

There are currently changes going through as to what recreational fishermen can catch - the number of Bass per day is three. Size increases are being discussed by the EU. Shellfish landings are also under discussion and a new byelaw is currently being drawn up that, if approved, will increase the landing of shellfish to five, provided that the number of lobster and/or crayfish dies not exceed a total of two. ### Our MP, Scott Mann talks to Trio

It has been a month since I became the MP for North Cornwall and Parliament is now back into full swing of debating Government bills. I have been sworn in, delivered my maiden speech, and I'm now finalising the employment of staff and refurbishing an office in Bodmin.

I'd like to thank all those who have contacted me with their concerns while exercising great patience. These first few weeks have been challenging but also rewarding, and I have focused on implementing an infrastructure of communication and staff so that we can address all correspondence from constituents more economically.

The most significant development has been the passing of the EU Referendum Bill, which will now go to the committee stage before heading to the House of Lords for their approval. The EU referendum is now firmly on the horizon and I'm confident it will be delivered to the British people by the end of 2017.

On top of that, I have also joined 'Conservative's for Britain', which will consider how to prepare for an 'out' campaign if the EU does not permit a new relationship of trade and co-operation with the UK.

More locally, I have decided to no longer accept my councillor's allowance of £12,250. In a letter to Andrew Kerr, Chief Executive of Cornwall Council, I have asked that the money instead be given – if permitted – to a local community fund in Wadebridge which would far better benefit local people.

Spending over half my week in London, it would be wrong to continue drawing money from Cornwall's public purse. Although I will remain the representative of Wadebridge West, I feel my MP's pay alone is sufficient in covering my Westminster duties as well as my local duties.

Notable issues that I have been addressing include protection of public toilets and voicing concerns of constituents who are opposed to wind turbines.

In particular, the Daymer Bay public toilets are under threat for closure, Being particularly isolated, there would be no other suitable amenity for beach users. This is not practical for anyone and it wouldn't be long before tourists and local people stopped going there.

There must be practical or financial solutions to problems facing public toilets, and I'm sure small charges to keep them open would be seen favourably. It is basic amenities such as toilets that we must ensure are protected, otherwise our tourism economy could suffer irreparably.

I then wrote to Lord Bourne of Aberystwyth, Under-Secretary for the Department of Energy and Climate Change, who will be overseeing an appeal for a wind farm at Week St Mary. I stressed the views of the local people who want their rural surroundings to remain unspoiled. David Cameron has also reiterated the Government's intention to end on-shore wind subsidy, which is hugely contributing to the industrialisation of our countryside and excessive energy bills.

I have also had meetings with my Cornish colleagues in Parliament to discuss the way forward for the Stadium for Cornwall. It is undoubtedly something we want to see happen



and succeed for the benefit of the whole county, but not on the backs of Cornish rate payers.

In June I attended the Royal Cornwall Show, which as always was a great event. It's always nice to meet the array of people who attend, from farmers, to small business owners, to families, I also attended the Launceston food festival - which showcased the Cornish food industry, as well as the BAAM festival in Bude, the Big Lunch in Wadebridge and the Bude Music Society.

All showed what Cornwall truly has to offer and it gave me great reassurance about the Cornish economy (particularly the food sector) and how things are looking good going forward in North Cornwall.

Norman Trebilcock of FLEET is coming to Port Isaac on 13th July and will give a talk at the school at 6.30pm prior to the Parish Council Meeting about the installation and use of Public Access Defibrillators in outlying villages. He has, with the help of some amazing local volunteers, raised thousands of pounds for this cause with a view to improving the survival rates of people who suffer from coronary episodes, in areas where the ambulance response times are challenged.

I have suggested the possibility of the Parish sponsoring first aiders to work alongside this scheme who can be called to non emergencies thereby reducing unnecessary callouts for an overstretched ambulance service. The First Responders can only be called out by ambulance control and they will still be available as required. The first aiders could be called for by anyone. This proposition will be discussed by the subsequent Parish Council meeting.

I would encourage as many people as possible to come to this event, meet Norman, ask guestions about the scheme and have your say.





## **July Thoughts**

Money. We never have enough of it, do we? And when we get some, there's always that bill that drops on the mat, council tax, electricity, the car, and so on, which takes it away – and then some. We have also just endured three months of Big Money in the Election – NHS, defence, education, Europe, the care of the vulnerable to name but a few. Now limping along behind all of our needs comes the church. Recently I was looking at a 1929 Parish Magazine and chanced to read the Vicar's letter. What was his message? You've guessed.

As summer gets into its stride, we look forward to the season of fetes and flower festivals, when, as Robert Morley once observed, "In times of need we bake cakes for each other and sell our old clothes to each other". Kitchens smell of cakes and the ubiquitous quiches, lofts are ransacked for clothes, CDs, toys and books long since forgotten, and the flower ladies plot their strategies for themes and displays. Silent prayers are offered for good weather.

There is in all this activity, a pleasure in seeing old friends again, to see – and sample - the skills of our cooks, the artistic skills of the communities in flower displays, the skills of our musicians in bands and on church organs. Unconsciously we draw a little nearer to our Lord's command "to love our neighbour as ourselves".

The church is in serious trouble financially, and will be still after the summer's fund raising. Two of our churches are facing the prospect of insolvency, and three neighbouring churches are in a similar position. Michaelstow has already been reduced to a chapel (ie with no guarantee of regular services). In my opinion the others will follow before long. Money tends to overshadow the purpose of the church, which is to believe and follow the words of Jesus Christ.

Fundraising is necessary, but we must never forget what it is for.



# Vehbi and his friends in Kosovo need your old shoes and school bags

The Ideas Partnership is a UK registered charity (no. 1161389) charity set up by British couple, Elizabeth Gowing and Robert Wilton, with their Kosovan friend Ardian Arifaj. Elizabeth and Rob divide their time between Port Isaac and the Balkans. The charity is mainly volunteer-based, with about 60 ex-pat, Kosovar Albanian and Kosovar Roma volunteers working on projects you can read more about on the website www.theideaspartnership.org or on the Facebook profile (Theideaspartner Ship).

Elizabeth is a primary school teacher by background and for the last 5 years the main work of The Ideas Partnership has been an education project in the Roma community just outside Kosovo's capital, Pristina. Elizabeth discovered 70 children who wanted to go to school but because of a government policy on registration were not being allowed into class. The Ideas Partnership then started classes for these children and lobbying to try to change the policy. You can read the story of this project at www.GettingGjelaneToSchool.wordpress.com.

If you have any spare shoes for children aged 7-14 we know of lots of little feet in Kosovo that would be very grateful for them. We also badly need used school backpacks; you would not only be giving children shoes and bags, but giving them access to an education.

As a result of this project, over 200 children (including Vehbi in the picture) have finally started school and since then The Ideas Partnership has been working to keep them in school. One of the most common challenges for a child making the 2km journey to school (not all of it along paved roads) is making sure they have shoes to wear. We



often see children wearing slippers in the mud and ice of a Balkan winter.



### PORT ISAAC RNLI REMEMBERS LES HENSON

I am sad to report the death of one of our valued Port Isaac RNLI supporters, the marine artist Les Henson.

Les worked for a number of vears as a top line Technical Illustrator for the MOD covering detailed creative artwork requirements for a wide range of equipment, associated with all branches of the Armed Forces. Over this period he further developed his skills as a fine painter of historical maritime subjects, bringing back to life sea actions and ships of the past, always with a keen eye for minute detail vet combined with a dramatic and powerful atmosphere. His work is held in several private collections and he completed a number of special commissions including several from the Royal Navy. In contrast to his acknowledged maritime style he also became known for his ability to create a range stunning modern paintings, an artist of great range and ability.



Always a keen supporter of the RNLI, Les created a fine painting, For Those In Peril on the Sea, dedicated to Port Isaac RNLI. Based on a real life rescue carried out by the pulling lifeboat Richard and Sarah III on December 7th 1911 to the Schooner Berthe Marie of Brest, this painting was sold at one of our RNLI Harvest Festival Auctions for over £500. In addition to the donation of the painting, publishing rights were included.

The painting shows the Port Isaac crew rowing out through storm tossed seas to the *Berthe Marie*. A local coastguard had reported that a schooner anchored off shore in gale force conditions had parted from her cables and was driving towards the icoast. *Bob B. Chairman*

### Websites of the Month

Summer has finally arrived and with it holiday time when we may get a bit more time to read; so I thought I would have a wander through the world of electronic books, book readers and book reading apps.

To start at the beginning, there is really only one place and that is Project Gutenberg https://www.gutenberg.org/wiki Main Page . This was founded in 1971 by Michael Hart who invented ebooks. You can read the story about how he was offered the use of some downtime on a Xerox Computer and decided that the best way he could use this time (apparently 100 million dollars worth of time) was to store the world's libraries. His first effort was to type in the Declaration of Independence. He seems to have sent it round to people, but this was pre-internet days, so probably not that many by todays standards. He named the project after Johannes Gutenburg, the man who invented the printing press and revolutionised the availability of books in the 15th century (https:// en.wikipedia.org/?title=Johannes\_Gutenberg . From the project Gutenburg site you can download and read, completely without payment over 49,000 ebooks in various formats. I typed 'Cornwall' in the search box and got lots of hits – various titles ranging from books about the coast of Cornwall to fairy stories. The site also has audio books to download, some that have been produced by people reading them and others are computer generated. I haven't tried them so not sure about the quality, but they are free as well. There is also a useful section on advice on mobile ebook readers. This is a project that is funded by donations, so you can support it if you like.

There are many ebook readers and they are compared on a wiki https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Comparison\_of\_e-book\_readers . Rather than describing them all I thought it would be better to simply go with my own experience. I have a kindle reader and also have kindle apps on my computer and tablet. The advantage of the kindle reader is that if you are out in the sunshine, you can still read it, as it needs light. If you have ever tried to read something on a computer in bright sunshine you will know this is a real advantage. However, it is also the case that the various apps and programmes that that you can get for computers and mobile devices do give you a lot of flexibility and I will describe a few here.

For the computer there are two that I use: the Kindle app (download from the Apple app store or equivalent) and Calibre – pronounced Caliber (download from http://calibre-ebook.com/download\_osx). Kindle is firmly linked to Amazon and while you can read books from elsewhere, and also pdf documents, it is designed to work best with an Amazon account. Calibre by contrast is entirely 'open source' and so works well with Project Gutenberg. It has a very well designed interface and has many features to allow editing and reformatting your ebooks.

On the iPad and similar devices there is the Apple iBooks app that works in a similar way to the Kindle and is linked to an apple account. There is an app called iBooks Author that helps you design your own iBooks and very beautiful results are possible as it includes Apple's well known design flair.

A final idea is to subscribe to a service that tells you when there are bargain ebooks available, for example Bookbub https://www.bookbub.com/home/. This will send you where you can go to get either free or very discounted ebooks that are on offer. It scans all the publishers websites to keep up with what is available and then sends to an email listing the genre of books you have chosen.

I know some people do not like the idea of e books and prefer to have a real book in their hands and I have some sympathy with that. For me, however, both have their place and if you haven't tried ebooks, it is worth giving them a go.

Are you sitting comfortably? Then I'll tell you a story. Some of you may recall that, before the Main Car Park was built, there were ideas of a park-&-ride car park out near the B3314, connected to the village



by shuttle bus service. A development of this was to have a tramway from the car park, gradually descending the valley side and ending somewhere near Rose Hill or the Water-treatment Plant. The exact route, and location of an accessible terminus in the village, were obviously going to be a problem. However, narrow-gauge would have been used to minimize land-take, and suitable robust second-hand trams were becoming available abroad, replaced prematurely by modern ones.

A further development of this idea was to suggest a cliff lift from somewhere on the hill behind Lobber Point down to somewhere behind the Pottery and, remarkably, suitable equipment had just become available. The essential parts of a redundant cliff lift in Scarborough had been acquired for possible use to connect the centre of Launceston with the Newport area at the bottom of the hill, where the Steam Railway and the large Co-op store are located. This scheme now looked a bit uncertain, and the equipment could then be offered to Port Isaac. Our development also, like the first, proposed a tramway, to link the top of the cliff lift with a park-&-ride car park at St Endellion, which would also serve the Festivals, etc.. Of course, no estimates of cost were ever made, and there would have been great problems with acquisition of land, siting of termini, the "somewheres", etc, etc.

This little digression on tram-inspired "might-have-beens" was inspired by the news that, after many years stored at Launceston, the cliff lift equipment is likely to be sold in the near future, bringing an end to such speculation.....anyway, thanks to the Parish Council we do have our Main Car Park, which is now being extended by an overflow section at lesser specification, to accommodate the greater flow in July and August, and a shuttle service exists for those who need it.

It was good at the Royal Cornwall Show, nearly a month ago now, to see mention of renewable energy in a particularly local context. The Wave Hub down west is gradually having generators linked up to it and, within the next two years, should be producing some 30MW, enough to supply ten thousand 3kW electric fires. The four berths attached to it will be occupied by companies with British, Finnish and Swedish connections, and some of the generators will be assembled in Falmouth. Most encouraging, but waves derive their energy from wind, and we are constantly reminded be opponents of wind-turbines how fickle the wind is. I hope that, to make use of the other ever-present power-source we have in coastal Cornwall, we are making as much progress with tidal generation.

An unsettling insight into Climate Change was voiced on the radio recently. We know that the  $CO_2$  content of the atmosphere is increasing through our burning fossil fuels, and that hence the amount of  $CO_2$  dissolved in the oceans is also increasing. We also know that when  $CO_2$  dissolves in water it produces mild carbonic acid. It has now been pointed out that the higher acidity of the oceans means that organisms living there will have to expend more energy in regulating their internal acidity, and that applies to  $\underline{all}$  those living in the ocean, from zoo-plankton to whales, including coral reefs.

### So time for this month's walk, a strenuous one to/from Port Quin

(allow about 3 hours). From the Platt walk up Roscarrock Hill past the Pottery (former Methodist chapel) and Fern Cottage (Doc Martin exteriors only) to the top, then right across to Footpath no.33 and the 80 steps on Lobber, round the headland and down into Pinehaven. Cross the stream and up 100 steps to the top. There is a wooden fence all the way, nothing to do with The National Trust, which often gets blamed! It was erected at the landowner's request when this section of the Coast Path was created by the Countryside Commission and Cornwall County Council in 1986. The path cuts across Varley Head,, descends 70 steps to Downgate Cove, switchbacks past Fox Hole to round Kellan Head and (at last!) reach Port Quin. In season refreshments are available in the Car Park.

Walk left up the road and straight on past Varley Cottage where the road goes right.

Over a stile, on Footpath no.34, across four fields to just before Roscarrock

Farm, where the track turns right. Turn left and follow the hedge to the bottom of the field, then round right to a stile. The path continues down the side of the Pinehaven valley to a footbridge over a stream. Carry on over the stile and up the steep hill, then bear left past the post and down to a stile in a stone hedge. Walk down Postman's Walk (2 stiles) to Roscarrock Hill and the Harbour. Whew!

Happy walking, cycling, recycling and greening this bit of the planet!





Strawberries again ...
well it is summer!

Even though we can buy strawberries throughout the year, nothing compares to sweet, home-grown varieties which ripen in June and remain in-season through to mid-August. Berries should be enjoyed soon after picking - if ripe and sweet, all you have to do then is hull them and tuck in. If you don't get a chance to pick-you-own at a farm, keep an eye out in the shops for strawberries with a sweet aromatic scent - they'll have the most flavour. Wash and hull soft summer berries just before you're going to eat them - if rinsed beforehand, they'll only go soggy and lose their shape. If they're reasonably clean, a quick wipe with kitchen paper should do the trick. Over chilling tends to rein- n their natural flavour - you'll find that they have a fuller flavour when served at room temperature.



### Strawberry and cream Panna cotta



1 pinch of salt 33g of sugar, plus extra for sprinkling 1/2 vanilla pod

*First, make the purée.* Weigh out 200g of hulled, washed strawberries and blitz in a blender. Pass the pulp through a fine sieve to remove any seeds and lumps and set aside in the fridge

**Start the panna cotta** by soaking the gelatine leaves in cold water for 5 minutes

Combine the milk, cream, sugar, vanilla pod and a pinch of salt in a pan and bring to the boil.

Squeeze out any excess water from the gelatine leaves and add them to the cream mix. Whisk to dissolve then remove from the heat

Thinly slice the remaining strawberries, sprinkle with sugar and arrange in the bottom of each glass.

Set the pan of warm cream over a bowl of iced water to cool. Once it begins to set, whisk until smooth and drizzle some strawberry purée into the cream, without mixing twist the purée through the cream once, then pour into the serving glasses, so you have a ripple-effect with the strawberry and cream. Push a couple of sliced strawberries into the top of the mix, then place the glasses into the fridge to set for 2 hours before serving.

# English strawberry dessert with rose wine jelly, macerated berries and elderflower cream

Strawberries treated three different but simple ways – a wine jelly, macerated fresh berries and a cream with elderflower

### For the jelly

300g (10½oz) strawberries 150g (5½oz) caster sugar 6 small sheets gelatine 300ml (10fl oz) rosé wine

### For the cream

3-4 tbsp elderflower cordial 200ml (7fl oz) double cream 3 tbsp caster sugar

### For the fresh berries

350g (12oz) strawberries 3 tbsp caster sugar

Make the jelly first. Hull and halve the berries and put them in a pan with the sugar and 100ml (3½fl oz) water. Bring to the boil then turn down to a simmer and cook for about eight minutes. The berries should be completely soft but not collapsed into a purée. Strain, reserving the fruit, and measure the syrup. You should have 200ml (7fl oz). If necessary, top up with water. Carefully spoon the white froth off the top.

Soak the gelatine in cold water until it is completely soft – about five minutes. In the meantime heat the wine until it is just warm, but not hot (and certainly not boiling). Lift the gelatine out of the water and squeeze out the excess. Put the leaves in the warm wine and stir to help it dissolve. If the liquid is too hot it ruins gelatin's setting properties, so be careful. Add the strawberry syrup, stir and pour into six glasses to set (use glasses that have enough room for the jelly, a layer of sliced berries on top and then the cream on top of that). Put in the fridge to set – allow about four hours.

Purée the cooked strawberries with the elderflower cordial. Whip the cream and stir in the purée. It's nice if this is marbled rather than completely incorporated. Set the cream aside until you're ready to serve (if you put it in the fridge make sure it comes out well before serving or it will be solid and 'fridge cold' – not pleasant).

For the fresh berry layer just hull the fruit then cut lengthways into slices about the thickness of a 50p coin. Toss in a bowl with the sugar and leave to macerate for 30 to 45 minutes (no longer, as they will get too soft).

To serve, spoon the strawberries over each jelly and top with the cream.


