


"... all the way to Cornwall. We would load the car the previous evening, before a predawn rise, tea and toast, and the slog westwards to Cornwall."



"... Honiton and Exeter were infamous throughout the south of Britain as major bottlenecks on the route to the west."




1972 - "... the farmhouse we are staying in is very old, parts are of an old monastery dating back to 800."
