

# A HUGE and ENORMOUS thank you to Port Isaac Co-op and its customers for their support ...



# Rudolph lives up the valley ...

# 'A Merry Christmas from all of us down at The Cleavage!

Theo's girlfriend Jess snapped this early appearance from Rudolph just above us, at the edge of the village below the old 'killing house' on Church Hill way back in the summer (remember that?). It's a Roe deer buck, undoubtedly part of the small herd that lives up the valley, and he stood there as bold as brass for around five or six minutes before disappearing. One morning



back in the early spring we saw a line of six of them walking across the top of the hillside towards Homer Park. What a lovely thought that our valley is thriving with such wildlife!'



During the month of November Copeland Bell was tasked on service, along with Padstow ALB, Helicopter Rescue 924 and Polzeath Coatstguard team to search the waters to the west of Port Isaac between Kellan Head and Varley Head after there were concerns for the safety of a male in his sixties. An extensive search was carried out and the possibility of detection was deemed to be over 99%, which means that the search carried out by all units held a 99% chance of locating the casualty if in the search location. After approximately two hours all units were stood down and returned to station with nothing found. The missing man was found twelve days later 68.8 nautical miles north east of Port Isaac in Pembrey Sands. Our thoughts and condolences are with his family.

# Scott Mann's update from Parliament

On the day the guns fell silent in 1918, Prime Minister David Lloyd-George addressed the House of Commons to give the terms of the armistice before he led Members of Parliament to a service at St Margaret's Church in Westminster.



One hundred years later, it is perhaps fitting that the 11th of November fell on the day which we now call 'Remembrance Sunday', and MPs, for the most part, were in their own constituencies. I attended services in both Bude and Stratton, but across North Cornwall, other services and events to mark the centenary took place and I would like to thank all those who organised, volunteered and attended.


Almost every town and village in Cornwall has a memorial to those who fell in the Great War, and it is still hard to comprehend just how high the cost really was. Soldiers, sailors and airmen from Cornwall fought and died on many fronts. The Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, which lost over 4,500 men, participated in some of the most famous battles on the Western Front including Mons, Ypres and during the final '100 days offensive'.

The centenary of the armistice finds us united in respect and remembrance for all of the casualties of the Great War, but we also remember the sacrifice of British and Commonwealth troops who have made the ultimate sacrifice on battlefields since. We do not forget that servicemen from Cornwall have fallen in Afghanistan and Iraq, giving their lives to protect this country and our way of life. Around the world, British servicemen and women continue to serve on our behalf, and Remembrance Sunday is also a day to think of them, and their families. We shall remember them.

Thank you to everyone who sent me messages after the car accident I was involved in. Thankfully the children and I were not badly hurt and I was back to work on the Monday after in the constituency.

The next few weeks are going to be very challenging in Westminster, but as the challenges increase so does my desire to deliver outcomes for North Cornwall and all of the residents here.

### Chorale's World War **One Concerts**

The Port Isaac Chorale held three very successful commemorations of the 100th Anniversary of the end of World War One. The events were held in Port Isaac Village Hall, Wadebridge Masonic Hall and Delabole Methodist Chapel and were greatly enjoyed by all. The posters explained that audience participation was expected and there was some wonderful community singing at all of the venues.

Port Isaac Chorale's Musical Director, Janet Townsend, opened the evenings with a brief summary of the numbers of dead and injured servicemen from each of the areas where the concerts were taking place and this definitely helped to make the evenings an individualised commemoration.

The programme was devised by Chorale member, David Ward, in order to trace the progress of the war through popular songs of the time. Therefore the first songs were about encouraging the young men to enlist in order to 'Make a Man out of You' and then, as the narrative explained, concerns began about those left behind, so songs such as 'Keep The Home Fires Burning' were popular. Popular rousing songs such as 'Pack Up Your Troubles' were also designed to raise morale, both at home and abroad and the audiences participated with enthusiasm.

As Chorale members read the haunting poems, In Flanders Field and The Soldier, the mood of the music of the times changed and this was reflected in The Roses of Picardy with excellent solos from two of the Chorales tenors, Rob and Simon. The carol Silent Night followed to mark the brief Christmas Day ceasefire which took place at the Front.

The cynicism of the age as the war raged on was evident from songs such as Oh What a Lovely War and I Want to Go Home. And When They Ask Us was sung acapella by the tenors and basses and this reminded the audience of the terrible things the returning men had witnessed but of which they never spoke.

The evenings raised over £500 for the Poppy Appeal.

# overruled by the Mrs!

Housewife's perspective: I asked Chris what sort of recipe he was going to put into *Trio* and he told me as it is Christmas he thinks it will be a Venison recipe. Well, I'm not sure about all of you but venison is lovely out at a restaurant but it isn't usually top of my supermarket shopping list! So I thought I might give a more simple perspective ... less ingredients, less cost and a lot less washing up!!

That being said, as this is the Christmas *Trio* I am doing a posher than normal recipe. We don't have this evey week, but it is a lovely recipe for Christmas Eve when you may have family turning up at all times and an awful lot of other things to do. It is based on Boeuf Bourguignon but a simpler take on it.



2lb braising steak cut into big cubes (tell your butcher what you are making and he will recommend a good cut - you wont get big cubes in the supermarket)

225qm smoked streaky bacon

500gm carrots cut into large chunks

100gm baby mushrooms

3 tablespoons olive oil

1 med onion cut into chunks, not too small

1 heaped tablespoon plain flour

½ bottle red wine (a good robust one does the job)

2 cloves garlic (2 teaspoons of lazy garlic paste)

Bouquet garni (look it up on Google)

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

12oz baby shallots (I once read a recipe that said you could rinse and use pickled onions - DON'T Its horrible)

I use my slow cooker but a good casserole dish and a low oven will do the job. If using the oven heat to 140C or 275F or gas mark 1.

- 1. In a frying pan heat half the olive oil to nearly sizzling and add the meat in small batches. Once the batch is browned put it in the slow cooker or casserole dish with a slotted spoon.
- 2. Once all done and added to pot, fry the onion chunks until gently browned. Add these to casserole.
- 3. Then sprinkle the flour into the remaining oil and meat juices stirring slowly.
- 4. Add the wine and once its all added and stirred in add the carrots, garlic, bouquet garni and pinch of salt and black pepper. Stir well and put in oven for 2 hours (or cook in slow cooker on low for 2 hours.) If guests are not arriving until later you can switch off the cooker or take out of the oven here.
- 5. To finish the dish, in your frying pan heat the rest of the olive oil and fry the chopped up bacon and shallot onions until they are browned and maybe a little crispy this is to your taste. Add to the casserole and stir through, and cook for another hour.

I love this served with baby new potatoes and fresh crisp green beans, which can be prepared in a short time once your guests have arrived.

The recipe is supposed to serve 4 – 6 people but I tend to double it up (well you do have to open a whole bottle of wine) and should there be any left over it freezes lovely for a nice warming surprise to find in the freezer in January.

# I thought I was the Trio cookery writer!!

Well, with Xmas coming minds move towards food, of course. And after my wife's reaction I decided to steer clear of venison!

The traditional food we love to have at Christmas such as turkey and everything, gammon, smoked salmon and all the other dishes that we associate with Christmas have tried and tested recipes which have been passed down through families for years, so maybe it's time to look at some dishes that you wouldn't really associate with the festive period.

How about homemade barbecued spare ribs! Easy to prepare, these wonderful ribs taste brill when first cooked and are just as good if there are any left if you reheat them. Ideal if you want something a little lighter than the norm.

Cooking time-1½ hours Med oven, gas mark 6 4 portions

4 thick cut pork chops ½oz butter
1 small white onion
1 stalk celery
1tbsp brown sugar
2tsp dry mustard
1tsp salt

½ tsp paprika 2tsp tomato paste 1tbsp Lea and Perrins ¼ pint water 1tbsp vinegar 2tbsp lemon juice

### Method

Place chops in tray and bake uncovered for 30 mins, meanwhile mix sugar, mustard, salt and pepper, tomato paste and all liquids

After 30 mins remove any excess fat from chops.

Dice onions and fry in butter till brown and add the remaining ingredients and pour over chops and return to the oven for 3/4 hour to an hour.

These ribs are delicious with mashed or jacket potatoes and broad beans.

### **Highways Matters**

*Trewetha Traffic Issues* – Members have been trying for some months to deal with traffic issues raised by residents of Trewetha and Highways were asked to consider two suggestions:

- i. 30mph Speed Limit Highways informed us that Trewetha does not meet the criteria for a 30mph speed limit which is applied in all significant sized villages. The definition of a "significant sized village" is considered to be any settlement meeting any one of the following criteria:
  - Over 400m of continuous development (one side of the road).
  - Containing a primary or secondary school.
  - Between 200m and 400m of continuous development with both a shop/post office and another community facility (e.g. church, health centre, pub, tourist attraction).

- Between 200m and 400m of continuous development with either a shop/post office or another community facility and no footways.
- ii. Verge Parking cars parking on the grass verge at Trewetha were thought to be impeding visibility. The Highway Steward is planning on having the verge hazard marker posts reinstated at this location, not only to highlight the bend and visibility splay but to stop the overspill parking as well, this will be implemented as a priority.

A meeting is to be held with representatives from Highways to discuss any other options to stop parking and improve safety at Trewetha / Port Isaac.

The building has been erected and the drainage and electricity are due to be connected on 4th December 2018.

# A Temperance beginning

Back in 1895 the Temperance Hall was built on Trewetha Lane. At that time there were two Temperance Societies in our little village and their rules did not allow their members to drink alcohol. A far cry from today when the Hall's biggest fundraiser is the bar! The original Temperance Banners were found some years ago and painstakingly restored and now take pride of place over the stage … and overlooking the bar!

### **Becoming a registered Charity**

Over the years there have been many changes and in 1969 Port Isaac Village Hall was registered as a charity. Since then committees of volunteers have been responsible for the running this vital part of village life … it hasn't been plain sailing; at times it looked like the Hall would close but strong management teams and local support means the Hall is still going stong.

Since the closure of the Church Rooms it is the only public meeting place for the village. It is within walking distance for everyone who lives in Port Isaac. It is home to the weekly Community Cafe and is regularly used by local groups including Stay & Play, the Golden Circle, Port Isaac Chorale, Gulls, Keep Fit and the Pantomime. It also hosts an array of private functions from birthday parties to wedding receptions, meetings and a wide range of ad hoc events including coffee mornings, BBQs, art workshops and fundraising events for local groups.

Just seven volunteers run the Hall and whilst they have high hopes and vision for an improved Hall, realistically the upkeep and maintenance of the 123-year old building eats up the funds they raise and the time they can give. So far this year over £5000 has been spent on general maintenance …

The income received from hall hire fees does not cover the hall outgoings and we are constantly fundraising to make ends meet. It takes a lot of coffee mornings, raffles, cake stalls, breakfasts, lunches, concerts and pints to pour to keep things on an even keel. But the hard work has been worthwhile and since 2001 we have redesigned the entrance - massive excavation of earth and a new structural retaining wall - and garden and put in a new set of steps. There was no room for a ramp for multi-access so the Doc Martin Fund provided the money for a lift for wheelchairs, pushchairs, people and heavy loads. Plus we built the sound desk and the bar, the chair store and redesigned the ladies toilets and have completely redecorated the hall both inside and outside, repairing the old window frames and woodwork at the same time.

But there is so much more we want to do to make Port Isaac Village Hall better for everyone ... and we need some help






