

# A Seaplane lands in Port Isaac harbour after engine trouble



The aircraft that landed in the harbour was always referred to as a Walrus Seaplane, but it was actually the longer range version of the Walrus known as the Sea Otter ([http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Supermarine\\_Sea\\_Otter](http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Supermarine_Sea_Otter)). Sea Otters first entered service in November 1943 with 277 Squadron ([http://www.historyofwar.org/articles/weapons\\_supermarine\\_sea\\_otter.html](http://www.historyofwar.org/articles/weapons_supermarine_sea_otter.html)), which had a detachment at Portreath from November 1944 to February 1945 carrying out Air Sea Rescue. That is probably where this aircraft came from.
