNING MEETING

At an interim planning meeting of the Parish Council in the Church Rooms on Monday 20th. November, there was a discussion concerning the application by Mr. C. Round for partial demolition of the existing building and erection of a replacement building at 'Maylands', Port Gaverne. Mr. Percy May, speaking as a member of the public, pointed out that the Department of the Environment had asked for dismissals of the application on previous occasions but were now seeking support for it. David Phelps (chair) said that the applicant, Mr. Round, had treated all the authorities with contempt from the start. The application was recommended for rejection, by a vote of 4/1 with one abstention, on the same grounds as before - too large a building for the site.

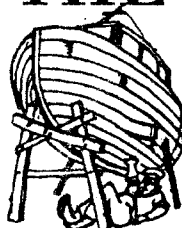

IN WRITING PLEASE

Start driving lessons now if you want to avoid a new test to be introduced from 1st. July next year. As a candidate for a full driving licence you will have to sit and pass a written theory test first.

You will be allowed to start your practical training, with a provisional licence, before taking the written test. From information supplied by the Driving Standards Agency, it seems that the written test will cover the highway code, plus a broad spectrum of motoring matters, by means of multiple-choice questions.

If you are unable to avoid this extra test, a close study of the D.S.A. publications: 'The Driving Manual' and 'Your Driving Test' should cover the matter which may be used for the questions. Your instructor will be able to tell you where they are available.

Who will run the tests and the cost of them has not yet been published.

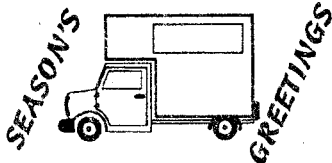

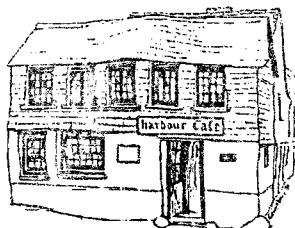
