

Four defibrillators in the Parish



Thanks to fundraising by Harry Hambly, The Fisherman's Friends, Port Isaac Rowing Club, The Doc Martin Fund and the community of Port Isaac, along with FLEET (Front Line Emergency Equipment Trust) we now have three Defibrillators in the village. These are sited outside Secrets, outside John Brays and outside the Port Gaverne Hotel. In addition Trevathan Farm have single-handedly raised money to fund a further one that is fitted on the outside of the Endlienta stone barn (on the main road opposite the farm shop).

If you are interested to find out more about what to do in an emergency and how the defibs work, you are invited to Port Isaac Village Hall on Thursday January 26th at 7pm when Norman Trebilcock MBE, the founder and General Manager of FLEET, will be coming along to answer any questions and give a demonstation.



There are two types of cabinets and ours are SMART ones that are monitored via the internet and checked every 15 minutes. The door lock is checked every day and every caller who dials 999 and describes what might be a cardiac arrest will be directed to the nearest cabinet and the door will be opened, via the internet, by Ambulance Control. There are full and easy instructions on the cabinet and the sytems guides the caller exactly what to do. The system then alerts up to ten mobiles in the village and sends out three messages; the first when the cabinet is activated, the second when the cabinet is opened and the third when the defibrillator is removed. The internet is

backed by a telephone SIM card and GSM signal whilst the electrics are backed up by an internal battery system.

The cost of each cabinet is £3450 plus VAT and there is an annual surveillance charge of £295 plus VAT. FLEET provides free installation and the building/business where the cabinet is sited provides the internet access and electricity.

Our MP, Scott Mann talks to Trio ...

As we head towards Christmas and start getting into the festive spirit, I was delighted to see Cornwall getting three early Christmas presents in November's Autumn Statement, with the Chancellor announcing tens of millions of pounds for our roads and charities.

With cold weather setting in across the county, it is likely more potholes will begin to appear on our roads, and that's why I welcome the £1.8 million pothole repair fund for Cornwall which will make sure more holes are filled in. This will repair 35,000 potholes across Cornwall, and a highways maintenance grant worth £20 million will also be provided in 2017/18.

The Chancellor also announced £1 million for the Cornwall Air Ambulance Trust which is trying to buy a second helicopter. This new air ambulance is key to ensuring emergencies in Cornwall are tended to quicker and that more peoples' lives are saved.

The Treasury also recognised the need for greater support for rural businesses, and I was delighted to hear that from next April, the Rural Settlement business rate relief scheme will be doubled from 50% to 100%. This means many pubs, shops and petrol stations in villages around North Cornwall will be able to get all their business rates waived.

A few weeks ago I was also delighted to hear the latest results for bathing water quality in North Cornwall, which found that 14 of the constituency's most popular beauty spots were rated Good or Excellent. This is great news for local residents, tourists and the marine environment, and Cornwall as a whole had very good results as well.

It was also in recent weeks that the High Court ruled in favour of making main residency conditions for new builds houses, which I know is a hot topic in North Cornwall.

Earlier this year St Ives put their Neighbourhood Development Plan to a local referendum, which stipulated that second homes could not be built. This was immediately appealed by a property developer, but this challenge has been ruled against in the High Court.

Although such a condition cannot apply to existing homes, this will hopefully help local people buy new homes and will also set a precedent for other parishes and towns to have a similar condition in their own Neighbourhood Plans, many of which are now considering this.

Already the Government has introduced an extra 3 per cent stamp duty for second homes which will be used to fund more affordable homes. This includes the £20 million self-build fund for the South West which I lobbied for earlier this year.

There are villages all around Cornwall's coast which have seen a surge in second home ownership, and although we welcome people to come and stay in our beautiful county and their spending, local communities have felt left behind and ignored. It's time that we bring some balance to our current housing policy, which unfortunately hasn't been addressed for decades.

We have all enjoyed celebrating the 25th year of Corsair being launched in the village through a number of fun events which have really raised the profile of the club and helped recruit some lovely new members! It was also a great way to inform old members and people who used to be linked to the club about our progress.

In April our beloved gig Corsair was rededicated in a beautiful and memorable event, bringing all members of the community together. We were joined by Peter Reveley. aka "Dasher", the builder of *Corsair*. Rev'd Dr Elizabeth Wild, conducted the service and with singing from the Port Isaac Chorale this was a tremendous start to our year!

The World Championships saw success when our Ladies A crew did brilliantly to come top of their group and secure a podium place. The men were second in their group as were the ladies B and the Ladies Super Vets finished 8th.

June saw the Club exhibiting at the Royal Cornwall Show where we displayed *Corsair*, with lots of people coming to see us and have a go on the rowing machines! As a result some new members have joined.

A gig exhibition was also carefully negotiated with PISCES and it is now a permanent part of the PISCES rolling programme of annual exhibitions and an important part of the history of the village.

The visit of HRH Prince Charles to Port Isaac gave our beloved Jack Russell Terrier, Jenny, the 'Royal seal of approval' and made her even more famous! We were extremely honoured that our place in the community allowed *Corsair* to stand proud on the Platt on this Royal visit.

It was so good to see the friendly faces of so many of those with connections to the club at our formal celebratory Dinner Dance when our annual awards were made(details in last month's $\it Trio$.

Since 2010, the Club has raised thousands of pounds for charity and the members aim to donate around £1000 every year to their chosen charities. The Club has helped Shelterbox, Precious Lives, Cornwall Leukaemia Trust, Active8, Riding for the Disabled (North Cornwall), Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY), Merlin Appeal (for MS sufferers in Cornwall), Children's Hospice South West, RNLI, and in 2016 our nominated charities include Cornwall Wildlife Fund and St Petroc's for the Homeless.

A big thank you goes to the Fisherman's Friends who let the Club hold a fundraising BBQ when they sing on the Platt. Around 25% of funds raised are donated to charity.

Our 25th birthday has been wonderful to be a part of. It has been a fantastic year and we are so proud to fly under the Port Isaac Rowing Club

banner.

Websites of the Month

As I write this it is the first day of meteorological winter. The cold snap has brought with it some gloriously clear night skies. We also were treated last month to the 'Super Moon' when the Moon was closer to Earth than it had been since 1948 (if it hadn't been very cloudy that night!). So what does the web have to offer here when we have some nice clear nights ahead? I thought I would start with the Cornwall Astronomy Society http://www.cornwallas.org.uk. They are a group of amateur astronomers whose interests (according to their website) include: many areas of astronomy, cosmology, observing, astrophotographyand telescope building

On their website there is a good selection of members photographs – one of the red super moon is particularly stunning – leaflets for joining up, links to lots of other useful websites and a place add to buy and sell astronomy kit.

They also provide links to some programmes you can download onto your computer so you can have a planetarium. They say that stellarium is a good one http://stellarium.org and I tried the mac version and it worked well once you have set up your location. They also suggest for any new astronomers thinking of getting a telescope to have a look here http://www.scopereviews.com/begin.html.

They also have a link to the world famous Jodrell Bank Centre for Astrophysics website http://www.jb.man.ac.uk/astronomy/nightsky/ where you are given details about what to look out for in the sky each month. Currently it has details for December and as an example it describes the December 14th and 15th after midnight when you can see the Geminid Meteor Shower. It gives a brief description of what you are likely to see and advice on the best way to view. It also tells you about which planets are visible and bright.

While these are very good value, they can be a bit technical but the BBC Sky at Night Programme that started in 1957 presented by Sir Patrick Moore for over 55 years http://tinyurl.com/zsnvtkz is still going strong and its website has lots of very easy to understand pictures and instructions on how to get the best out of the sky.


Here in Cornwall we are particularly lucky as we can find places with relatively less light pollution than in other parts of the country and on these cold December nights you can get particularly good views of the stars and planets and you can play with this interactive map http://tinyurl.com/light-pollution-map that shows the amount of light in different parts of the world.

Finally there are some very good smartphone apps that take advantage of the compass that is built into the phones that have GPS capability. My favourite one is 'Pocket Universe' and you can download it from the app store – when I last looked it was $\mathfrak{L}2.29$. This is really easy to use. You simply point the phone in any direction and it shows you which stars and planets are visible. In the picture of the evening sky over St Endellion you can see a planet and with the Pocket Universe app I could tell that it was Venus shining brightly. There are more complicated apps – another rather similar has Stephen Hawking to explain things for example – and these may be more to your taste.

Anyway with a clear sky and little light pollution you can get a very good view of the stars and planets and with the apps and information on the web, I hope you have an enjoyable time.

Planning Applications

The following applications were received and Members made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

Martin's demo dish from the Padstow Christmas Festival

On Saturday December 4th, I got to demo a new dish that I have been working on at the Padstow Christmas festival.

This is an abridged version of the recipe to make it possible for anyone to try.

Smoked breast of Pheasant, chard, broccoli, pickled rhubarb and udon noodles in a miso stock

Smoking genuinely transforms the humble pheasant, into an elegant delicacy. Buy a cheap stove-top smoker or use a wok - coat the bottom in tin foil, add the smoking chips, place a cooling rack above and if you have a round rack that can be inserted into the wok, all the better, so long as it is at least three inches above the floor of the wok. Place the food to be smoked in the middle of the wok and cover with a lid or tin foil. Try and leave as much room for circulation above the food as possible.

Pickled Rhubarb

60g orange juice

60g lemon juice

60g castor sugar

60g rice wine vinegar

Bring all ingredients to the boil until the sugar has dissolved.

Chop 2 stalks of rhubarb into slices and place into a bowl, pour over the boiling pickling liquid and wrap with cling film and leave to cool. This will cook the rhubarb whilst infusing the flavour.

The Pheasant

2 oven ready pheasants - cut off the breasts and the legs, and use the rest of the bird, the carcass and drum sticks to make a stock (I would keep the thighs and confit them down to make another dish).

Brine

50g course salt 50g soft brown sugar

1 Lemon

bay leaf

Cardamom pods

Place all ingredients into a pan and cover with water, and simmer until the salt and sugar have dissolved, add 1 litre of cold water and let cool.

Once it is cool, place the pheasant breast into a container and cover with the brine, leave in a fridge overnight. This help draw all the blood and impurities out of the breast, and also season the bird. You will often find that some of the shot has been removed as well which is a bonus!

Smoking the bird

For the smoke if you can get your hands on them I would use apple wood chips for a more subtle taste, but oak will do, just remember less is more. If you use to much wood chips you will end up with a rancid, over smoked piece of meat. Place the breasts into the centre of the smoker leaving room for the smoke to circulate and on a medium heat, smoke for 10 mins. Leave to rest 10 mins before craving!



instead of pheasant stock!

400mls pheasant stock

1tbs miso paste(red)

1tbs sherry vinegar

1tbs dark soy

1tbs lemon juice

Bring all the ingredients to the boil, then reduce to a simmer.

Broccoli

Take 2 or 3 large heads of purple sprouting broccoli, remove the heads and the blanch in salted boiling water for 2 mins max, remove from the water and plunge into cold water to cool rapidly.

To serve

4 packets of udon noodles Place noodles into the miso stock to warm through add absorb the miso flavours.

Heat a pan to char the broccoli, when hot add the broccoli first and then a splash of oil, you want it to smoke and char this is all about adding flavour!

Slice the smoked Pheasant breast.

Using a sieve drain the noodles, but keep the stock and bring back to the boil add a splash of the pickling liquid from the rhubarb and reduce down, tasting all the time so it doesn't get to salty.

Build the plate, so some noodles, broccoli and then some pheasant, then repeat with noodles, broccoli and pheasant and finish with the reduced miso stock. Garnish with the pickled Rhubarb.

So that's it folks, and it only leaves me to wish you all a happy Christmas and from all the staff at the St Kew Inn to wish you a happy New Year. Mx


Other ways that Port Isaac is helping in Kosovo
