Holy Habits

Our churches are exploring something called Holy Habits" at the moment. We are trying to grow in how we live out our faith by spending time with each of 10 Holy Habits over a two year period. The idea is that we will get familiar with each habit, and explore and practice it until it becomes second nature. And as we grow in living out these habits, which are all based on things that the earliest



Christians did, we hope that we will find ourselves better able to share the good news of God's love and justice in all that we do in our lives.

So what are the habits, and which habits are we exploring now?

Well we decided to begin by exploring the Holy Habit of "Eating Together". So in September and October there have been all sorts of ways that we have tried Eating Together with other people as a spiritual practice. We have eaten with our families and friends, with other church members and with people we don't know so well. We have thought about the fairness of how we share food in our world today and - my favourite - we have enjoyed eating together with children from St Kew, Port Isaac and St Minver schools who have come to our churches for the "Experiencing Harvest" programme.

I hope that as we continue with the other Holy Habits. Eating Together will be something that we continue to do, and that in our eating together we will find a place at the table for the God who has provided us with such an amazing world, and who loves us so much that he has come to meet us in Jesus.

The next Holy Habits we will be exploring - in November and December - are "Gladness and Generosity". So as we continue to eat together. I hope that we will also find we can grow in joy and in giving whatever we can for the good of others.



Planning Applications

Members considered these planning applications and made the following responses to Cornwall Council:

- PA19/06645, 36 New Road, Port Isaac demolition of existing dwelling and replacement with new dwelling. Members objected on the same grounds as before, i.e. Members felt the building was too large and there was too much glazing.
- 2. PA19/07596, 1 Brooklands View, Port Isaac change of use from private parking and storage to public car parking. Members supported the application but requested a condition as per Highways request, that the footpath is provided as per the specification.
- 3. PA19/07664, Glendale, Trewetha, Port Isaac remodelling and first floor extension to include construction of double garage. A site visit had been made. Cllr. Williams said the driveway is steep and narrow and the proposed chosen site for the double garage would have a severe impact on the light to the neighbour's bedroom. The large site has capacity for a garage with minimal neighbour impact. Members had concerns about the volume of glass in the proposed dwelling, some of which overlooks the neighbours' garden and would have an unreasonable impact on their ability to enjoy their property by reason of overlooking and mass and scale. Members are not fooled by this claim to be a householder application and do not believe this is a "remodelling" application but is a new build. In any future scheme members would wish to see mature trees on site preserved, for the amenity of neighbours and i.r.o. biodiversity of this rural site. Members objected on these lines.
- PA19/07786, 1 Brooklands View, Port Isaac conversion of an existing bay within the garage to a separate unit for industrial/commercial use. Members supported the application.
- 5. PA19/07858, 3 Cliffside, Port Isaac alterations to dwelling to include conversion of garage and outbuilding/workshop to living accommodation. Members supported the application but conditioned to be used only in association with the main property and not a separate dwelling. An easement for delivery of oil to the neighbouring property should be noted and upheld.
- 6. PA19/08325, 9 Silvershell View, Port Isaac erection of single storey entrance porch linking the bungalow and converted garage, Internal re-modelling works including the removal of some internal walls, window and door replacements, re-build sun terrace with privacy screen, new pitched roof on existing kitchen and existing link to garage converted into an ensuite and re-roofed. Members supported the application provided there are conditions for non-reflective glass to be used with no exterior lighting. Any proposed igning scheme must be agreed with officer for a low level only.
- PA19/08497, Archer Farm, Trewetha Non-material
 amendment in respect of decision notice PA17/08693
 (Proposed 3-bedroom dwelling) Change western
 glazed doors to window, enclose porch with side doors
 remove window. Members supported the acciliation.
- PA19/02445. Maritime and Coastguard Agency Road, Port Isaac proposed single aweing to replace existing decommissioned Coastguard Eullaings. Members supported the application.

- 9. PA19/08514, 26 Dolphin Street, Port Isaac reinstatement of brick chimney. Members supported the application.
- PA19/08515, 26 Dolphin Street, Port Isaac Listed Building Consent for reinstatement of brick chimney. Members supported the application.

Planning Applications Approved by Cornwall Council

- PA19/03484, 30 Trewetha Lane, Port Isaac replacement of two existing oil tanks with one larger oil tank.
- PA19/04437, Homer Park Farmhouse, Port Isaac renewal of planning consent PA16/08897 Demolition of dwelling and construction of replacement dwelling with new boiler house, swim pool house and associated works.

When Bishop Bill Inde retired in 2008, he decreed that St Endellion, with its renowned music festivals, should become a centre for the Arts and Spirituality in North Cornwall, largely because the area was lacking in cultural opportunities and venues. Our new Rector at the time, the Reverend John May, a poet and an artist, was appointed with this mission in mind.

Endelienta as an organisation was established and now arranges a diverse programme of concerts, Quiet Days and Exhibitions throughout the year at St Endellion Church around the established Easter and Summer Music Festivals.

In addition we have the North Cornwall Book Festival that has just celebrated it's seventh successful year with best selling authors and poets as well as very well attended days for schools.

The Stone Barn at Endellion provides accommodation for groups from all over the country who want to spend time in this lovely area, using it as a place to work or a centre from which to carry out activities in the locality. A Poetry Group and a Festival Book Group meet monthly here as does a regular Make Club for children and their parents.

Furthermore, for four years now, an Artist, a Composer and a Writer have each been offered an opportunity to stay on site and incorporate the 'spirit of place' into their work. They give an account of their experiences at the end of their week. The resulting work and the revelations of 'looking at things in a different way' and with artistic eyes is amazing.

Now with the new hall at St Endellion opportunities will be enhanced and extended. It has been reported that in the past year alone over 5000 people have attended events at Endellion. If you have never been to an Endelienta event , look out for the posters, get the leaflet and give it a try. There is something for everyone here on our doorstep!

Scott Mann's update from Parliament

We have had some great news on health recently, which I am pleased to share with you. I recently had the pleasure of visiting the brand new Sowenna unit and was shown around by Phil Confue, Chief Executive of Cornwall Partnership NHS Foundation Trust. Sowenna is the first inpatient adolescent mental health facility in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly for young people aged 13 to 18.

It's great to see central government funding and local fundraising come together to provide this vital facility. NHS England have described this facility as the best young person's mental health facility in the country, and its right on our doorstep in Bodmin. Children in Cornwall will no longer have to access services out of County.

I also welcomed the announcement by Health Secretary Matt Hancock that Cornwall will get up to £450 million for a new hospital. The plans are part of a new strategic Health Investment Programme of £13billion to upgrade hospitals across the country. This will include funds for the NHS in Cornwall to begin work, with local decision-makers, to consider options and work up the business case, which could include a brand-new acute hospital on a new site. I very much hope that Bodmin can be at the forefront of the consultation and I will be more than happy to work with our Cornwall and Town Council members, as well as local stakeholders and the NHS to see if Bodmin can be a potential site.

The case for a new Cornish hospital was presented to the Health Secretary at a meeting with all six of Cornwall's MPs earlier this year. That the government has accepted this and is committed to funding a new hospital so soon is great news for all in the Duchy. This is a huge announcement for Cornwall, and I welcome this commitment from our Conservative government. A second major hospital in Cornwall is something that successive governments have been unable to deliver. I would like to see the local NHS decision-makers spending the money on a new second general hospital in the centre of Cornwall along the A30 corridor. This programme is in addition to the previously announced investment of £135 million for new facilities and services provided by the RCHT at Treliske.

Constituents regularly lobby me about the distances they must travel to access acute NHS services, they will quite rightly now be receiving the world-class health services they demand closer to home.

I was prompted to write this column by a question from a young friend who saw the little lines on the back of a fern frond (see picture) and asked what they were. As I did ferns and similar plants (or Pteridophytes as I got to know them) at school, I knew the answer. In explaining about them to my friend and then asking other people, I began to realise that this is not well known, and so a trip round the web was my next step.

As people say, there is an app for that...well there is a website for "fern enthusiasts" called the British Pteridological Society (https://ebps.org.uk). It has multiple pages of interesting material, and under the education tab you can find the fern life cycle. So the answer to the young person's question is that the lines on the back of the fern in the picture (it's called a Hart's Tongue fern Asplenium scolopendrium) are spores and the spores are spread by the wind. They don't grow into another fern like in the first picture, but into things called thalloids (see the second picture). In fact, you can see a tiny fern growing out of one of these in the top left-hand side of the picture. This way that plants, and some animals reproduce is called alternation of generations. On the website, there is a good diagram with the explanation of why there are two different types of plant that make up the fern during its life cycle. Ferns are not the only type of plant in this group, the others being club mosses and there is a nice report about them on the same website https://ebps.org.uk/ lycopodiella-inundata/. There is also information about the Devon & Cornwall fern enthusiast group and a link to download a very informative illustrated article on Cornish species www.cornishhedges.co.uk/PDF/mosses.pdf . The Cornish hedges website also has a really good education pack about Cornish hedges as well (hence the name!)

The other type of pteridophyte is the horsetail and there is a good blog about them https://bsbipublicity.blogsport.com/2014/02/how-to-separate-your-horsetails.html

Although ferns show this alternation of generation in perhaps the clearest way among plants, you also find it in animals. Jellyfish are probably the best ones to illustrate this where there is one generation that is like a sea anemone and one that is like the jellyfish you see swimming along. They are the same animal, but have this two types of bodies and you can read about it here www.padstowsealifesafaris.co.uk/sea-life/jellyfish-in-cornwall/

In conclusion if you want to find out where a particular fern, clubmoss or horsetail can be found (or indeed any other species in Cornwall, go to

LAST MONTH HE WAS SCARY ... THIS MONTH CHEF LANYON GETS ALL CUDDLY

Well, now the nights are drawing in and the need for cuddles on the sofa is upon us, the request for a heart-warming soup came flooding in (well, ONE person asked!). So here is one ...

CARROT, CORIANDER & COCONUT SOUP

this soup is suitable for pretty much everyone with it being vegan, vegetarian, gluten intolerant, lactose intolerant and pretty much every other intolerant you can name.

INGREDIENTS:

8oz fresh coriander

1kg carrots
1 large white onion

2 tins coconut milk (400g)

4 cloves garlic

1 sweet potato

2 pints vegetable stock

salt & pepper Rapeseed oil

- Peel and chop the onion and garlic
- Peel and chop the sweet potato
- Chop the carrots (no need to peel)
- Put a little oil in a pan and add the onions and garlic, sweet potato and carrots and cook over a medium heat to soften
- Add vegetable stock and coriander and bring to the boil
- Add the coconut and simmer for 30 minutes
- When cooked put into a food processor and blitz until smooth
- Season with salt and pepper and enjoy with a hefty wedge of granary bread and Cornish butter

Mrs L's Fill 'em up Meatloaf

1x 850g pack lean mince beef

1x 500g pack lean mince pork

2 onions finely chopped

2tsp dried parsley (or fresh if yours hasn't died from lack of watering)

2 beef oxo cubes crushed up (or your preferred brand)

2tbsp brown sauce

Breadcrumbs from 2 slices of bread (crust, white, brown doesn't matter) - finely chop in a mixer or liquidiser

2 beaten eggs

Salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 200°c

Put all the above into a large bowl and, with well washed hands, mix well. When it's all evenly combined push down into a 2lb loaf tin (put a piece of baking paper across the middle of the tin to make it easy to pull out when cooked, you don't really need to line the ends). All of the ingredients should fit in one tin. If it's tight heap it a bit in the middle like a cooked loaf of bread.

Place in your pre heated oven on another larger baking tray which will catch any juices which may spill over. Cook for 45 minutes.

Serve the meatloaf sliced with mashed potatoes, green beans and/or cauliflower cheese and if you like it moister plenty of beef gravy.

This will go a long way round the family and of course, as always, any left overs from a small family can be frozen or reheated for lunch the next day.

If the kids moan about something "new" just tell them it's a beef burger without the bun!! And of course if you can get their hands clean enough they love to do the mixing part, nothing like helping cook the meal to them interested in their food.



You will need a 10" spring-form cake tin, greased and double-lined and with a least two layers of thick brown paper tied round the outside of the tin.

INGREDIENTS:

12oz softened butter
8oz caster sugar
4 large eggs, beaten
12oz plain flour
½tsp ground nutmeg or cinnamon
¼tsp ground cloves
grated zest of 2 large oranges and 1 large
lemon

1lb currants
8oz sultanas
6oz glace cherries, quartered
6oz mixed peel, finely chopped
4oz ground almonds
8tbsp brandy

- Preheat oven to 130°c
- Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy
- Whisk in the eggs, one at a time along with a little flour
- Add the zests, then the fruit, flour, ground almonds, orange flower water and brandy. If the mixture is too stiff add a little more brandy (or orange water)
- Tip mix into prepared tin and flatten off, making a small indent in the centre
- Bake for 1 hour and then turn the oven down to 120°c and bake for another 1½ hours, maybe a tad more
- Cool in the tin for at least an hour and then turn out onto a cooling rack
- When cold turn upside down and pierce with a skewer about 20 times and pour a brandy and orange water mix over her and let her soak it up repeat this once a week for the next couple of weeks




