#### **PARISH Council**

#### **Budget Meeting**

A special meeting was held on 16th. November to discuss the budget for 1999/2000.

Some worry had been expressed at the level of next year's proposed precept of £14,000. An additional £650 was needed for election expenses, £1,000 for further work on the cliff wall, and £800 for Trelights park wall, as well as £400 for a new notice board. Further, as no Councillor could be certain to be present in the next Council, an additional £1,000 may be needed to pay the clerk for the work currently undertaken unpaid by the Treasurer. Mr. Phelps pointed out that Port Gaverne toilets represent over 10% of our budget, and we maintain a large number of benches. Maintenance of the coastal wall is also a big expense, due to the poor quality of the original build. The Clerk's salary is a significant expense, but he is paid by the hour at the standard national rate for the work which is required. One timeconsuming item is the necessity to travel to Trelights to post notices of meetings. There is only a requirement to post one notice in the parish, and Mr. Phelps thought that posting just one notice would effect savings. He was also concerned at the expense of extra planning meetings which he felt could be reduced, Mr. Dawe, Mr. Barriball and Mrs. Richards all expressed concern on the effects for those less well off.

Mr. Lee, speaking as Councillor, pointed out that almost £15,000 over four years (a third of the precept) was spent on paying for the work the Council loads upon the clerk. He said that almost nothing had been achieved for all that work the ratepayers have paid for, with the Council just being a 'talking shop'. Breaking down the salary by 'meeting type', he continued, showed the Clerk's work directly related to monthly meetings costs £6,500, and those extra planning meetings just £980. Breaking it down by function showed that £4,200 is spent on producing the minutes of all that talking, and £2,100 on writing letters, almost all of which have got nowhere. He pointed out that the few achievements this Council has made have been when Councillors have done work themselves, as when Mr. Penny recently produced a detailed report on our illegible road signs. County Highways were not able to ignore such a report and those signs are being replaced.

More effort should be put into reducing the workload on the clerk. A more efficient agenda in which proposers specify the details for each item, will substantially reduce the time spent on producing minutes, which may then simply record proposals 'carried' or 'not carried'. The Council should explore other ways of achieving things so as not to involve clerk's time. Officers of the District and County Councils only act on policy directions given to them by the elected Councillors. If the Parish Council needs the County Council to do something, the County Councillor should be asked to take it up, without any need to spend ratepayers money in getting the Clerk to write. If the County Councillor says she has tried but nothing is going to happen, the Parish Council should be able to accept this without wasting further time and ratepayers money.

In consultation with the Clerk, proposals to reduce the workload will be put before the Council within the next three months.

Further savings may be achieved by wider publicity for Parish Council tenders. Every contractor in the parish, and some outside, should be sent a tender document inviting them to quote, rather than expecting them to see the notices within the few weeks before the tender is closed. This would give the Council a wider choice.

#### Planning Application

An application, no. 98/0317, for the change of use of part of existing agricultural building to farm visitor centre with associated facilities at Treswarrow Park Farm, Trelights, for Mr. and Mrs. Parnell (amendment) provision of covered walkway and revised window and door openings, was recommended to the North Cornwall District Council Planning and Development Committee for approval.

#### **Telecommunications Mast**

At a site meeting, those present were told that the mast for Orange telephones at Port Gaverne could be sited just behind the large shed and so be less prominent. This seemed a good alternative and a decision will be made by North Cornwall District Council planning committee.

#### Port Gaverne Quay

This continues to be a worry as the rock is still breaking away and causing the path on the top of the quay to become narrower and narrower. Cornhill Insurance, the Parish Council insurers are being asked to adopt a realistic attitude in view of the possible risks.


