





Members of Port Isaac Crew supported the national RNLI MAYDAY appeal on the West Country leg of the 'Yellow Welly relay'. transporting a specially prepared boot and stocks of lapel pins on the fourth stage of it's journey.

This RNLI fundraising event, aimed at covering costs of Lifeboat Crewman equipment, started off at Ilfracombe Lifeboat Station then to Clovelly and to Bude ... who then delivered the boot direct to Port Isaac RNLI by high speed motorbike delivery provided by Bude Lifeboat Crewman Dean Thomson. Waiting to effect a high speed transfer for its onwards journey by sea was Lifeboat Manager Chris Bolton, Senior crewman and Training Officer Damien Bolton and crew Nikki Bradbury and Andy Hallam who were manning a private RIB. A good turnout of other crew and committee members waved off the intrepid mariners on passage to Newquay including members of the Nathan Outlaw's *Fish Kitchen* and popular *Doc Martin* actor, Ian McNeice who plays Bert Large. All are valued supporters of Port Isaac RNLI. Over £600 was raised from donations and sales of memorabilia and the all important 'Yellow Welly' pins.

Following what our crew termed as a fairly 'bumpy passage'! a smooth handover was made to Newquay RNLI who then took the boot on to St Agnes RNLI with forward routing covering St Ives, Sennen Cove, Penlee, The Lizard, Falmouth, Fowey, Looe, Plymouth and finally to Salcombe, crossing the finishing line at Dartmouth.



STARTIN 'EM YOUNG IN PORT ISAAC

A recent article in the Waitrose Weekend supplement was a prime example of the passing down of fishing skills from father to son that has taken place in Port Isaac since it was first recognised as a fishing village back in the Middle Ages.

It was William Greenhalgh, son of Tracey & Callum, who featured in the *Waitrose Weekend* supplement. Talking about 'My Weekend' William, 13, tells how he spends weekends with his Dad on their boat, catching shellfish for his Mum to sell in the family shop, *Fresh from the Sea*

Says William, "I've been going out on the boat for as long as I can remember, but last year I started helping Dad properly. We leave the house at 5am, depending on the tide - I don't mind getting up that early, I'm used to it. We drive to the beach, then scull the dinghy out to our Boat, *Mary D*, moored in the harbour.

"We're normally out at sea for about six hours. We'll alrady have put pots out, tied together at intervals on a rope, so we swing them into the boat on a winch and see what's in them - sometimes there's lots of empty ones but it's exciting when we find a lobster. If it's under a certain size or carrying eggs (called a berried hen), we have to put it back. My Dad works with the National Lobster Hatchery and we're part of a voluntary V-notching scheme, which means we have a little device to cut a V in the lobster's tail if it's carrying eggs. It's a bit like clipping your fingernail and takes three years to grow out. To help conserve numbers its EU regulation to not land a lobster with these marks but Dad has a special licence and lands some of them for the National Lobers Hatchery to collect. The baby lobsters have a much better chance of survival in the Hatchery with no predators. The juveniles are released back into the sea.

"I want to carry on lobster fishing when I am older and do marine engineering at university. I also hope Dad will let me carry on the family business!"

There will be a marquee should it be wet and the audience will be able to enjoy a barbeque and Pimms bar. Further ahead we will be joining with The Minstrels in July to do a joint concert and also look forward to Songs on the River at Lostwithiel in August. More details next month.



Parish Council report supplied to Trio by the Parish Clerk

Parish Council's Annual Meeting

At its Annual Meeting, Members unanimously re-elected Cllr David Raynor as Chair and Cllr Mike Coles as Vice Chair for 2017/18.

Council Meetings

Members have agreed to hold two meetings of the Full Council each month, in place of the current Committee Structure. The first meeting of the month will be the 'main' meeting. The emphasis of the second meeting will be Amenities (including the Car Park) and urgent finance and planning matters.

Planning Applications

The following applications were received and Members made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

- 1. PA16/12129, Land SE of Treswarrow Park Farm change of use of 0.5ha of agricultural land to a caravan site on which to site a maximum of 4 shepherds hut for holiday letting with associated landscaping and parking area. The huts had been moved approximately 300m to the West. Members were unanimously in SUPPORT of the proposal and hope the resiting of the shepherds' huts will allay neighbour concerns.
- 2. PA17/02693, 37 Fore Street, Port Isaac existing lean-to demolished and new proposed lean-to constructed in its place. Replacement windows, re-rendering / painting and new window and door openings in existing cottage dwelling. Detailed local knowledge led Members to comment positively in terms of the new fenestration. Members were in SUPPORT of the proposal 9-1 in favour, but had reservations about the safety of the door opening outwards.
- 3. PA17/02694, 37 Fore Street, Port Isaac LBC. Existing lean-to demolished and new proposed lean-to constructed in its place. Replacement windows, re-rendering / painting and new window and door openings in existing cottage dwelling. As PA17/02693 above.
- 4. PA17/03466, Land to the S of Silvershell View, Port Isaac proposed new single storey dwelling.

Discussion focussed on the historic development boundary and whether it should be observed. Concern was expressed a precedent would be set if the proposal is permitted to develop the valley sides incrementally, causing harm to both the AONB and the Conservation Area which the proposal abuts. Objections focussed on visibility from within the CA, the

"lung" of the field below Silvershell View, intended to visually frame the CA.

Objectors felt the integrity of the CA would be harmed and precedent set for open market development outside of the historic boundary.

Support focussed on the provision of housing for a local family and the desirability of building housing for local people. Objectors observed the proposal is not an affordable one, and for that reason cannot be considered an exception site. Members voted 4 against and 5 in favour. **SUPPORT.**

Telephone Boxes

The parish council has purchased the defunct telephone kiosk in Trelights. Residents of Trelights are currently raising funds to purchase a defibrillator and it is envisaged it will be housed in the kiosk.

From the mines in the cantos of Dante, to the prizes stolen in the wars of the 'nineties, a silver thread winds through Balkan history. This book unravels its most intricate tanglings from the incongruous filigree fashion show in the Albanian highlands to the serious Yugoslav-era silver schools. En route I visit those who live from lifting the silver from the earth, craftsmen from Istanbul to Kosovo who produce lacy creations from dull sticks of raw material, impoverished collectors who've sold their homes in order to preserve exquisite pieces of jewellery when their governments won't bother, and a brave new generation of women working fragile miracles with hard metals to secure their independence.

The book accompanies a series of talks I'm giving about silver filigree and is only available from me (ie not from Amazon etc). The book is 164pp with some beautiful photographs showing

exquisite filigree, the cast of characters who work with silver, and the wonderful Balkan locations joined together by these silver threads. It costs £7.50 (including delivery). If you would like a copy please let me know (including whether you'd like it signed or inscribed as a gift for someone else)!

Likewise, if you know a group who would be interested in me giving an illustrated talk on the journey and encounters that forms the book's narrative, do pass this information on or get in touch.

Also launching with my book is a new range of silver filigree greetings cards made in our social

enterprise in Kosovo. They incorporate a silver ornament made (as described in the book) by a co-operative in Prizren and assembled by rural women supported by my SaPune social enterprise. The cards are ideal for birthdays, weddings or christenings, and the silver ornament can be snipped off and worn as a pendant or treasured as a keepsake. The cards cost £3 each. One of the fun aspects is just reading about her being a tidying fanatic from a very young child and then turning it into this consultancy business where she visits people's homes and helps them get rid of everything they don't want (or doesn't spark joy in her terms). Quite what sparking joy is I'm not too sure. I suppose it is a very individual thing and means what makes you feel happy. She says if you think too much about it you end up keeping things you don't actually need. As well as the books and the websites there is an app that you can download from the Apple Store that will guide you through your tidying process. It is amazing what an industry this has become with lots of programmes on the tele. At least I think its an opportunity to recycle things that we don't need.

Decluttering and organising has become such a big business there is now an "Association of Professional Declutterers and Organisers" https://www.apdo.co.uk that was founded in 2004 and has nearly 200 accredited experts. They have a national spring cleaning week in March. On their website they also mention National Clear Your Clutter Day 2017 (March 11th it was) and is sponsored by Money Magpie founded by Jasmine Birtles to promote ways people can dispose of things they don't need (among other things). The section of the website that covers decluttering is www.moneymapgpie.com/clear-you-clutter-day and describes four methods, sell, swap, upcycle (alter them to re-use of give as presents) or recycle.

So when you have done your decluttering where can you recycle things locally? Well there is our local recycling centre (known around here as Bowithick Tip https://

tinyurl.com/Bowithick-tip where you can take quite a range of things. They say on their website that RESOURCE www.myresource.org.uk collect reusable items of furniture to repair and sell on from their outlet in Bodmin. Another useful organisation is Freecycle https:// groups.freecycle.org/group/WadebridgeUK/ posts/all where you can post about what you have that you would like to pass on, and also what you need. Alternatives include Freegle, www.ilovefreegle.org and Recycle now www.recyclenow.com. Happy Spring Cleaning!

Finally, I was trying to find out last month about how the local library ebooks system worked and I received this email back with the information and I hope its useful.

"I am afraid that we do not subscribe to the cloudlibrary any longer – our subscription ended at 31 March 2017. Our contracted ebook supplier is Borrowbox and it is very easy to use, particularly if using a tablet or smartphone where the free app can be downloaded.

PORT ISAAC CARNIVAL SEPTEMBER

The Holiday Camp at Port Gaverne

Whilst looking through some of Maggie Cook's things, Janet Cook came upon a copy of *The Cornish Magazine*, edited by AT Quiller-Couch, Volume 1, July-December 1898. Included in the magazine was an article about Port Gaverne and here are some extracts from it. The full article and all the pictures will soon be on the PISCES website, www.portisaacheritage.co.uk as part of the *Wish You Were Here* exhibition.

The 'Sixties' as the locals called the party

The Hawkstone Hall Institute (Christ Church, Westminster Bridge Road, London) has for eight years held a fourteen days' holiday camp for its members ... this year at Port Gaverne.

In a sentence, the object of the Institute Camp is to provide a healthy holiday amidst the environment of nature's most romantic surroundings, to give a maximum of real pleasure at a minimum of cost to those who otherwise would not have the opportunity of visiting such places ...

The reader may well ask: "Why invade the quietness of a tiny hamlet and so double or treble its population for a fortnight?" In reply it might be explained that 'camping out' is a somewhat misleading term to a party who live in a fish cellar.

The building fortunately secured for the camp's headquarters was spacious and convenient ... Being situated at the charming little cove of Port Gaverne, just above the beach, facing the wide blue Atlantic, and at the foot of a lovely valley intersected by pretty glades, it has proved to be an ideal spot for young fellows to spend a pleasant, invigorating and inexpensive holiday.

It was soon discovered that the bracing air sharpened the appetites of the new arrivals ... breakfast was 8am, dinner 1pm, tea 5pm and supper 9pm ... breakfast menu of oatmeal porridge as a foundation, eggs or fish, and preserve with cocoa ...

During meals it was usual to call the roll ... and often after-dinner speeches, famed for wit and eloquence, provided a continual feast for merry heats, and so materially aided digestion ... lights were extinguished at 10.15pm and 'no talking after lights out' ...

The morning bathe was a recognised institution. How delightful to turn out of bed and plunge into the sparking water ...

The campers made fast friends with the worthy fishermen, and were invited, for a small consideration, to accompany them on fishing expeditions, visits which often yielded welcome additions to the larder ... the sea excursions somehow were always provocative of extravagant hilarity and almost boisterous mirth. Perhaps the wonderful breadth of sea and coast, with gloriouis sky-scenery above, unconsciously affected the temperaments of the men ...

Of the genuine kindness and hearty Cornish welcome shown by the many friends at Port Gaverne and Port Isaac, there was a daily

practical experience' and the

campers were glad, one and all, to show their appreciation by giving a concert for local charities ... The ladies of the neighbourhood too graced the 'at homes' and musical evenings

There was spent a fornight of unsullied

happiness, such as no fashionable watering-place could have provided ...how much pleasure, at a small cost, if a band of young men are willing to exercise the best of Christian graces and to forfeit, for the time being, a few of the luxuries of life.

Lobster Hatchery Visit

Cat, a marine biologist, who works at the Lobster Hatchery in Padstow, came into school and gave a very lively, informative talk to the children. We learned all about a lobster's life cycle and the work that goes on in the hatchery. She brought along young lobsters for us to look at and left us with some activities and games. Everyone agreed it was a hugely interesting morning.



Wild Writing

This half term both classes will be out and about finding inspiration for their writing. We will be going to Port Gaverne and up onto Lobber and possibly Lanhydrock.

Coastal Foraging & Lobster Release at Trevone Beach

The National Lobster Hatchery, a marine conservation, research and education charity based in Cornwall, were delighted to join forces with Wild Thymes to run a coastal foraging workshop combined with a lobster release at Trevone. A group of 30 participants gathered on the beach, each adopting and naming their very own little lobster before watching them being released back into the sea. In this way 100 little baby lobsters, including "Snappy", "Lobstey" and "Steve" were given a head start in life, and participants were able to put something back after enjoying treats from nature's larder in the form of foraged seaweed nibbles. By raising lobsters though their vulnerable planktonic larval stages with TLC at the Hatchery before releasing them on to the seabed, their chances of survival are hugely increased.

Local foraging expert, Megan Adams from Wild Thymes, shared her extensive knowledge of coastal foraging, explaining the medicinal, nutritious and delicious uses of seaweeds and shoreline plants. Participants learned which plants are good to eat, discussed recipe ideas, and practiced sustainable harvest techniques. The day ended with a fantastic selection of pre-prepared tasters, including yummy nettle pesto, sorrel raita, foraged bhaji's and some seaweed scones!



and, although Gooseberry sauce sounds like an odd thing to combine with mackerel, the two come into season at more or less the same time and the acidity of the gooseberries complements mackerel perfectly.

Pan fried Mackerel with Gooseberries

4 whole mackerel, gutted and cleaned
2 tbsp olive oil
1/2 lemon, juice only
60 g unsalted butter
50 g caster sugar
400 g gooseberries, washed and drained
25 g ginger, finely chopped or grated
1 orange, zest only

For the tarragon vinaigrette
160 ml white wine vinegar
500 ml extra virgin olive oil
1/2 tsp lemon juice
25g tarragon, lightly bruised
2 cloves garlic, crushed

Wash the fish under cold running water and dry thoroughly with kitchen paper. Turn the fish on its side and fillet it, cutting down each side of the backbone. Discard the bone remove any pin-bones from the fillets by cutting a small V shaped cut down the middle of the fillet, you will see a natural line in the fillet to follow, pull out this strip and you will have a pin boned fillet

Melt half the butter in a small lidded pan and add the sugar. Stir in the gooseberries, ginger and orange zest. Cover with the lid and cook on a gentle heat for 5 minutes. Remove the lid and turn up the heat to evaporate the liquid, stirring occasionally. This should take about 10 minutes. Put the sauce to one side and keep warm.

In a large frying pan, heat the olive oil until it is smoking hot. Lay the mackerel fillets in the pan flesh-side down and fry for 3 minutes or until golden brown. Turn over and cook the other side for 30 seconds. Add half of the butter to the pan and when it melts and begins to foam the fillets are ready. Finish with a squeeze of lemon.

For the tarragon vinaigrette: put the vinegar in a mixing bowl and season with salt and pepper, whisking until the salt has dissolved. Pour in the oil, while whisking, followed by a few drops of lemon juice to lift the seasoning. Add the smashed garlic cloves and tarragon and leave to infuse.

Put the salad leaves in a separate bowl and dress with the vinaigrette just before serving. Place the mackerel onto serving plates with a spoonful of the gooseberry sauce on the side and the dressed salad leaves.

Hope you give this a try. Until the next time, enjoy Mx

Horvest of the sea shool of fish

Some Fishy business has already started in the village to celebrate the Harvest of the Sea that will take place in the autumn.

The plan is to include as many village organisations as possible to create a wonderful community Shool of Fish to celebrate our rich fishing heritage. The installation, which will be hung in our village church, will be central to the events

planned for both the School and the St Peter's Chyrcg Harvest Festivals

that will be on September 29th and October 1st respectively.



Backland has been commissioned to document the whole project in bitesized pieces which she will edit together to create a film to be part of the Harvest Celebrations. This will then be donated to PISCES for its historical archives; a timepiece showing the lives of the young and the old in Port Isaac in 2017.





The School has been given three creative sessions and three more for the after school AP+ Club for the children to work alongside artists to make fish and larger items for the Harvest event. Skills they have learnt from previous projects have enabled them to now construct a large fish which can be used as a film screen and also be used in the village Carnival in September.

Alongside this the children, with the help of Janet Townsend, will be learning a traditional shanty and funding for the project will also pay for a series of free music sessions to create a musical soundscape for the film.



To share our Pishing heritage with the younger generation, local Pishermen have been invited into school to share their stories and demonstrate knot and net making. They will also help generate questions that can be shared and answered by the older members of our community.

With the village and the school's strong links with Kosovo and The Ideas Partnership, a huge pelican, a symbol of the Balkans, will be created from recycled materials gathered from local beach cleans. The community in Kosovo will also be making fish and sending them over to add to our shoal ... a powerful symbol of our community nurturing and helping others less fortunate than ourselves.

clean for materials for making the **Pelican**.




