
It's been a pretty busy time of late. We sang at the Wadebridge Beer and Treverbyn Festivals and are now busy planning our Carnival Float ...

for their King and country never came home, and


nobody who lived through that terrible time came out unscathed. One hundred years later it is time for our country to commemorate the ending of this now distant generation.

Port Isaac inshore lifeboat was tasked at 21:05 on Saturday July 21st to reports of three boys cut off by the tide at Benoath Cove, west of Rocky Valley. Port Isaac RNLI conducted a search up and down the shore line from Bossiney all the way up to Rocky Valley. With Boscastle and Polzeath Coastguards also in attendance with the search, it was starting to become clear that the boys had manged to scramble up a path to safety and leave the scene.

After talking to the first informant about the three boys and their location, it was decided to stand down everyone involved after it was clear they had managed to get back up themselves. The first informant did the right thing and dialled 999 and ask for the Coastguards.

Meet the pawsome stars of the RNLI's dog safety campaign

The #RNLITopDog campaign ran at the Royal Cornwall Show offered dog owners the chance for their canine companions be featured in the RNLI's new dog safety messages. 294 dogs were photographed with Dash, a cavalier king Charles; Buddy, a cockapoo; and Louie, a collie cross, chosen as the top dogs. All three dogs will be featured in RNLI dog safety posters that will be put out in the south west throughout the school summer holidays.

The three dogs, along with their owners, visited Port Isaac RNLI lifeboat station to meet the crew and hear their stories of dog rescues. Bob Bulgin, Port Isaac RNLI chairman, said: 'It was fantastic to meet Dash, Buddy, Louie and their owners. Almost half of the incidents the Port Isaac volunteer RNLI lifeboat crew have dealt with this year were dog related so this was a great opportunity for the crew here to share their stories and spread the dog safety messages – especially with the busy summer season about to start.'

Simon Hannaford, RNLI Community Safety Officer, said: 'When a pet does in get into trouble, often the owners want to try and help them but, by doing so, put themselves into danger. In 2015, 119 dog walkers were rescued around the UK coastline. If you are worried about your dog at all, do not hesitate to call 999 and ask for the Coastguard.'

Scott Mann's update from Parliament

Early in July I was delighted to join hundreds of North Cornwall residents in walking three miles through Launceston to raise money for a rare cancer unit at Derriford Hospital. The champion of this great cause, Val Bugden-Cawsey, who is a local town councillor and a member of my team, was diagnosed with malignant melanoma six years ago which has now developed into terminal cancer. After receiving such sad news, Val has committed herself to raising money for a rare cancer unit at Derriford so that more people in the South West can overcome rare and aggressive cancers.

In typical fashion, Val brought a smile to the face of everyone as she arrived at Launceston Medical Centre in her Union Jack dress, armed with a megaphone. The event saw hundreds of people of all ages showing their support, with nearly £10,000 being raised. Val is an inspiration to us all, and I know the whole Launceston community is immensely thankful and proud of her for her public service, her campaigning and her efforts to raise money for this very important cause.

It was also in early July that we marked the 70th Anniversary of the creation of the NHS, which was marked through a number of events around the country. The NHS provides an amazing service and we are all very fortunate to a health service which is free at the point of use. To mark the anniversary, the Government announced an extra £6.7 million for the South Western Ambulance Service, which will see an additional 60 vehicles operating in Cornwall and the South West.

The rural nature of Cornwall is a challenge for our ambulance service because vehicles and paramedic teams have to travel many miles to



reach emergencies, and these new vehicles will be a great boost for the people of Cornwall.

Halfway through the month we then saw a significant development on Brexit, with the Cabinet meeting at Chequers to agree proposals for the UK's future relationship



with the EU. The proposals include a free trade area and a new customs arrangement which, in theory, would allow frictionless trade between the UK and mainland Europe. Although I want to see as frictionless trade as possible, the proposals did also include a common rule book which would likely see the UK being bound by EU rules, as well as judgements by the European Court of Justice.

One of the main reasons I advocated Brexit and why people voted for Brexit was for the UK to have independence in setting its own laws and having its own trade and customs policies, with our courts no longer having to adhere to European courts.

Over the coming weeks and months, I fear that elements of these new Brexit proposals will inevitably put me in direct conflict with the views expressed by a large section of my constituents. I was not prepared to compromise their wishes by delivering a watered down Brexit, and I therefore tendered my resignation as a Parliamentary Private Secretary at the Treasury.

The residents of North Cornwall made it very clear that they want to have control of our fisheries, our agriculture, our money, our laws, our judiciary and our borders, and I will evaluate those core principles against the Government's new Brexit White Paper and ensure that I vote in line with their wishes.

What are we to make of this long run of very dry and hot weather? Its not long ago the ground was so waterlogged any extra rain would cause flooding. In fact as I write, on the road to Port Isaac there is still a sign – see picture - rather ironically announcing, "flood" put there some months back when there were indeed floods. There is a branch of climate science that has developed over the past few years to answer the question about what we can make of weather events (but not the mystery of why flood signs remain when we are in the middle of a drought, but maybe they know something we don't!).

Without getting too technical, this Attribution Science asks firstly if the observed event is statistically unusual compared with natural variation in climate and secondly if it is consistent with predictions from models of climate change that include the effect of human activity. If you want technical articles, the science magazine Nature has a good list of papers www.nature.com/subjects/attribution

Our drought is part of a rather bigger drought over much of northern Europe. In two countries, Lithuania and Latvia for example, states of emergency have been declared because of the water shortage, so it's not just us. In July, the World Meteorological Organisation posted online a summary of the situation, globally, https://tinyurl.com/WMO-drought with records being broken in many places. They summarise well the state of attribution science at the bottom of this article, which shows that of those extreme weather events examined, 65% could be attributed to global warming due to human activity.

The other big story that has caught my attention is the epic swim that the 'ocean advocate' Lewis Pugh http://lewispugh.com is undertaking to highlight the way our oceans are being affected by climate change and pollution. He has some inspirational blogs here https://tinyurl.com/swim-pugh where he describes the day-to-day challenges of this 560 km (350 miles) swim – the length of the English Channel. He hopes to complete it in 50 days and is still going strong at day 11. The major problems so far seem to be jellyfish – lots of them – and quite a few stings. On July 12th, he met up with Prince Charles at the Surfer's Against Sewage event at St Agnes https://tinyurl.com/SAS-PrinceC . The event, and Lewis's swim are part of a wider campaign about plastic in the oceans and how to reduce it.

One nice example of how we can all help by collecting plastic from beaches is a smartphone app called Tidal Revival developed by Andy Nions and Rob Martindale – they write about it on their Facebook page https://en-gb.facebook.com/ SupportTidalrevivla/. They wanted to find a way to get as many people involved as possible in cleaning up our beaches. You can download it from the Apple Store for the iPhone and soon for Android phones. What it does is allow you to select a beach – for example Polzeath, based on your location. You can then record the type and quantity of the plastic you pick up from the beach, take a photo and upload it. You then earn points that can be redeemed for discounts at local shops – for example in Plastic Free Camelford www.facebook.com/PlasticFreeCamelford

Another website https://fathomsfree.org describing some similar great work, is about a group of divers committed to cleaning up the sea around our coast and their website has some great information, and also some photos of Zillah Robertson's art from litter – she also features on another nice website called Duffy the Sea Turtle https://duffytheseaturtle.com that is also well worth a look.

Planning Applications

Members considered the planning applications and made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

- 1. PA18/05015, Meadow Stile, Trewetha Lane, Port Isaac rear extension to replace existing lean to, new and replacement windows. Members unanimously objected. They support the proposed rear extension, however object to the proposed glazing form. The proposal fails to Conserve or Enhance the Conservation Area by reason of the uncharacteristic glazing unbroken by the bars and panes seen in all the surrounding cluster of buildings. This would have the effect of making the building more prominent when viewed from within the Conservation Area, The benefit to occupiers does not in Members' opinion outweigh the harm. Members would be inclined to fully support the proposal with adjustment to the glazing divisions.
- 2. PA18/05426, 9 Silvershell View, Port Isaac single storey rear extension with sun terrace and proposed entrance porch. The work includes internal remodelling and re-roofing works. Members made no comment on this application.
- 3. PA18/05608, 4 Mayfield Road, Port Isaac proposed rear ground floor extension and decking. Members supported this application.

Planning Applications Approved by CC – information only

- i. PA18/00691, Pilchards, Port Gaverne retrospective consent for amendments to cafe, (approved under PA17/00391), namely altered access to DDA toilet with a new timber door, siting of external cold room and timber clad fencing.
- ii. PA18/03670, Long Cross Hotel, Trelights existing hotel function room to become four guest suites. Existing dining room to be replaced by smaller one, and two additional guest suites.
- iii. PA18/03945, Seaward, 14 The Terrace, Port Isaac proposed garage.

Planning Applications Refused by CC

 PA18/03209, Coastguard Lookout – CC's Planning Committee voted to refuse the proposal by a majority of 8-5. They agreed the design is not compatible with its settling and it would cause harm to Conservation Area, the Heritage Assets described in the Heritage report of the Coastguard Cottages.

Port Gaverne WCs

Cllrs. Coles, Raynor and Williams had met with Mr Rich Shirley, National Trust. The Trust are looking to convert the Port Gaverne toilets into a retail facility or as a catering kiosk, which may be operated directly by The Trust and could perhaps include some interpretation highlighting the history of Port Gaverne to its visitors. Either option will include the retention of a toilet that could be used by the public. The Trust had proposed the PC take on a short-term licence at a cost of £100 (the Trust to pay the Business Rates) and run the WCs until 31st October 2018. Cllr. Williams will produce some costings and the matter will be considered further at the next meeting.

Community Led Housing Initiative

Members have invited Mr Andrew Prendergast, Rural Housing Enabler, Cornwall Council to attend the September meeting at 6.30pm to explain the options the scheme offers. As with all Council Meetings, members of the public are invited to attend.

New Play Equipment

Members have purchased a new piece of play equipment which is due to be installed early in October in time for the school's half-term holiday.

War Memorial

Cornwall Council had agreed the memorial could be moved to the Green at the junction to Mayfield. They had confirmed planning permission is not needed. The Revd. Wild had provided written confirmation that English Heritage had deferred listing of the war memorial until after its relocation.

The war memorial will be positioned in the centre of the 'Green' midway between the BT comms cabinets and the wooden bench. The exact position of the front of

the memorial would be on a line drawn between Nos.3 and 4 Mayfield Drive and a highways storm water gulley in Trewetha Lane.

In order to comply with disability regulations for wheelchair users there should be a paved area 4 metres deep and 3 metres wide in front of the memorial (on the wooden bench side) extending into a paved path 2.5 metres wide to the Tarmac pavement. This will create a paved standing area for up to 12 wreath bearers plus two wheelchair users.

The Parochial Church Council had agreed to cover the cost of the resiting of the memorial.

Martin's Mackerel

I love Mackerel not only because they are the only fish I ever seem to be able to catch at the moment but also for their versatility. This recipe involves pickling the mackerel first and then grilling them on the BBQ skin side down. Cook the fish as long as you can on the skin side (skin side down), flip it and finish for just 15/30 secs and plate.

Grilled mackerel with soy lime dressing

For the mackerel

250ml cider vinegar 250ml water 40g/1½oz caster sugar 35g/1¼oz red onion, finely sliced ½ tsp whole pink peppercorns 3-4 lemon slices 2 whole mackerel, filleted, pin bones removed 1 tbsp oil

1 tbsp soy sauce

For the soy and lime dressing

 tbsp water
 lime, juice only
 tsp fresh root ginger, peeled, finely diced
 tsp dark muscovado sugar

For the fennel salad

1 fennel bulb, finely sliced on a mandolin, slices soaked in ice-cold water for 20 minutes, drained 1 tbsp olive oil ½ lime, juice only1 bunch rocket leaves2 pinches sea salt1 pinch cayenne pepper

For the mackerel, heat the cider vinegar, water, coriander stalks,caster sugar, red onion, peppercorns and lemon slices in a medium saucepan over a medium heat. Heat the mixture until just warm(about 60C), then remove from the heat. Transfer the contents of the pan to a flat, shallow container and set aside to cool.

When the mixture has cooled, place the mackerel fillets into the container, flesh-side down. Set aside to marinate for 20 minutes.

For the soy and lime dressing, combine all the dressing ingredients in a small pan and gently heat through until the sugar has dissolved. Set to one side

When the mackerel fillets have marinated, remove them from the marinade and pat dry with kitchen paper. Make several diagonal scores in the skin, going across the length of each fillet to stop them from curling up during cooking.

Brush a baking tray all over with oil. Arrange the mackerel fillets onto the greased tray, skin-sides facing upwards. Place under the grill and cook for 4-5 minutes, or until the skin is crisp and the flesh is cooked through.

For the salad, combined. all the salad ingredients in a large bowl. To serve, divide the fennel salad equally among four serving plates. Place a grilled mackerel fillet on top of each portion. Spoon the salad dressing around the edge of the plate.

Panzanella

(Bread and Tomato Salad)

Ingredients

3 tbsp good olive oil

- 500g crusty old bread, cut into 2cm cubes 1 tsp salt
- 2 large, ripe tomatoes, cut into 2cm cubes 1 cucumber, unpeeled, seeded, and sliced 1cm thick
- 1 red pepper, seeded, cut into 2cm cubes 1 yellow pepper, seeded, cut into 2cm cubes 1/2 red onion, cut in 1/2 and thinly sliced 20 large basil leaves, coarsely chopped 3 tbsp capers, drained Freshly ground black pepper

For the vinaigrette:

tsp finely minced garlic
 tsp Dijon mustard
 tsp Cider or white wine vinegar
 20ml good olive oil
 tsp salt
 tsp freshly ground black pepper

Method


1. Heat the oil in a large saute pan. Add the bread and salt; cook over low to medium heat, tossing frequently, for 10 minutes, or until nicely browned. Add more oil as needed.

In a large bowl, mix the tomatoes, cucumber, peppers, onion, basil and capers. Add the bread cubes and season liberally with salt and pepper.
 For the vinaigrette, whisk all the ingredients together. Toss the salad with the vinaigrette and serve, or allow the salad to sit for about half an hour for the flavours to blend.

So have a good silly season, and keep calm and remember they are on holiday. Mx
