Port Isaac Co-op customers raise over £2500 for local causes

The Co-op's brilliant scheme to raise funds for local causes has done Port Isaac proud. Put simply, the Co-op has put itself at the heart of local life by sharing its success. The first "giving" period started back in September last year, running until April 2017, and the first pay out gave £875 to Port Isaac Village Hall, £868 to Port Isaac Stay & Playgroup and £846 to Concern Wadebridge.

Port Isaac Co-op manager, Darren Julian, is so supportive of local causes. "For over 170 years the Co-op has supported it's customers. I am delighted that with this new initiative we can help our local community and am very pleased that the money our customers have raised is staying with local causes."

Said Bonnie Baguley, Treasurer of the Stay & Playgroup, "We were so lucky to have been selected as one of the Co-op's three charities and we are absolutely thrilled with the money we have been given. Our plan is to use the money to provide a dedicated soft play area for our youngest children and to buy some new tables and chairs for the older ones."

Port Isaac Village Hall Committee were equally as thrilled, and the money they have received will go towards the new side extension to the Hall. Dee Littlechild, Hall Treasurer said, "We were so excited when the Co-op told us we had been chosen as one of the three charities in Port Isaac they were going to support, but we never dreamt that we would be given so much money. And it comes just at the right time. Work started on our new side extension in February and the footings and now finished. We can now buy more materials to make a start on the next stage." Not only does this money help the Village Hall, but in turn it supports everyone who uses the Hall, in particular the Stay & Playgroup who will doubly benefit. The new extension will house a modern kitchen and a multi-use toilet and baby changing area, all at floor level. "We would like to say a huge thank you to the Co-op and to all the Co-op customers who chose us as their cause," she continued. Speaking on behalf of the whole committee, Chairman Andy Penny said, "We cannot thank the Co-op enough for their support, not only with this scheme but also to Darren and his staff for letting us hold fundraising raffles and cake stalls instore during the year."

The third recipient is Concern Wadebridge which, whilst not based in Port Isaac aims to help the older members of our community. Said Andy Lyle, "Concern Wadebridge was thrilled to be nominated and also receive a donation from the Co-op Local Community Fund and appreciate the support given by people visiting Port Isaac Co-op. We are a small local charity based at The John Betjeman Centre in Wadebridge and support many people from our local area. We hope to use this money to develop Access Wadebridge, supporting local people by providing a community minibus and a shop mobility/holiday mobility scooter and wheelchair service."

Both the Stay & Playgroup and the Village Hall have been lucky enough to be part of the next round of funding – Concern Wadebridge is now one of Wadebridge Co-op's charities. It is so

Mel gives her support to so many fundraising events both in the village and in-store. "I try to lend a hand with fundraising wherever I can and am very pleased that we are able to help the youngest members of our community – these children are our future. In addition, the support for our Village Hall helps to make it a better place for everyone who uses it."

I am lucky enough to have married a partner who's parents live in the beautiful Port Gaverne. So as you can imagine we are often visiting and making the most of the free bed and board (and beer). We always have the most relaxing time and sleep heavily due to the fresh sea air. Except for our last visit. When out on a dog walk with our newly adopted Cocker Spaniel, he managed to slip under a gate on the coastal path and ended up falling over the cliff into the sea. You would have thought with his big ears he could have flown to safety but sadly not. Bugsy (our dog) ended up in the sea and started swimming into the shore. Within minutes holiday makers and locals noticed a problem and all were extremely helpful and kind but we couldn't see Bugsy anywhere. Then a local thankfully alerted the RNLI and within minutes they had saved Bugsy who had climbed up on to a rock in a small cave. Without their help this story would have had a very different outcome.



I am mainly writing this for two reasons. Firstly and most importantly to thank the amazing RNLI. They were true heroes and even seemed embarrassed when later we heaped praise (and of course some Doom Bar) on them. The team were fantastic and we will forever be indebted to all involved. The next reason is that we have been informed that in the last 6 months 3 dogs have gone over the cliff in the same place and not all with happy endings. I'm well aware that some people will be raising an eyebrow and thinking "keep the dog on a lead" but I can assure you that we are very conscientious dog owners. The coastal path is very secure and we were coming up to the car park and about to put the lead back on Bugsy when he slipped under the gate. We have also since been told that there is another gate that has the same problem close by.

Is it possible to raise awareness to the owners of these gates of what's happening? Apparently they're privately owned. I would be more than happy to do a mini fundraiser to raise funds to sort this out. Hey, and if there's any money left over it would mean more Doom Bar for the RNLI boys. I'll finish with a quote from Damien Bolton taken from the Port Isaac RNLI Facebook Page-

"As the senior helm at Port Isaac and on the shout yesterday I can vouch that this was a consequence of bad luck and the fence needs to be appropriately secured to eliminate the chance of this happening again as it is the third dog in six months.

The doom was lovely and we are delighted the pooch is doing well."

Reflective Days

The work of the North Cornwall Arts and Spirituality charity Endelienta in staging concerts, art exhibitions, residencies for writers, artists and composers, community activities and a book festival is becoming more and more widely known and appreciated, but what are the Endelienta reflective days?

As their name implies, these provide an opportunity to spend a day in reflection, but on a particular subject related to arts and spirituality. The days, usually a Saturday, are held at St Endellion and are led by people who are either skilled practitioners in that area, or who have particular knowledge or interest in the subject.

Among the reflective days held during the last few years have been ones on the Modern Novel, D.H. Lawrence, the composer George Butterworth, A Midsummer Night's Dream, First World War Poets and the Book of Common Prayer, as well as poetry workshops and a workshop on the Community of Taize.

In April, Quaker Carol Miller led a day on 'Praying the Psalms' and artist and priest David Marl, whose paintings are being exhibited in St Endellion Church Hall and later in Truro Cathedral, also led a reflective day on the subject of 'Painting as Pilgrimage.' Poet Alyson Hallett, who took part in the residency programme last year, will lead a workshop on the 13th May and on 24th June Revd Dr John Binns, an authority on Orthodox Christianity will present his subject.

People are welcome to attend all or part of the day and the cost is usually £10. Each day begins with coffee and biscuits in St Endellion Church Hall, before going over to the church. Those who come will need to bring a picnic lunch.

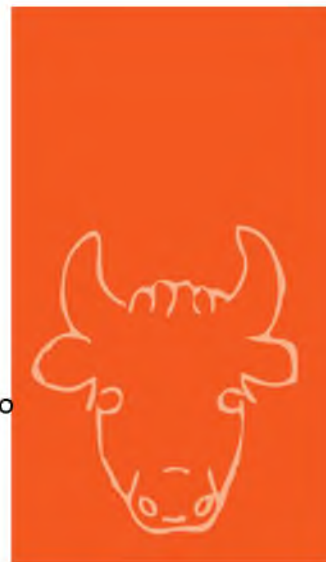

I was born and raised in St Minver, part of a large local family, and have always taken a keen interest in my local area and the issues surrounding it. This interest led me to serve as a Parish Councillor, a role I have thoroughly enjoyed over the past eight years. In this capacity I have been closely involved with the St Minver Parish Neighbourhood Plan, focusing on the sustainable development of the area over the next twenty years.

Having lived and worked locally all my life, I feel I have a good understanding of the area and the issues that are important to local people. If elected I would work hard to represent the views of our parishes at county level.

ANDY PENNY

YOUR INDEPENDENT CHOICE FOR CORNWALL COUNCIL

I live and work in Port Isaac with Alison, who I have been married to for 31 years. We have three children and three grandchildren.

Since being elected to Cornwall Council in 2013 a lot has changed, change made inevitable by the new round of cuts from central government of £192 million over the four years. 30% of jobs at Cornwall Council bore the brunt of these cuts, followed by all departments having to

make similar budget savings, some by efficiency savings others by reduction in service. 'Devolution' became the new buzz word, finding other groups to run services that Cornwall Council no longer had the funds to operate, and this has impacted locally.

PUBLIC TOILETS - Most of the public toilets in Cornwall have been taken on by town and parish councils with a 20p entry charge to help offset the costs. Some parish councils made the decision to invest in major changes. St Endellion took control of one toilet block, reconfiguring them to one set of 'unisex' toilets

with the rest of the building to be leased as a local retail outlet to provide an important income to pay for the running costs.

WASTE & RECYCLING - have not escaped changes. A recent pilot in Port Isaac to separate commercial waste from domestic waste collection threw up a good few problems but also provided good feedback to enable rolling out the system through Cornwall in the near future. Mixed plastics collections also had their own pilots in areas of Cornwall and I would expect this to be added to our current fortnightly recycling collections soon.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT - locally, the St Minver Neighbourhood Development Plan nears completion with a referendum alongside the local council elections. One key element of this plan is the 'full residential' clause on new builds, something which should go some way towards protecting our local communities and local workforce.

SOCIAL CARE - costs are rising year on year and we need more radical help from government, not just the ability to raise an additional ring fenced 2% on the council tax. Cuts to local NHS budgets of £284 million will have a devastating effect on our rural parishes.

HOUSING - council houses are once again being built in Cornwall, fifteen being completed in Looe and nine in Bodmin. Also 719 new affordable homes have been built in the county, the highest amount in the country.

HIGHWAYS - the highways budget had some relief with support from councillors, including myself, to freeze rather than cut the amount of money available to maintain our road network. Cornwall Council and CORMAC will be trialling innovative new technology with the potential to reduce vehicle emissions and improve air quality. Cornwall Council has been awarded a grant of £236,650 by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) as part of this year's Air Quality Grant scheme.

LIBRARIES - changes to Library provision saw some of the greatest concern, again looking to local councils and voluntary groups for help. The changes have therefore been limited to reduced opening hours, looking to ensure, where possible, neighbouring libraries have different opening hours so if one is closed another is open.

So change has hit us hard. But our decision to go for a four year budget with radical changes to services, early on has enabled us to create a platform for moving forward. We still have further reduction in grants from central government to cope with but in exchange we will retain 100% of the business rate and with that the incentive to support new, innovative and growing businesses.

I will strive to keep a strong Independent voice for St Minver and St Endellion and Cornwall. It is vital for an open and transparent council, keeping party politics firmly in Whitehall.

Port Isaac School Ofsted Inspection

As many people will know we had our Ofsted Inspection on 21st March and we are delighted to report that the school 'continues to be good'. The report was very positive with the school described as 'a vibrant, cohesive community. Pupils are cheerful and polite. They behave well and are strongly focused on getting the best out of their education.'

The inspector was particularly impressed with the teaching of mathematics at the school reporting that 'pupils enjoy studying mathematics and their books show a strong commitment to doing their best. Pupils are resilient when faced with difficulty. They do not give up and have well-established techniques to help them solve challenging problems. The work in their mathematics books is well set out and neatly presented.'

We have recently made changes to the way we teach the youngest children (Early Years Foundation Stage – EYFS) in the school so that as well as having daily phonics and maths lessons they have more time to follow their own interests. The inspector was impressed with the tight structure underpinning our EYFS curriculum: 'The school has recently introduced a new way of recording children's progress. These learning journeys show that assessment in the early years is robust, accurate and well evidenced. It is focused consistently on identifying the next steps that children need to take and helping them to do so. As a result of this effective assessment and teaching, children make good progress towards their early learning goals. For example, their writing develops well, as does their understanding of aspects of mathematics, such as shape, space and measure.'

As headteacher I am delighted that the inspector recognised the high quality of teaching provided by my colleagues. We are continually evaluating and improving teaching and it was pleasing that the inspector validated our judgements and the improvements we have made.

I was also very pleased that the inspector has praised the attitudes of our children, recognising their perseverance, resilience and strong commitment to do their best. During one lesson the inspector was most impressed when he heard on child say to another; 'Come on, we can't give up we'll try another way.' We have worked hard to instil a growth mind-set throughout the school and to help children understand that failure is good and that we can learn from our mistakes and this positive approach was very apparent throughout the school.

I would also like to thank the parents all for their support. The feedback on Parent View was overwhelmingly positive as were the conversations the inspector held at the school gate.

Whilst the day of Ofsted was quite busy, my overriding memories were of the inspector being pretty much snowed under with the huge amount of evidence he was shown as to why Port Isaac is such a successful school and the great sense of pride I felt that what he saw on 21st of March was exactly the same high quality education the children receive every day.

A letter to the public from Parish Cllr Nicola Williams

Will we ever get a new Post Office?

You will know if you read our Parish Council Minutes that we have been negotiating restoration of Post Office services to Port Isaac. In the face of local closures at St Kew, Rock and with Delabole soon to follow provision is even more pressing.

You will also know we purchased the New Rd Public Conveniences for the nominal sum of £1 under a scheme offered by Cornwall Council to prevent their closure. It was retired Cllr David Philp's vision to utilise the under used seaward shelter and convert it into a retail unit. I was always of the opinion if we were to expend the profit from the Main Car Park to develop the building it must provide a public dividend.

I remain adamant that dividend should be restoration of Post Office services to the Parish, policy supported by the majority of our Parish Council and by Cornwall Cllr & PC member Andy Penny. We were frustrated in our initial effort to provide PO services under the Outreach scheme which relies on local PO's offering their services to a host business or community space, (it was this service lost when the Church Rooms closed). As local P Offices close no offers to provide Outreach service have been forthcoming. We opted to advertise the tenancy for lease to someone who would be prepared to offer PO services under the PO Local scheme, which sees full time PO services hosted in retail units. The difficulty with this scheme is apparently the space required. Both 2 local candidates we shortlisted were initially prepared to do so, however both have now withdrawn as they think the space is inordinate despite dual usage and despite a lower than average lease in consideration.

Left without a tenant and thinking laterally, it seems we might yet have another option. We could run the shop ourselves and employ someone to complete the PO training. This is not such a strange option as one might imagine. As recently as February, Lostwithiel Town Council considered a similar plan although they withdrew as it would have entailed an increase in their Council Tax precept to fund it. We have no such difficulty. We are in an enviably secure financial position due to the income afforded by our Car Park.

But, and this is a big BUT, for this plan to work we need strong public support. It's apparent to me, to date there has been little observable larger public benefit from the profits derived from our Car Park. Many said the CP would not deliver a Parish wide public dividend. It's true, there aren't many visible schemes which benefit the whole Parish. It's taken some time to see

improvements to the Play Area in the Playing Fields, however they are soon to be realised. Plans progress for more Public Conveniences at the Playing Fields which will provide shelter & a refreshment kiosk.

I firmly believe benefit must be driven both by demand and the will to deliver. We must be prepared to voice support for our intended target, the public benefit gained from our 90K+ investment in long awaited Post Officer services in the New Rd retail unit, investment which scored an 81% approval in a PC conducted poll. Without the addition of PO services, it's a mighty sum of your money have spent with little public gain.

I remain committed to the delivery of Post Office services in a lively hub where volunteers sell tickets for local events, has a live local accommodation availability feed and where visitor information is imparted in a nice friendly space with a view to die for!

Delivery entails a serious commitment from Parish Cllrs to prepare a credible Business Plan and supply ongoing management, an onerous task. It's not a commitment to be taken lightly.

Websites of the Month

The display of wild flowers on our cliffs and footpaths have been really wonderful. So this month I thought it would be good to check out what you can find online. As a general introduction the website of the Cornwall Wildlife Trust is a good start <http://www.cornwallwildlifetrust.org.uk/wildlife/species-explorer/wildflowers>. It has a good selection with photographs of over 200 species. Each flower's typical character is described together with its habitat and where they can be found. It also encourages us to take on the role of wildlife recorder and gives links to the various ways in which wildlife is kept on databases both in Cornwall and nationally.

If you can't match your flower to any of the photographs another couple of websites might be worth a look. These both work as proper 'floras'. Floras are the proper way of identifying plants using botanical criteria. I remember being given a flora many years ago and getting some pleasure from being able to identify plants from, for example, the shape of the leaves, or the way the leaves alternate on the stems. These online floras make life a bit easier. The first one, <http://www.botanicalkeys.co.uk/flora/> is run by the Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland. The way this one works is to give you a sort of questionnaire. If you know the name of the flower, or you think you might, you can just enter that and see what comes up. It will give you details of the plant, but there doesn't seem to be any pictures. A few of the links were broken but on the whole works well. It has a link to the local Cornwall group <http://www.botanicalcornwall.co.uk> and here you can get a good overview of the botany of our County. Again, some sections of this site need a bit of attention, but one has a good account of the rare plants of Cornwall <http://www.botanicalcornwall.co.uk/rare-plant-register-project/> and is well worth a look.

A final site that is helpful here is one called wild flower finder <http://wildflowerfinder.org.uk> and is rather extraordinary, in that it has so many plants listed all with great detail and with pictures to go with it. It isn't just for Cornwall so includes many species you won't find here. As the author, R.W. Darlington says:

"This resource for wild flowers occurring in the UK is searchable by colour, month, habitat, number of petals, flower symmetry and all manner of other parameters by which identification of a flower may be narrowed down. It includes 1000's of photographs. Plus the structural formulae of hundreds of plant compounds: dyes, herbs, poisons, pharmaceuticals, smells, etc. There is also a wealth of extra information and other resources at hand."

If you want books about wild flowers, you could do worse than download some ebooks. Back in 2015 I wrote a column about ebooks and how you could get them (see <http://www.portisaacheritage.co.uk/downloads/trio/TRIO%202015-07.PDF>) . When electronic books came out, people said it would be the end of ordinary books, but far from it. Over the past few years, books have become even more popular. If you go to <http://tinyurl.com/papyrus-to-pixels> you can see a really nice animated account of the move to digital books. Although it is described as the future of the book, really it is a well-presented history of books and publishing. In any event it does show that book popularity has not declined.

For ebooks themselves, a good place to start is project Gutenberg <https://www.gutenberg.org>. There are over 53,000 free ebooks that can be downloaded. Many are classic texts and a quick search for Cornwall found quite a few. One called "The Cornwall Coast" by Arthur L. Salmon from 1908 has some good black and white pictures and describes some of the flowers you can find along the way.

The books are fully searchable, some are just text and some come with pictures. I also downloaded, "The Book of Cornwall" S. Baring-Gould, 1906. It has some great pictures and, I noticed it mentioned Port Isaac Road station and as I included that in last month's column, it was interesting to see it again. The author says:

"In the neighbourhood of Camelford are several very charming old mansions of Cornish families, small but eminently picturesque, all now converted into farmhouses. In next generation they will not be considered good enough for labourers. One of these is Penrose in S. Tudy, another Trewane, hard by the station of Port Isaac Road. Both these belonged to the Nicholls family, to two brothers it is said, and the magnificent carved slate monuments of the family are to be seen in S. Tudy Church. The slate in this district was sculptured in a way really marvellous, and there are numerous examples in the churches round. In S. Endellion are Treshunger, the seat of the Matthews family, and Rosecarrock--a fragment only." Excerpt From: S. Baring-Gould. "A Book of Cornwall." iBooks.

I tried to find out how to use the Cornwall library ebook system, <http://tinyurl.com/Cornwall-library-ebooks-etc> as you can download both ebooks and audio books, but it was a bit complicated. I had an online chat with someone from the library but they couldn't help. I emailed and am awaiting a reply. I think it is a good resource so will report next month.

The start of the short British asparagus season is my favourite time of year, and for the next six weeks will be on the menu at the St Kew Inn. Asparagus is commonplace these days at the supermarket, but it is always worth hunting out those fresh green spears from a local food market. This year our asparagus is being supplied from St Enodoc. Fresh is best.

St Enodoc Asparagus, poached duck egg & Parma ham



INGREDIENTS

4 duck eggs
2 tbsp of white wine vinegar
16 asparagus spears
salt
black pepper
sour dough bread
25g of grain mustard
50ml of olive oil
10ml of white wine vinegar
1 1/2 tbsp of honey
4 slices of Parma ham
1 tbsp of chives, finely chopped
salt & black pepper



For the dressing

combine the mustard, olive oil, honey and vinegar and mix well to create the vinaigrette. Set aside.

Prepare the asparagus

by removing the woody bases and peeling the bottom of the stem, you can keep the peelings and the stems to make a soup.

Bring 2 large pans of water to the boil and heavily season one of them with salt. Add 2 tbsp of vinegar to the other one.

Place the asparagus in the salted water and boil for 2 minute until tender. Cool rapidly in iced water.

Grill 4 slices of bread.

Crack the eggs into 4 individual cups and, using a whisk, stir the vinegar water vigorously to create a whirlpool. Working quickly, gently place the eggs one by one into the centre of the whirlpool and allow the water to simmer. Poach the eggs for approximately 3 minutes until still runny inside. Lift from the water with a slotted spoon and keep warm

Gently fry the asparagus spears with butter to warm them through, season with salt and pepper.

On four warm serving plates, place a slice of toast, divide the asparagus spears and place a slice of ham over them. Top with a warm egg and drizzle with the vinaigrette. Season the top of the eggs with salt and pepper and sprinkle with some chopped chives.

Please give this recipe a go, it is very easy to do and you will be rewarded.

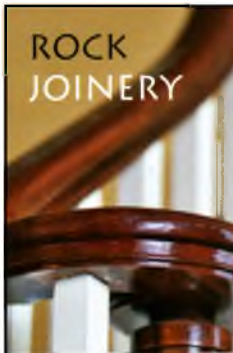

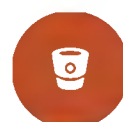
