PARISH COUNCIL

Parish Councillors Bill Dawe (Ward Member), Malcolm Lee (Treasurer), Bryan Nicholls, Jill O'Connor, David Phelps (Vice Chairman), Bryan Richards, and Henry Symons (Chairman) attended the monthly meeting at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, on Monday 11th. November.

The National Trust

Invited speaker, Derek Lord, responsible for the area from Polzeath to Bossiney, (Port Gaverne is virtually their only holding in the parish) said the Heritage Coast Service had helped with clearing the Main and the car park area had been tidied up and an old litter bin removed. He thanked the Parish Council for overseeing the firework display and arranging insurance. The doors of the fish cellars, damaged by the storm, will be repaired but there will be no further cobbing work this financial year.

Malcolm Lee said the Main grass cutting encouraged the wild flowers.

David Phelps was dissatisfied that The National Trust had stopped motorised jet-ski racing at Port Gaverne but allowed a film unit to disrupt the quiet of Port Quin. Mr. Lord said The National Trust was generally in favour of quiet recreation and this was a one-off.

Planning Applications

The Council approved an application by Mr. and Mrs. Goodright, to reduce the height and spread of the crown of a Sycamore tree in Marshalls Way, Trelights.

The Council had no objections in principle to Mr. T. St. John O'Grady's application for the change of use of The Workshop, Trelights plus erection of an extension to form a dwelling, but expressed concern at the blank north elevation fronting the road.

At a separate planning meeting, later, the Council were in favour of an application to return The Manor House to a more suitable appearance by replacing picture – with sash windows, roof reslating, etc.

Finance

With £3118.79 in the high interest account and £85.23 in the Treasurer account, plus receipt of the second half of the precept, £5250.00, interest £2.64, and an anonymous donation for Port Gaverne toilets of £20.00, after payments of £1339.30 were deducted there was a surplus of £3900. It was agreed that this be transferred to the high interest account. The final balances were £7018.79 in the high interest account and £118.57 in the Treasurer account.

The Council made a donation of £25 to the Samaritans who have to spend £4000 on their premises to comply with fire regulations. They have received a £1000 grant from Cornwall County Council.

A donation of £100 was made towards the fireworks display as previous years. David Phelps asked to see a copy of the accounts. Malcolm Lee reported on a very successful fireworks display and noted that Ron Holmes and Simon Barker had attended a one-day safety course beforehand. All the insurance requirements had been met.

Playing Fields Car Park

Henry Symons said there was a covenant which did not allow parking, so the Council could not do much but the situation might change under future plans for the playing fields. Bryan Nicholls said up to 42 cars

could be parked and that parking was essential if the field was to continue in use.

Millennium Project

A scheme was discussed for sports fields with a football pitch, cricket pitch, changing rooms, and a community centre. A committee is to be formed.

Chairman's Report

Henry Symons reported on a Police Liaison meeting where the new telephone system for calls requiring non-immediate action was explained. A neighbourhood watch contact at Bodmin was promised when the computers have been modernised and Port Isaac has been registered as a possible recipient for a closed-circuit television system.

Various Works

A replacement has been arranged for the vandalised surgery direction sign. David Dingle has been asked to put up a temporary fence on the coast path.

Bryan Nicholls said Harvey Lander should be thanked for the repair to the footpath on Port Gaverne Hill.

Letters

There were letters from Mrs. E. Ferguson asking when the Parish Council is going to get full support of electors re the Millennium Grant, from Peggy Richards asking if the playing field equipment will be removed, from Mr. Ffoulkes asking if the Heritage Trust or The National Trust had been consulted about removing hedges at the playing fields, and from Mrs. Haygreen who said she thought the poor attendance by the public at Trelights meetings was due to a lack of interest in Trelights by the Parish Council.

County Transportation and Estates had written to say the sign at New Road was erected at the request of the Parish Council (and its design and location had been agreed beforehand) who would bear the costs if amendment or relocation was required. David Phelps said that if the sign didn't work, it should be their responsibility.

Next Meeting

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 9th. December at 7.30pm. in the Church Rooms, Port Isaac.

SECRET BUS?

If you look very carefully in your Western National winter bus and coach timetable for North Cornwall, you will find on page 31, a bus, route no. 126, which starts at Dinham, runs through Polzeath and arrives at Port Isaac at 9.30am. Then it goes via Port Gaverne, Delabole, St. Teath, Camelford, St. Tudy, St. Mabyn, Bodmin, and arrives at Bodmin Parkway at 11.05am. The return bus leaves at 12.25 from Bodmin Parkway and arrives at Port Isaac at 13.55. You can get the timetable from The Blackthorn Press which is open Monday to Friday 9am. – 5pm. throughout the winter, also Port Isaac Stores and the Harbour Shop.

LIFEBOAT

Two call-outs

Since my last report, our Lifeboat has had two 'end of season' services – one a minor incident, the other could have been very serious.

Cliff Climber

On Wednesday 25th. October, as dusk was falling fast, a man was reported to be overdue after climbing cliffs at Port Quin. A man of considerable experience, he failed to return at his anticipated time and his wife, in concern, called the Coastguard. The ILB launched, to search the area from seaward, and to support our local coastguard team. After searching for some ten minutes, the man was located safe and well. The ILB returned to Port Isaac Harbour in the dark. Crew: Andy Walton, John Collins, Steve Taylor, and Mike Edkins – an extra pair of eyes!

Nearly Drowned Fishermen

Finally, at 3.45pm. on Sunday 27th. October, we launched to rescue two anglers who had been spotted cut off by the rising tide and rough sea. They were on a rock near the 'Gut' in Port Gaverne. The lifeboat arrived just in time; Mike Edkins landed on the rock and escorted the two fishermen into the boat. Just as the boat backed away, a large wave covered the rock where the two men had beenone was a non-swimmer and both were wearing heavy clothing. In carrying out his part, Mike Edkins suffered bruising to his thigh and leg. The two fortunate men were duly landed at Port Isaac none the worse for their lucky escape. The crew who carried out this very good service were: Andy Walton (helmsman), Mike Edkins, and John Collins.

Crew Wanted

The station is now closed for operation and will re-open for service on Saturday 22nd. March 1997. There will be winter training for the crew, starting in early – mid January. I am hoping some will volunteer to join us (female or male) – so far no-one has contacted us since my appeal in the last issue of Trio.
