So far we have enough money for nearly 50 chairs so as soon as the internal work on the chair store is finished we will be ordering our first batch.



Scott Mann's update from Parliament

It's good to be back in Westminster this week after celebrating Christmas and New Year at home in North Cornwall. There are a number of different issues arising here but I'm happy to see that North Cornwall is progressing nicely in the early days of 2019 and is set to do so for the rest of the year. I will be making sure that North Cornwall's voices are heard here in Westminster and that any issues that rise are swiftly dealt with.

I was disappointed to see that opening of the new Sowenna Mental Health Unit in Bodmin has been delayed. This new unit was set to open this year and will be crucial in supporting children and adolescents with mental illnesses: the delay means that we will not have access to this facility until next year. Supporting the mental health of children and adolescents is incredibly important not only here in North Cornwall but throughout the UK. I am a strong supporter in bringing the necessary facilities to North Cornwall and although these delays may mean that we are unable to have access to these top facilities - I hope the time will be used to make the unit even better for its eventual users

I was very pleased to see that the £30m holiday resort plans for Waterside Cornwall, formerly known as Lakeview Country Club, have recently been approved and that now plans are at work to develop this site. The site has been granted full planning permission that will include 118 Eco Lodges, a new 25 meter swimming pool and several leisure facilities. This newly developed resort will help to bring more tourists to North Cornwall seeing an extra income for the local area all year round raising the areas profile. The plans also feature several eco-friendly developments and buildings that mean not only will the buildings blend seamlessly into the environment but also they will not harm the local ecological features of the area.

Finally, am also very sad to announce that local

councillor, member of my team and above all my friend, Val Bugden-Cawsey, has sadly passed away from cancer. Her strength during the battle with malignant melanoma was inspirational, and during that time she continued to support and give back to our community with her 'Val walks tall' campaign. Her campaign has managed to raise thousands to help forward support research for Advanced Malignant Melanoma for Plymouth Hospital Charity. Val will be sorely missed by all of us, and I would like to offer my condolences to her husband Terry and the family.

The Chorale won their class for a large mixed choir with their performance of an unaccompanied Newfoundland Folk Song, She's Like The Swallow followed by Sing A Song of Sixpence in the style of Handel, with the piano accompaniment by Jo Norton. In her feedback, the adjudicator, Lesley Shrigley Jones, claimed that 'Handel would have approved'.

The Chorale were then delighted and surprised to be awarded the Festival Cup for the highest points awarded to any choir in the festival. The adjudicator commented on the obvious camaraderie in the choir and also singled out the tenors and basses for special praise. In summing up, she said 'Thank you for bringing such a high standard of music to the festival.'

The Chorale's Musical Director, Janet Townsend MBE, who started the group 25 years ago, was previously the Musical director of the Port Isaac Singers, who won the Festival Cup back in 1987 so she was delighted to be able to repeat this success 31 years later!

understand how we feel deep down inside? Who understands what we are going through?



Proposed toilet in St Peter's



Plans for a toilet at St Peter's Church are to be submitted to Cornwall Council this month. The toilet will fit behind the porch and therefore will not be visible as you approach Church.

In November 2017 Port Isaac RNLI were invited to set up an appeal fund with a target of £52,000 in order to cover the cost of replacing their existing D class lifeboat nearing the end of her operational life. Ahead of schedule and in little over a year that amount was successfully raised. The fundraising committee are pleased to announce an extension of the Appeal to cover funding for the new Lifeboat's equipment, operational costs and premises.

The extension to this appeal is being kick-started by Port Isaac's very own official Virgin Money London 2019 London Marathon Team. The team is made up of past and present volunteer crew members and partners Greg Hingley, Ian & Clair Johnson and Richard & Carol Hambly. The team have been in training for some weeks now and so far generous donations to the total of £3,167 have been recorded.

Further fund raising events will be staged and the first to take place will be a Race Night at Port Isaac Village Hall on Saturday February 23rd starting at 7.30 pm.

for a while or may be trying a new type of exercise so let your body get to grips with the new challenges. Focus on having realistic expectations. There will be times when you haven't managed to fit in your exercise session but you haven't failed ... you're allowed to have days off and you're back on the next day. That's how a sustainable regime works .

Make a plan: If you have decided to join a gym decide what you want to achieve and ask the trainers to create a plan for you to follow and work on progresssively

Group exercise works for many people as there are such a variety of classes available now ranging from spinning to Dancefitness. A good instructor will adapt exercises to suit all levels but it is always advisable to check with the instructor to find out if the class is suitable for your level and needs. Group fitness is motivating, a great way to exercise to music and meet other people. During the many years I have been teaching I have seen people nervously turn up for the first class, worried about having two left feet and no confidence, only to see them, months down the line, feeling stronger, aerobically fitter and more positive. Taking that first step can be hard so bring a willing friend along. They might get hooked too!

Set small goals: for example, say to yourself I will be able to walk / run a mile in so many minutes before the end of the month. I want to learn those aerobic dance steps to Tina Turner's *Proud Mary* with better co-ordination, confidence and energy. Stick to one goal at a time but always have several more to aim for. They can be specific such as "I want my legs/ arms to be stronger and more toned ". A challenge will help you to improve on how many squats or press ups you can do in a minute and you can improve on this as time goes on. Whatever age or ability you are at, there are always exercises and goals to aim for and a fitness instructor will assist you with these.

Choices: The gym and group exercise are options but you might consider joining a walking group, joining a team or a local club in an activity that you enjoy or enjoyed in the past. You will make new friends along the way who will help you in achieving your goal. If you are tired when you get back from work and can't motivate yourself to head off to your exercise sessionn set yourself up with some inexpensive equipment at home. There are many excellent fitness DVDs and exercise apps to follow these days. A personal trainer might seem a costly thought but investing in a few sessions to give advice, exercise ideas and motivation might be a worthwhile idea.

In the dark and cold of winter it can be hard to pry yourself from the comfort of your sofa but exercise benefits so much more than just your physical health . This time of the year can be hard for people with mental health problems and exercise is one proven treatment for it . You will feel better about yourself and proud of achieving something . Before long I'm sure you will catch the exercise bug and what was once a chore will be something you look forward to !

ROAD CLOSURE

Western Power are looking to close Fore Street for two weeks from March 11th-25th to remove low clearance overhead lines and to install a new service as per a customer request. To this end they are sending out a letter inviting those concerned to the Village Hall Thursday February 9th between 9am and 12noon to explain what work they have to do, and how they hope to limit as much as possible any disruption. ROAD CLOSURE

Following my previous efforts regarding the proposed footpath to Trewetha, Councillor Coles and myself spoke to Oliver Jones from Cornwall Council Highways who agreed we could utilise the verge from the Car Park up to the sharp bend where the verge becomes too narrow.

Following my conversation with the Cleave family, the land owners, they have informed me that they will not allow the Parish Council to make a pathway on any part of their land. Their decision makes it impossible us to proceed making a footpath as proposed, contrary to my understanding of the situation prior to this Council supporting their application to build the Garage in an area of outstanding beauty.

I believe that due to the number of visitors now staying and "glamping" etc in Trewetha, all of whom visit Port Isaac, a path to the village is vital if we are to avoid the possibility of a serious accident during the summer holidays.

TOILETS AT GAVERNE

The National Trust representative has told me that they are not going forward with their plans to make a kiosk in the Cellar at Port Gaverne, and asked if we would be prepared to rent the toilets as we did last year, and may be for a longer period.

BUS SHELTER

I have heard from our solicitor Chris Key dealing with the lease for the Bus Shelter. He has now received the amended lease as discussed and will forward it to our clerk.

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

Finally I would like to thank Chris Lanyon and his team for putting up the best show of Christmas Lights in the village that I have seen.

St Endellion Parish Council are looking for a company to clean three (possibly four) blocks of public toilets situated in Port Isaac

Cleaning is required daily throughout the year (excluding Christmas Day) and twice daily during the high summer season.

The Company would be required to clean all surfaces, WCs, Wallgate units, etc. and would be responsible for disposal of all litter and debris within the curtilage of the building. They would also be required to supply all cleaning materials, consumables including the soap for Wallgate units, etc., together with reporting any concerns relating to health and safety and be responsible for legionella testing.

The company would be required to have a minimum Public Liability Insurance cover.

Members considered these planning applications and made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

- PA18/09882, Maritime and Coastguard Agency, New Road, Port Isaac –
 proposed single dwelling to replace existing decommissioned Coastguard
 buildings. Members objected on the grounds of loss of light and amenity
 by the overlooking balcony to the neighbouring property, pending
 clarification as to whether the application had been withdrawn.
- PA18/09256, White Cottage, Port Gaverne Hill, Port Isaac Listed building consent for provision of air source heat pump system, together with the removal of the existing electric night storage heating, and the upgrade to a radiator wet system throughout the cottage. Members supported this application.
- PA18/10360, 1 Cliffside Access to Cliffside, Port Isaac alterations to window openings. Members objected on the grounds this is within the Conservation Area in a highly visible location with a high footfall the excess glazing does not comply with Policy 5e of the emerging St Endellion Neighbourhood Plan.
- 4. PA18/10519, 36 New Road, Port Isaac demolition of existing bungalow and construction of new dwelling. Members felt they could not make a considered comment because the plans do not show levels nor where the windows face nor is the balcony shown on the floor plans, etc., however, even with the poor plans Members objected on the grounds of scale, mass, excessive glazing and loss of amenity and privacy.
- PA18/10744, Lower Bodannon, B3267 Between Trewetha Lane / Pendoggett Road, Port Isaac – proposed 4no holiday/glamping pods with associated services including ablution block. Construction of bunds. Members supported this application.
- PA18/10784, 76a Fore Street, Port Isaac variation of Condition 1 of Planning Application No. PA12/00231 dated 5th April 2012 for Modification of condition 1 of planning permission no. E1/2009/00987 for Retention of Change of Use of Retail Shop (Class A1) to a Tearoom (Class A3); to read "The premises shall not be open, in use or operate before 8.30am or later than 9pm on any day between the Friday before Easter and the last day of October each year and not before 8.30am or later than 6pm between the 1st day of November and the Thursday before Easter each year" to allow the shop to open until 10pm. Furthermore to allow the shop to remain open on Friday and Saturday nights only from the end of October until the Thursday before Easter with no seats/tables outside. Members objected on the loss of residential amenity for the neighbours which is caused by an excessive intensification of the original usage permission.
- 7. PA18/10800, Sea Winds Road from Long Cross to The Barton, Trelights –

As the season of over indulgence ends (thank God!), then the season of Slimming World and Weight Watchers ads bombard us and our minds turn to slightly healthier choices.

A New Year means a new start, so get on your hands and knees and get to the backs of the kitchen cupboards! After you've got rid of that tin of artichokes you bought in 1998, you might be ready for Chicken Curry. Katsu Curry seems to be the "in thing" so here's my recipe.



Chris's Katsu Curry

to feed four

2 tbsp plain flour plus 3 tsp

2 beaten eggs

2 handfuls of breadcrumbs (stale blitzed bread)

4 chicken thighs (skinned and deboned)

2 mugs Basmati rice

2 mugs water

4 tsp mild curry powder

300ml water

4 squirts honey

3 tbsp soy sauce

4 spring onions

olive oil

salt & pepper

METHOD

Three bowls; one with seasoned flour, one with beaten eggs and one with the breadcrumbs. Dip chicken in the flour, then the egg and then finally the breadcrumbs.

Gently pan fry the chicken in a splash of oliver oer a low heat. Turn over once when the underside is golden brown and cook the other side. Ensure the meat is cooked through.

Meanwhile put rice and mugs of water in a pan and bring to the boil with the lid on for seven minutes. When the water is absorbed the rice is ready.

While the chicken and the rice are cooking, make the sauce by mixing the curry powder, 2 tsp flour and a splash of olive oil in a pan over a medium heat. Keep stirring and gradually add the water. As the sauce comes together add the honey and soy sauce. The sauce should be like a thick gravy.

Serve by slicing the chicken on the rice. Scatter with the sliced spring onions and drizzle the sauce over the top.

Mrs L's Cheese & Tato Pie with Corned Beef Hash

So now I've got the post Christmas cold/chest infection that everyone I've met is suffering from. Plus it is this time of year that I want to serve something filling, tasty and simple. This recipe comes mostly from my Mum but I may well have adapted and altered it over the years. You can use up the old, tired odds and sods from your fridge and store cupboard and the fact we call it Corned Beef hash has no bearing on the American version which is all fried.

One small cauliflower

500g carrots

750g potatoes

200g cheese (any but extra mature cheddar works best and don't worry if it's the end and a bit dry, or some old parmesan grated into cheddar works)

Big splash milk/cream

Butter

Salt and pepper

and/or

340g tin Corned Beef to make hash



Add the peeled and chopped cauliflower, carrots and potatoes to a large pan and add boiling water from kettle and boil the lot for 20 minutes. The quantities on this recipe are only a guide. Put in what will fit in your biggest saucepan without overflowing. Carrots and cauli should be cut into big chunks and potatoes into smaller then they will all cook at same rate. Meanwhile grate your cheese and open the tin and chop up your Corned Beef if you are making hash.

Once all the veg have cooked, drain off the water and put back in the pan. Add the cheese, milk, butter, salt and pepper and chopped up tin of Corned Beef and mash. You can mash as much as you like - don't use a blending stick as it goes very gloopy. I like the carrots to still be a little lumpy. The cauliflower will disappear and fussy kids will never know it's in there.

You can just dish up and eat at this stage but I put it in a large casserole dish and sprinkle a little extra cheese on the top and put in the oven for half an hour. You will get a lovely crispy cheesy crust on top.

My family love this with baked beans and it can be just eaten with a fork - tasty and filling comfort food for cold winter nights. Plus, It is great heated up for lunch the next day.

If you are on Slimming World you can use fat free yoghurt in the mash and restrict the cheese and it is still pretty low fat. Serve with broccoli and peas.
