## Scott Mann's update from Parliament

We all know that housing is a huge issue in North Cornwall, so I was happy to see the government take steps to tackle a lack of available social housing. I would like to see a country where all people have the opportunity to own their own home, but we also need to make sure there is a route to a safe and secure place to live for those who don't have the option to buy.

Social housing can be a way to achieve this. I'm passionate about housing and it was one of they key issues that motivated me to stand as MP for North Cornwall in the first place. I look forward to seeing Cornwall Council respond in a positive but practical way to the borrowing cap being lifted. If managed correctly it could help local people get into a home of their own, but it will require sensible financial stewardship.

Lifting the Housing Revenue Account borrowing caps entirely will help support local authorities to build new homes in their local ares. I belive that this is a good plan of action; the interest set by local authorities in bidding for a share of the £1billion borrowing increase has shown that local authorities have ambition and capacity to increase levels of house building to match the public demand.

Removing the cap will enable local authorities to play a key role in delivering the homes that are specific to ther specific community's needs, meaning new buildings will be more personally driven to match the requirements of the local community and their requirements.

Lifting the cap also complements other measures being introduced that can help councils to build more homes as well. The longer term rent deal, which will be used from 2020, provides local authorities with a stable investment environment to deliver new



homes. These housing plans set by the government are a fantastic way in which we can tackle housing issues and ensures that younger generations have access to good, affordable housing.

I know that Cornwall Council have been looking to purchase the land at Scarne Cross, just off the Link Road by Launceston Hospital.



Finally, it is good to be back in Westminster sorting out various issues and promoting Nort Cornwall in parliament. They journey to London is challenging, especially given the isolated location of Cornwall. That is why I was delighted to hear the news that the Department for Transport and Cornwall Council have worked tirelessly to ensure that direct flights between Gatwick and Newquay Airport have been extended for another four years. The new link will see daily flights between both airports and three return flights on weekdays and two per day at weekends. This service will be operated by FlyBe.

Well, it looks like I am taking over from Chef Martin! I've been warned by my darling wife Kim that I've got to deliver interesting and diverse recipes, 'cos if I don't she'll show me how it's done!! So here goes ...

After the success of the FISH PI(E) Competition over the past couple of years I thought a bit of history and my take on this staple British classic could start my reign.

It has taken the "pie" over 1000 years to morph into what it is today. In the reign of King Henry I in 1100, a lamprey eel dish was quite popular. Cooks then put a pastry lid on it and, hey presto ... the first Fish Pie. Over the years it evolved, and in the late 1700s mashed potato replaced the pastry. It's name also changed to Fisherman's Pie due to its resemblance to a Shepherd's Pie.



Today every region has its own special ingredients and quirks but basically Fish Pie consists of fish, white sauce, potatoes, seasoning and cheese ... EASY.

Now, to me a Fish Pie doesn't include shellfish such as mussels or prawns ... that would make it a Seafood Pie (or as Findus call it, an Ocean Pie), but if they are what floats your boat, add them in.

#### For a large pie to feed eight members of your family or your friends:

2lb mixed fish (I use cod, salmon, smoked haddock and hake) 2lb potatoes

2 leeks Plus extra butter for your mash 1 onion Cheese (grated) - as much or as little as you fancy 1 pint of milk Bay leaf 4oz butter English mustard 4oz flour

#### Method

Heat the milk, adding a bay leaf and half a white onion and bring to a simmer. Add fish and simmer for 4 minutes.

Remove the fish from the milk and place in a colander and break up into chunks. Make sure you retain all the milk liquid. Strain this liquid to remove the onion and bay leaf.

Slice leeks and onion and slowly soften in butter. When soft add flour and cook for a further 2-3 minutes. Gradually add the reserved milk, whisking until you've got a thickish consistency. Add a teaspoon of English mustard, black pepper salt and grated cheese and gently cook for a further 10 minutes.

Meanwhile boil your potatoes in salted water. When soft (about 20 minutes) drain and mash well with a good sized knob of butter and black pepper and grated cheese.

When the sauce has cooled slighly add the poached fish and gently fold together.

Then, cover with the mashed potato. If you are feeling adventuous pipe it on, if not just use a fork. And if, like me, you love cheese, sprinkle a bit more grated cheese on top before you slip it into the oven. Bake until golden.

Other little extras you could add to your Fish Pie are sweetcorn and/or boiled eggs ... mmm





# **Re-membering**

To dismember is to break or tear apart - to re-member is to bring together. And remembering, or bringing together, is what many will be doing, in a special way this year at 11am on 11th November, as we recall the ending of the First World War at that time on that day 100 years ago. Many special services and events have been arranged, but soon that date will be just one more memorable date in the history of the world.





Always God wants us live together as sisters and brothers in one family, and like a loving parent, he doesn't impose his will on us. Am I still seething with resentment at someone who did me harm and hoping they'll get their come-uppance one day?

Think of the meaning of 're-membering' and let this year's blood-red poppies, be more than a poignant symbol of remembrance of those who died. Let them also be a means of bringing us together, of inspiring us to let go of present anger and old resentments and bitterness, truly to forgive and to be at peace with one another. And, because this is something we really find hard to do, let's determine to ask God to give us the grace we need to enable us to do it.
