Our MP, Scott Mann talks to Trio ...

The final week of Parliament before the summer recess saw some important votes and meetings take place before MPs headed back their constituencies for a few weeks.

As promised in our election manifesto, we held a vote to renew Trident. The current programme runs until around 2030, and due to the extensive planning and resourcing that needs to be done, a vote had to be taken this year.

Although MPs including myself voted overwhelmingly to renew our nuclear deterrent, it's important to also note that the same motion included a caveat to reduce our nuclear stockpile by the mid-2020s. This means we remain committed to multilateral disarmament while having an effective deterrent.

My South West colleague and recently appointed International Trade Secretary, Liam Fox, held a meeting with MPs to outline what the goals are for him and his new department.

Already since the Brexit vote, South Korea, Canada, the US, Australia and Pakistan have revealed intentions for free trade deals with Britain, and it will be the job of Liam and his new department to negotiate such deals leading up to our exit from the EU. Only 9% of UK companies export and I want to work with North Cornwall businesses to tie up those links with other countries who wish to import our goods.

In August I went along to the annual Launceston Show to meet with the NFU, agricultural businesses and food producers. Despite the odd bit of rain, the show was very good and I had constructive discussions with farmers in the NFU tent.

Rightly, they are concerned about a post-Brexit future, and it's vital that we get clarity from the Government for a 'British Agricultural Policy' to address subsidies, sustainability, skills and promoting British produce at home and abroad as we draft trade deals with other economies. Farmers have my full support and I will be their voice in Parliament.

Sticking with farming, after the Show I met with South West Water and the Westcountry Rivers Trust to learn more about their Upstream Thinking project, which aims to clean up our rivers by changing the way farmland is used upriver.

We visited one farm near Werrington which, through match funding from South West Water, has built new slurry pits to stop it washing into the Ottery River. Not only does this help the wildlife, but it also makes the water cleaner for South West Water.

This level of investment, which would be difficult to get from a bank, means the farmer can modernise their farm, become more productive and self-sufficient and help the environment.

The Commons Culture, Media and Sport Select Committee also published its report on "Establishing world-class connectivity throughout the UK", concluding that BT must invest more into its Openreach division which oversees the installation and maintenance of cables.

BT say that investment is 30 per cent higher than two years ago, but the Committee still argue that more needs to be done. This year the Government will also bring forward its Digital Economy Bill which will introduce a statutory obligation of at least 10Mbps for every household.

So as you read this silly season will almost be over and my thoughts have turned to what to cook for this year's Gig in the Garden. I really love this day (although it is a lot of hard work for all the staff) as it gives us a opportunity to do some thing different and to meet our customers. As some of you might know, I have a new kitchen range and so plan to put this to the test. So here is a BBQ menu for you ... with a Californian classic salad to go as a side.

Texas Barbecue Brisket

about a 5kg/ 11 lb piece of beef brisket 500 ml/ 18 fl oz beef stock For the barbecue sauce 1 tbsp sunflower oil 1 small onion, finely chopped 3 garlic clove, crushed 500 ml/ 18 fl oz tomato ketchup 100 ml/ 3½ floz Worcester sauce
75 ml/ 2½ fl oz lemon juice
2 tbsp brown sugar
1 tbsp malt vinegar
2 tsp Dijon mustard
1 tsp crushed chilli flakes
1 tsp Tabasco sauce
1 tsp dried thyme

For the rub

2 tbsp each chilli powder and mustard powder 1 tbsp each paprika, ground cumin, garlic powder, ground black pepper, caster sugar

1 bay leaf, crushed

To make the barbecue sauce, heat the oil in a frying pan, then cook onion and garlic for a few mins until soft. Add the rest of the sauce ingredients to the pan with a good pinch of salt and simmer for 20 mins. Use a hand blender or food processor to whizz to a smooth pure.

Make the rub by mixing all the ingredients together with a pinch of salt. Rub the mix all over the beef and set aside. Leave for at least six hours. Heat oven to 150C/130C fan/gas 2.

In a large roasting tin, mix the beef stock and ½ the barbecue sauce. Add the brisket to the tin, cover tightly with foil, then cook for 4-5 hrs until the meat is really tender when you push a fork into it. The beef can be prepared the night before - just leave it to cool in the tin covered with foil, but don't refrigerate.

To finish the beef, get a barbecue fired up and wait until the coals are completely ashen - you want a low, not fierce, heat. Lift the beef out of the roasting tin and place on the barbecue to char. If your barbecue has a lid, close it now. Cook for about 20 mins, turning it carefully with tongs, until lightly charred all over and heated through. Lift onto a board and serve sliced with the remaining barbecue sauce on the side.

Cobb salad

is an American classic of chopped tomatoes, avocado, leaves and crisp bacon Sourdough: 1/4 loaf Avocado: 1 small, peeled and cut into chunks Blue cheese: 75g, crumbled Mini plum tomatoes: 100g, quartered Watercress: 50g, leaves only Smoked streaky bacon: 4 slices, cooked crisp

Heat the oven to 200C/ fan 180C/gas 6. Cut the sourdough into chunks, toss in olive oil and bake for 10-15 mins until crisp and golden.

Green Goddess Dressing

2 spring onions, chopped including the green bits 1/2 lemon, juiced 2 tbsp mayonnaise 1/2 small bunch basil, chopped 1/2 small bunch chives, chopped

Whizz all the dressing ingredients to a purée in a small food processor adding 2-3 tbsp water to loosen it (you want to be able to drizzle it) and season.

Arrange all the salad ingredients except the bacon in separate piles on a plate. Drizzle over the dressing and break over the bacon.

CREW NEWS

On Sunday July 31st, Port Isaac Lifeboat had launched at 15-35 hours and was proceeding in a westerly direction towards Lunday Bay, with volunteer crew members Damien Bolton, Tom Brown and George Cleave taking part in a routine training exercise. This plan was interrupted by radio communications from Falmouth Coastguard tasking our boat to Port Gaverne as they were receiving numerous 999 calls reporting an up-turned boat with multiple persons in the water .

Our ILB crew reversed course and reached the area within five minutes of receiving the 'shout', guickly locating a capsized Dory type vessel approximately 4-5 metres long. Two females were seen to be clinging to the hull and two males were in the water. Helmsman, Damien Bolton, decided to retrieve one of the males from the water first. Meanwhile the two females had slipped off the hull so priority was given to bringing them on board, closely followed by the two men. A triage showed all casualties were extremely cold with the teenage girl suffering more. The helm radioed Falmouth to request an ambulance. However, Maritime Agency Rescue Helicopter 924 from Newquay had been tasked by Falmouth Coastguard and was on the scene as our ILB was making it's way back to Port Isaac.

Falmouth requested 924 to land to allow the on-board paramedic to check out the casualties in the station. 924 landed on Lobber Point and their paramedic made his way down to the station on foot. The casualties were subsequently all found to be ok and were collected by relatives. Meanwhile our Lifeboat was re-launched and recovered the upturned boat safely to Port Gaverne, and then returned to station and refuelled ready for service.

What could have been a tragic incident had been averted by the vigilance of those on shore that called the Coastguard and the speedy response and professionalism of our volunteer lifeboat crew.

LIFEBOAT LARKS REAL LIFE RESCUE

Sunday August 7th saw moments of real life drama within the closing minutes of tLifeboat Larks. Our lifeboat, having demonstrated Sea Rescue and Crew Transfer techniques in combination with Maritime Rescue Helicopter 924, was called out at 17-20 hours to launch a real life rescue to a swimmer who had been dragged out towards the open sea by a strong rip current contending with lively surface conditions and backwash after jumping into the sea from the Eastern Harbour Breakwater. The ambitious swimmer was safely hauled on board the lifeboat and returned, somewhat shaken, to the harbour beach, safe and sound and a little wiser.

RNLI NEWS

With Port Isaac RNLI approaching it's 150th year celebrations and a Ball scheduled to mark the event on October 15th, the annual Lifeboat Larks event set off with a record attendance with well over 1000 visitors and locals enjoying a warm summer day in the harbour and the wide range of activities on offer.

This event provides a great opportunity for for all ages to meet the crew and committee and see the Lifeboat on exercise, co-ordinated this year for the first time by the newly formed Maritime Agency Coastguard Search and Rescue Sikorsky 90 Helicopter Unit based at Newquay.

St MInver Silver Band set the day off followed by the ever popular Penny Royal Traditional Jazz Band. Activities ranged from face painting including a competition for all age groups, bouncy castle, duck fishing, egg throwing, BBQ, Pimms and Sharp's Bar, cream teas, prints unique to Port Isaac and a wide range of Christmas and note cards only available through the lifeboat station. We also had a well subscribed star raffle for a special edition reproduction of a painting by local artist Sian Fletcher depicting a historic overland rescue carried out by Port Isaac Lifeboat back in 1877 plus our draw tickets for Rosemary Grattan's painting, *Christmas Delivery* reviewed in past issues of *Trio*. The Port Isaac Gigs provided an opportunity for some adventurious visitors to try their hand at swinging an oar.

Throughout the event Port Isaac's well known Fisherman's Friend, Jon Cleave was on the PA and kept the day rolling with his own unique humour. His son, George, now a member of the crew and "following in Father's footsteps", gave an interesting and informative narration covering the Lifeboat to Helicopter crew transfer demonstration, carried out by Darren Milner, which took place out just beyond the Harbour breakwaters. The helicopter carried on the long established tradition set by Culdrose RNAS 771 Squadron and left us with an impressive Fly Past over the Harbour.

With final accounts just completed, Chairman Bob Bulgin confirmed that Lifeboat Larks had raised a record breaking total of over £5 000 for the RNLI. Bob also reiterated that such a result would not have been possible had it not been for the tremendous support given by crew, committee and helpers, who had all worked so hard to present a great family day ... not forgetting, of course, the generosity of everyone who came along.

As the event was closing, the Lifeboat was called to launch to a a real life rescue bringing a casualty ashore who had fallen off the harbour breakwaters into a lively sea and had got caught in a strong back wash sweeping him around the pier head.

Websites of the month... WINC!

The dramatic improvement in English wines over the past decade is celebrated in the new vineyards we have in Cornwall and the South of England. Some friends reminded me that English wine has a long history going back to Roman times and over 40 were mentioned in the Doomsday Book. So



this month I thought I would look at what you could find online about local vineyards and distilleries. I was prompted to do this as I had an enjoyable tour of the Furleigh Estate Vineyard and Winery in Dorset recently www.furleighestate.co.uk and tasted some really enjoyable English wines. The vineyard was only established a few years ago.The tour explained how the Classic Cuvée 2011 (Silver medal in the International Wine Challenge 2016) was made and bottled – quite complicated, but the result was excellent! The Rosé was also very refreshing (see photo).

Of course our most local and very famous vineyard is Carnel Valley www.carnelvalley.com which was established quite a long time ago now, in 1989. The story of its origins when Bob Lindo and his wife Annie began changing their farm to its new focus of winemaking is a good read on www.carnelvalley.com/about and gives an idea of how hard it is to produce good wines – how dependent on the climate, for example, and dealing with disease. It is, from what I can gather, the largest vineyard in the County, but others are coming along all the time.

Another to have a look at is Knightor open vineyard www.knightor.com Here, in addition to some discussion of winemaking the site has a page www.knightor.com/ history devoted to local history that I found very interesting. It starts off as follows:

"The settlement of Knightor is first recorded in 1305 when it is spelt "Creghtyer". The name is Cornish and contains the elements crygh and tyr meaning 'wrinkled land'. By1699 Joel Gascoyne's map of Cornwall records it as Nighter, and depicts an important house with what appears to be two ranges and a tower, indicative of a grand building. By 1805 The Ordnance Survey records the settlement as Nightor and by 1842 the St Austell tithe map records the hamlet as Knightor."

One further west is Polgoon Vinyard and orchard Penzance www.polgoon.com They say on their website: "After many years trading as fish merchants John and Kim Coulson decided they needed a new adventure. After meeting an award-winning Cornish winemaker they decided to plant vines and create their own Cornish vineyard. From their first wine harvest in 2006, they created the first Polgoon wine and were subsequently awarded the Trophy for "Best Still Rose in the UK"."

Closer to home, Trevibban Mill www.trevibbanmill.com is near. From their website they say: "Originally the land was home to a miller and his family and the ruins of the water mill where they lived and worked are what first attracted Liz and Engin to the area. The old mill is located next to the Issey Brook and a stone's throw from the beautiful, secluded Trevibban lake...The first wine was made in 2011 and in 2015 Trevibban Mill opened its doors to the public. Within a year of being open, the vineyard has won two gold, nine silver and thirteen bronze awards for its wines."

Bosue Vineyard www.bosuevineyard.co.uk is near St Ewe. They grow grape varieties of Rondo, Regent, Solaris, Phoenix and Orion that are apparently particularly suited to the local climate. Their wines also look very tempting.

Finally I thought I would mention couple of slightly different ones. Firstly the Southwestern distillery www.southwesterndistillery.com located at Higher Trevibban Farm near Wadebridge. They are not yet open to visitors, according to their website, but in fact you can see a lot just by the looking at the website. I can vouch for the very nice gin. The Cornish Pastis is also really good and unusual – an interesting variant on the French anise. They say it is made from foraged gorse flowers from the Atlantic cliff-tops and fresh orange zest, distilled like the gin, and then finished off with a touch of liquorice root for colour!

The other slightly different one is also local to us, Haywood Farm Cider near St Mabyn www.haywoodfarmcider.co.uk/. This is definitely worth a visit. The cider is wonderful.

I have probably missed some vineyards in Cornwall as there are more starting up all the time, but I hope this selection gives you an idea of the range and quality. *Tony Wainwright*
