

Church Hill

Described by John Betjeman as the only way to enter Port Isaac, Church Hill was 'unsuitable to motors' until the 1960s.

One of the earliest roads in the village, early travellers described this old, narrow lane to St Endellion Church as 'steep and muddy'.

Steps to the sides of the houses lead up to areas that were once communal drying grounds where washing was hung out on appointed days. Today these areas are gardens.
