

THE NEW PORT ISAAC BANNER

The old Village Hall Temperance banners, which were discovered under the Hall stage, were often paraded around Port Isaac at the turn of the century.

Old photographs of the Temperance parades have been the inspiration for the new Community Banner which will be paraded alongside reproductions of the old banners from the Village Hall to the Platt to launch the start of the first Port Isaac Shanty Festival.

The intention has always been to parade the old banners, on their original carrying poles, through the streets of Port Isaac again. However, their fragile nature made this impossible but with the help of modern technology they have now been photographed and printed onto sustainable fabrics and 150 years on the Temperance banners will once again be paraded through the village.





Co-ordinated by local artist Caroline Cleave with funding from FEAST, many locals and community groups have contributed to the vibrant new banner which will have a permanent home alongside the old ones in the Village Hall.



Everybody Welcomel



After the heavy downpours during August the sun decided to shine on Port Isaac for the annual RNLI Lifeboat Larks. The event got underway with music from St Minver Silver Band whilst people browsed the stalls of Port Isaac RNLI clothing, cards and pictures whilst enjoying a cream tea. There was fun for the children with face painting, and traditional games such as splat the rat, hook the duck and welly throwing!

The stations D-Class lifeboat Copeland Bell put on a wonderful demonstration showing the rescue of people from the rocks by using a rescue technique that involved veering down on the rocks in a swell.

The afternoon was welcomed in by the Penny Royal Jazz Band and food and refreshments at the BBQ and Pimms & Sharps Beer bar.

The children's painting competition was judged with Kenton winning in the under 5's, Luke in the 6-8 years

category, Phoebe 9-13 and Megan winning for the 14+. Well done to everyone who entered.

The day was a huge success and we are pleased to report that in excess of £3000 was raised for Port Isaac RNLI.



LIFEBOAT SHOUTS

Port Isaac D-class *Copeland Bell* was tasked at 19:45 on 10th June to reports of three people on an inflatable, to the right side of Port Gaverne, one in the water and potentially in trouble. The lifeboat was launched within four minutes of being paged and was on scene within 60 seconds. It quickly became clear that the call had been a false alarm with good intent and it was three spear fisherman towing swim flags and utility boards. No assistance was required. The shout was called in by local children and we would like to reiterate that it was a really responsible thing to do. Our crew would rather respond and make sure all is ok than not receive a call when someone really does require assistance. If ever in doubt call 999 and ask for the Coastguard.

The Lifeboat was again tasked at 17:48 on 22nd June to reports of a spear fisherman who was 20 minutes overdue returning to shore. His partner was concerned when he had failed to return to the car at the agreed time. The boat launched and made headway to Port Gaverne. En route they spoke with Kayakers who confirmed they had seen a snorkeller matching the description good and well making their way back towards Port Gaverne. The same reports were confirmed with some children at Tags Pit. A crew member was put ashore and made contact with the spear fisherman who was safe. It was deemed to be a false alarm with good intent and the boat returned and was readied for service.

The volunteer crew just had time to rest, and return to their day jobs before the pager sounded again, this time at 12:19 on 23rd June to a dog over the cliff at Backways Cove. We are very sad to report that the dog did not survive the fall. Crew were able to recover the body to return to the owners at Trebarwith Strand. All at Port Issac RNLI send our condolences to the owners. Here is the advice from the RNLI when walking your dog near a cliff edge

- Keep your dog on a lead if close to cliff edges or fast flowing rivers.
- If your dog goes into the water or gets stuck in mud, don't go after them. Move to a place they can get to safely and call them – many dogs get out by themselves.
- If you're worried about your dog, call 999 or 112 and ask for the Coastguard.

On Friday 2nd and Saturday 17th August the lifeboat was requested to launch by Falmouth Coastguard to reports of persons cut off by the tide at nearby coves. On both occasions the Lifeboat and Coastguard proceeded to the scene but found that all persons had managed to abstract themselves. The advice from the RNLI is to please ensure you check tide times before you set off on the coast and follow the advice found here https://rnliorg/safety/know-the-risks/tides

Port Isaac inshore lifeboat Copeland Bell was tasked on the afternoon 25th August to reports of a recreational fisherman having been swept off rocks at Pehalick Point near Tintagel. The lifeboat arrived on scene just after Coastguard Search and Rescue helicopter 924 where they winched the casualty up and flew him to Treliske to be checked over. The lifeboat and volunteer crew stood by for support and watched the first informant make their way back up the cliffs.

Even with the beautiful weather and small swell it is so easy to be caught off guard and end up in a life threatening situation. Thanks to peoples quick actions this casualty has had a lucky outcome. It could have been very different. Please always wear a life jacket and #respectthewater

I should like to say a BIG THANK YOU to all of those on our RNLI team for their assistance in setting up and running Lifeboat Larks event on August 18th. Our crew, committee and helpers were second-to-none and without their dedication and hard work the event would not have been the success it has proved to be.



Planning Applications

Members considered these planning applications and made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

- PA19/03484, 30 Trewetha Lane, Port Isaac replacement of two existing oil tanks with one larger oil tank. Members had no objection.
- 2. PA19/04437, Homer Park Farmhouse, Port Isaac renewal of planning consent PA16/08897 Demolition of dwelling and construction of replacement dwelling with new boiler house, swim pool house and associated works. Members supported this application.
- 3. PA19/06230, Land Adj. to Signal Field, New Road, Port Isaac construction of a detached dwelling (renewal of planning permission no. PA16/07952 dated 21.10.2016). Members supported this application.
- 4. PA19/06263, Malahne, Church Hill, Port Isaac retention and completion of alterations and repair works to Grade II listed dwellings and flat, including extension of existing loft accommodation, and the provision of a new dormer. Cllr. Williams said this application had been withdrawn. No further action.
- 5. PA19/06264, Malahne, Church Hill, Port Isaac LBC for retention and completion of alterations and repair works to Grade II listed dwellings and flat, including extension of existing loft accommodation, and the provision of a new dormer. Cllr. Williams said this application had been withdrawn. No further action.
- 6. PA19/06286, Land S of 8 Rose Hill, Port Isaac proposed dwelling alterations to design of permitted dwelling (PA16/06555) with variation of condition 2 of PA17/05094. Members supported this application.

Planning Applications Approved by Cornwall Council

1. PA19/03833, Havenpark, Trewetha Lane, Port Isaac – single storey side extension.

Road Safety Issues

1. Church Hill Pinch Point – following advice from Mr Oliver Jones Members resolved to purchase two re-bound bollards, which would go down underground if struck, but then rise back to the intended height. Cormac had agreed to install these free of charge.

Public Conveniences

i. Cleaning – Members have agreed to increase the contractors' hours to clean the public WCs at Roscarrock, New Road and The Main car park until the end of September 2019.

Playing Field

1. There had been more damage to the play equipment. Cllr. Raynor reported that Earthwright (the equipment providers) had offered to fit the new belt and also to fit new wooden clamps at each end at no cost to the Parish Council.

Scott Mann's update from Parliament

Over the last few weeks, I have been out and about in the constituency making the most of the recess to speak to our community about local and national issues. I've received a lot of feedback which I'll be taking back to Westminster with me when the House returns, and I have already asked my team to set up meetings with several Ministers so I can discuss issues with them directly.

Something which has been raised with me on the doors is dental provision across the whole of Cornwall. A lack of NHS dental care in Cornwall is a historical issue which has not been properly addressed by successive governments; I have been keen to do my part to solve it since my election four years ago.

I am aware that NHS dental patients in Cornwall have found it difficult to get an appointment for a check-up, routine dental work or children's orthodontics and this is something I and my fellow Cornish MPs are treating as a priority.

At a recent meeting chaired by Truro & Falmouth MP Sarah Newton, which I attended with my staff, local dentists and NHS representatives were able to discuss both the problems and the solutions to issues surrounding dentistry in Cornwall. Following on from this meeting I met directly with dentists who provide services to NHS patients here in North Cornwall. These meetings have allowed all the relevant parties to voice their opinions and suggestions on how government can better support practitioners and patients.

Behind the scenes, we have covered a lot of ground over the summer and there are many action points which I am keen to raise in Westminster. The Secretary of State for Health is a great supporter of Cornwall and his door is always open to us. I look forward to updating him when the House returns after the summer and putting across a strong case to his Department.

If you live in my North Cornwall constituency you may have received my survey on the BBC licence fee. I'm very happy with the amount of feedback my office has received with North Cornwall voicing some strong opinions about the service. A great many of you are disappointed with the BBC's decision to scrap the free TV-licence for over 75s and I have been clear that I want the BBC to meet the cost of this. People across North Cornwall value television to stay connected and I want the BBC to look again at further ways to support older people. Taxpayers want to see the BBC using the licence fee income better, including showing restraint on salaries for senior staff.

I'm watching her shower, it's so steamy in there She's taking her time and she hasn't a care I'm waiting and itching to go for my walk To get all the gossip and read all the talk

There's Barney and Biffa and Bruno and Bryn Their smells are all different – I get in a spin Sniffing them out to see who got there first It's just so exciting I think I might burst

It's hair drying time, I so hate the hot blow It's taking too long, she can't possibly know I have to get out there, I'm trying not to panic I'm a dog in a rush and need to go manic

The old man's sat up now and started to chatter My needs are ignored, I just don't seem to matter She's promised him tea and some hot buttered toast Perhaps he can wait as I need her the most

Websites of the Month

Last month was all about butterflies and moths, of which there have been loads. I hope you had a good time recording them. That exercise got me thinking about other creepy crawlies in general and going back to the July 2018 edition of Trio I wrote about stick insects and how they have come over to the UK and settled here. Well they are back in the news with rather sensational headlines (https://is.gd/stick insects news). The story is that these stick insects who don't need to mate to produce offspring (it is called parthenogenesis (https://is.gd/P genesis) have given up mating in the UK and gone over completely to this approach. This has produced headlines with lots of chuckles of course, and the University in New Zealand that has been doing the research has a better account https://is.gd/Stick insects . In any event I decided to consult our local expert, Malcolm Lee, who is the national reporter on these species and who knows loads about all this. He says the jury is still out but that it is likely that this species has been like this since it arrived and has not given up sex because it is in the UK (you can read Malcolm's website where he describes the Port Gaverne flora and fauna (https://is.gd/M Lee).

Last year we had stick insects in our front garden, and I have searched again for them this year but haven't seen one. Their camouflage is so good it's likely that they are there in plain sight and I am not seeing them. If you wanted to get more involved in understanding about these amazing creatures that have such good camouflage (check out the leaf insects https://www.youtube.com/watch?v+tZ6QSyGbz5U) you could join the Phasmid study group https://www.facebook.com/PhasmidStudyGroup.

By contrast there are another group of interesting creatures that don't get a very good press, and that is spiders. Cornwall has a good selection! If you look at the website for recording spiders https://erccis.org.uk/WIS/RecordingGuides/Spiders it tells us that the United Kingdom has 647 species and of those, 60% (390) have been recorded in Cornwall . Apparently in a couple of acres of ungrazed meadow in this neck of the woods you could expect to find 4 million spiders. That is a seriously large number. To find out more about all these spiders the best place to start is with the website of the British Arachnological Society https://is.gd/UK spiders . You will be pleased to know that this site does not only

give you lots of pictures and information about spiders but also Harvestmen (daddy longlegs), pseudoscorpions and scorpions. There are pseudoscorpions in the UK (24 species) and apparently there are also some isolated populations of non-indigenous scorpions in the UK too (https://is.gd/UK scorpion pics).

One reason for writing about spiders is that I found and recorded a nice example of the Noble False Widow spider in an old cardboard

box (see picture) locally. This spider can give you a bite a bit like a wasp sting, but bites are very rare. You can find out all about them by downloading the information sheet from here https://is.gd/noble false widow: This says:

"Although the Noble False Widow does have a more toxic bite than any native British spider, there are very few confirmed cases of them biting and none of serious injury as a direct result. Reliable evidence is hard to come by. In the absence of a bee or wasp, it's easy to jump to the conclusion that a spider is the culprit, but the perpetrator is rarely caught in the act for accurate identification."

I hope you have a good time with your wildlife adventures, with the web to help.



Chef Lanyon's Helston Pudding

I found this traditional Cornish recipe in my old man's recipe book from many moons ago. Nice memories ...

The Helston pudding dates from pre war when things were a tad tight to say the least.

Before you start, butter a pudding basin and prep a larger saucepan with folded sheets of parchment paper to help protect the base of the pudding.

Ingredients

2oz each of raisins, currents, suet (veg), muscavado sugar, breadcrumbs (stale is best), ground rice and finally plain flour ½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda ½ teaspoon of mixed spice Pinch of salt Milk to mix ('bout 5 fluid ounces)

Method

So very easy, just mix it all together. I reckon about 5 ounces of milk, semi skimmed is fine if full fat milk is not available. Tip the mix into your prepped basin and cover with parchment paper and foil and place into larger saucepan. Pour in boiling water up to half way up the basin and set to steam for 2 hours. Once steamed remove from saucepan and leave to cool slightly before removing lid and turning out onto a plate. Only one way to serve this delicious steamed pudding with a "GERT BIG DOLLOP OF THE CORNISH ELIXIR OF LIFE ... CLOTTED

Mrs L sticks with the other Cornish elixir of life ... Crab

As many of you know I worked for many years picking the beautiful crab that is landed in Port Isaac. I was racking my brain for a lovely, light, fresh recipe and of course nothing beats a fresh Port Isaac crab salad. Just purchase a fresh dressed crab in the shell and plonk it on the salad of your choice ... but that's not much of a recipe.

I got to thinking about a customer who visited regularly and brought 12 dressed crabs at a time. She told me she would have her friends around for dressed crab. I said she had a lot of lucky friends. She laughed and said she would use six wher they were fresh and then double wrap the other six in clingfilm and pop in the freezer.

I asked if this didn't ruin the crab and she said no and that when she fancied a little luxury she would get a dressed crab out of the freezer, allow it to defrost still in the shell and at teatime put a little double cream into the crab meat give it a gentle stir, then cover the open top with some grated cheddar and breadcrumbs mixed together, and place in a preheated medium oven until the top is browned.



My lovely customer used to tell me it wasn't quite as good as fresh Port Isaac crab but if you live elsewhere and can't easily get it fresh, it's the next best thing.




