

This imposing trio of houses were built by a wealthy tea planter who named them **Khandallah**; the name comes from a town in North India and means 'Resting place of God'. Today only the first house is called by that name, the middle one being named Moonfleet and the far one Hathaway.

In the 1930s: "Mr & Mrs Wiffin, very upmarket couple, lived in the first house, Khandallah. Mr Wiffin always wore plus fours. Mrs Wiffin always wanted to know what was going on in the village. They had one daughter, Joan.

Frank & Jill Gadman ran the centre house as the Rogue's Retreat Guest House and prior to them it was owned by Ray & Sylvia McCrohan,

In the 1930s: "Mr & Mrs Brown lived here. They had no children. He was a little man and looked after the beach car park." *Yvonne Cleave*

Marion & Nigel Andrews now run Hathaway as a Guest House. Before them it was owned by Neville & Enid Andrews.
