

VILLAGE'S NEW INSHORE LIFEBOAT OFFICIALLY NAMED

PORT Isaac's new inshore lifeboat was named at a ceremony at the lifeboat station on Saturday.

A large crowd of villagers, guests and holidaymakers watched the ceremony, which was carried out by Capt. Debbie Jones, of the Army's Royal Logistics Corps. She named the vessel *Spirit of the PCS RE*, after the Postal and Courier Service, Royal Engineers.

The 4.9-metre D class boat is one of five such craft provided by the fund-raising efforts of the Army's Royal Logistics Corps(RLC).
