William HONEY TABB

Able Seaman SS Holmtown Died February 6th 1918, aged 19 Commemorated at Tower Hill Memorial, London

William was born in 1899 to William Honey and Rhoda Jane Tabb. In the 1901 census taken on the night of March 31st, William senior was listed as a 28 year old mariner, and Rhoda was 33 years old. They also had a seven month old daughter, Jessie.

William joined the Mercantile Marine, and in 1918 he was serving on the SS Holmtown, a 598 ton British Steamer built in 1907 by R Thompson & Sons, Sunderland and owned by Town Line (London) Ltd. SS Holmtown was reported missing on February 6th 1918 after sailing from Rouen on February 1st 1918 to Penarth Dock in Cardiff. The disappearance was not solved until 2006 when it was confirmed she was the steamer sunk by the German submarine UB-59, east from the Shambles light vessel (2½ miles SE by E from Portland Bill lighthouse) on February 3rd 1918.
