## Samuel John (Jack) Garfield Williams

Leading Seaman LT/X 7506C, HM Trawler Fort Royal, Royal Naval Reserve (Patrol Service) Died February 9th 1940, aged 32 Commemorated Lowestoft War Memorial Son of James and Frances Williams; husband of Olive Jane Williams, of Mitchell, Cornwall

Jack Williams was born in Port Isaac in 1908, and in 1911 was living with his mother Frances Nena (24) and his two sisters Annie (5) and Susie (1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>). The census records that father James, a mariner, was away. The family lived in Temple Bar. In 1936 he married Olive Jane Sparks.

Jack was in the Royal Naval Reserve (Patrol Service) and was on the HM Trawler Fort Royal out of Aberdeen. The Fort Royal was hired for minesweeping duties in August 1939. On February 9th 1940 the Fort Royal was in company with HM Trawler Robert Bowen on mine-sweeping duties when they were attacked by Heinkel Bombers off Aberdeen. The Robert Owen broke in half and sank with all hands, and the Fort Royal sank in minutes. These are the men lost that day off Aberdeen –
